SECTION II: INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS (ITBs)

A. INTRODUCTION

1. Scope of Bid	1.1	The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS) invites Bids for the provision of Goods as specified in the BDS and Section V - Technical Specifications & Schedule of Requirements . The successful Bidders will be expected to deliver the goods within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the BDS .
2. Source of Funds	2.1	Source of funds is referred in Clause-2 of Invitation for Bids.
3. Eligible Bidders	3.1	A Bidder may be natural person, company or firm or public or semi-public agency of Pakistan or any foreign country, or any combination of them with a formal existing agreement (on Judicial Papers) in the form of a joint venture, consortium, or association. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a Lead Member as nominated in the BDS, who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the joint venture, consortium, or association during the Bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of contract. <i>(The limit on the number of members of JV or Consortium or Association may be prescribed in BDS, in accordance with the guidelines issued by the PPRA).</i>
	3.2	The appointment of Lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of a valid Power of Attorney to the Procuring Agency.
	3.3	Verifiable copy of the agreement that forms a joint venture, consortium or association shall be required to be submitted as part of the Bid.
	3.4	Any bid submitted by the joint venture, consortium or association shall indicate the part of proposed contract to be performed by each party and each party shall be evaluated (or post qualified if required) with respect to its contribution only, and the responsibilities of each party shall not be substantially altered without prior written approval of the Procuring Agency and in line with any instructions issued by the Authority.
	3.5	The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective supplier, manufacturers or authorized agents/dealers subject to any provisions of incorporation or licensing by the respective national incorporating agency or statutory body established for that particular trade or business.

	3.6 .	Foreign Bidders must be locally registered with the appropriate national incorporating body or the statutory body, before participating in the national/international competitive tendering with the exception of such procurements made by the foreign missions of Pakistan. For such purpose the bidder must have to initiate the registration process before the bid submission and the necessary evidence shall be submitted to the procuring agency along with their bid, however, the final award will be subject to the complete registration process.
	3.7	<p>A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this Bidding process, if they:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) are associated or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this Invitation for Bids. b) have controlling shareholders in common; or c) receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or d) have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or e) have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Bid of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Procuring Agency regarding this Bidding process; or f) Submit more than one Bid in this Bidding process.
	3.8	<p>A Bidder may be ineligible if –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) he is declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm, insolvent; (b) payments in favor of the Bidder is suspended in accordance with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment declaring bankruptcy and resulting (in accordance with the national laws) in the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of its property; (c) legal proceedings are instituted against such Bidder involving an order suspending payments and which may result, in accordance with the national laws, in a declaration of bankruptcy or in any other situation

		<p>entailing the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of the property;</p> <p>(d) the Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any offence involving professional conduct;</p> <p>(e) the Bidder is blacklisted and hence debarred due to involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices, or performance failure or due to breach of bid securing declaration.</p> <p>(f) The firm, supplier and contractor is blacklisted or debarred by a foreign country, international organization, or other foreign institutions for the period defined by them.</p>
	3.9	Bidders shall provide to the Procuring Agency evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.
	3.10	Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility to the satisfaction of the Procuring Agency, as the Procuring Agency shall reasonably request.
	3.11	Bidders shall submit proposals relating to the nature, conditions and modalities of sub-contracting wherever the sub-contracting of any elements of the contract amounting to the more than ten (10) percent of the Bid price is envisaged.
4. Eligible Goods and Related Services	4.1	All goods and related services to be supplied under the contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, and all expenditures made under the contract will be limited to such goods and services. For purpose of this Bid, ineligible countries are stated in the section-4 titled as “Eligible Countries”.
	4.2	For purposes of this Clause, “origin” means the place where the goods are mined, grown, cultivated, produced, manufactured, or processed, or through manufacture, procession, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differs substantially in its basic characteristics from its imported components or the place from where the related services are/to be supplied.
	4.3	The nationality of the supplier that supplies, assembles, distributes, or sells the goods and services shall not determine the origin of the goods.
	4.4	To establish the eligibility of the Goods and the related services, Bidders shall fill the country of origin declarations included in the Form of Bid.
	4.5	If so required in the BDS , the Bidder shall demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer of the goods to deliver in Pakistan (or in respective country in case of procurement by the Pakistani Missions abroad), the goods indicated in its Bid.

5. One Bid per Bidder	5.1	A bidder shall submit only one Bid through E-PADS, in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder or as a member in a joint venture or any similar arrangement.
	5.2	No bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bid individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process.
	5.3	A person or a firm cannot be a sub-contractor with more than one bidder in the same bidding process.
6. Cost of Bidding	6.1	The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the Procuring Agency shall in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

	<p>7.2</p>	<p>The signed & stamped form of complete bid is to be uploaded on E-PADS before the date & time of submission of bids.</p>
	<p>7.3</p>	<p>The Invitation for Bids (Section-I) issued by the Procuring Agency is not part of the Bidding Documents. In case of discrepancies between the Invitation for Bid and the Bidding Documents listed in ITB 7.1 above, said Bidding Documents will take precedence.</p>
	<p>7.4</p>	<p>The Procuring Agency is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addenda, if they were not obtained directly from the Procuring Agency or the signed pdf version from downloaded from the website of the Procuring Agency or through E-PADS. However, Procuring Agency shall place both the pdf and same editable version to facilitate the bidder for filling the forms.</p>

Clarification of Bidding Documents</p>	<p>8.1</p>	<p>A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents may notify the Procuring Agency in writing or in electronic form that provides record of the content of communication at the Procuring Agency's address indicated in the BDS.</p>
	<p>8.2</p>	<p>The Procuring Agency will within three (3) working days after receiving the request for clarification, respond in writing or in electronic form to any request for clarification provided that such request is received not later than three (03) days prior to</p>

		the deadline for the submission of Bids as prescribed in ITB 23.1 . However, this clause shall not apply in case of alternate methods of Procurement.
	8.3	Copies of the Procuring Agency's response will be forwarded to all identified Prospective Bidders through an identified source of communication, including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source. In case of downloading of the Bidding Documents from the website of PA, the response of all such queries will also be available on the same link available at the website.
	8.4	Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITB 9 .
	8.5	If indicated in the BDS , the Bidder's designated representative is invited at the Bidder's cost to attend a pre-Bid meeting at the place, date and time mentioned in the BDS . During this pre-Bid meeting, prospective Bidders may request clarification of the schedule of requirement, the Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the Bidding Documents.
	8.6	Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Bidders who have obtained the Bidding Documents. Any modification to the Bidding Documents that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITB 9. Non-attendance at the pre-Bid meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a Bidder.
9. Amendment of Bidding Documents	9.1	Before the deadline for submission of Bids, the Procuring Agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or pre-Bid meeting may modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addenda.
	9.2	Any addendum issued including the notice of any extension of the deadline shall be part of the Bidding Documents pursuant to ITB 7.1 and shall be communicated in writing or in any identified electronic form that provide record of the content of communication to all the bidders who have obtained the Bidding Documents from the Procuring Agency. The Procuring Agency shall promptly publish the Addendum at the Procuring Agency's web page identified in the BDS:

C. PREPARATION OF BIDS

Language of Bid	10.1	The Bid prepared by the Bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and the Procuring Agency shall be written in the English language unless specified in the BDS . Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the Bidder may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant pages in the English language unless specified in the BDS , in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bidder, the translation shall govern.
11. Documents and Sample(s) Constituting the Bid	11.1	The Bid prepared by the Bidder shall constitute the following components: - a) Form of Bid and Bid Prices completed in accordance with ITB 14 and 15; b) Details of the Sample(s) where applicable and requested in the BDS. c) Documentary evidence established in accordance with ITB 13 that the Bidder is eligible and/or qualified for the subject bidding process; d) Documentary evidence established in accordance with ITB 13.3(a) that the Bidder has been authorized by the manufacturer to deliver the goods into Pakistan, where required and where the supplier is not the manufacturer of those goods; e) Documentary evidence established in accordance with ITB 12 that the goods and related services to be supplied by the Bidder are eligible goods and services, and conform to the Bidding Documents; f) Bid security or Bid Securing Declaration furnished in accordance with ITB 18;

		<p>g) Duly Notarized Power of Attorney authorizing the signatory of the Bidder to submit the bid; and</p> <p>h) Any other document required in the BDS.</p>
	11.2	<p>Where a sample(s) is required by a procuring agency, the sample shall be:</p> <p>(a) submitted as part of the bid, in the quantities, dimensions and other details requested in the BDS;</p> <p>(b) carriage paid;</p> <p>(c) received on, or before, the closing time and date for the submission of bids; and</p> <p>(d) evaluated to determine compliance with all characteristics listed in the BDS.</p>
	11.3	<p>The Procuring Agency shall retain the sample(s) of the successful Bidder. A Procuring Agency shall reject the Bid if the sample(s)-</p> <p>(a) do(es) not conform to all characteristics prescribed in the bidding documents; and</p> <p>(b) is/are not submitted within the specified time clearly mentioned in the Bid Data Sheet.</p>
	11.4	<p>Where it is not possible to avoid using a propriety article as a sample, a Bidder shall make it clear that the propriety article is displayed only as an example of the type or quality of the goods being Bided for, and that competition shall not thereby be limited to the extent of that article only.</p>
	11.5	<p>Samples made up from materials supplied by a Procuring Agency shall not be returned to a Bidder nor shall a Procuring Agency be liable for the cost of making them.</p>
	11.6	<p>All samples produced from materials belonging to an unsuccessful Bidder shall be kept by the Procuring Agency till thirty (30) days from the date of award of contract or exhaust of all the grievance forums (including those pending at Authority's Level or in some Court of Law).</p>
12. SP-02 DRAWINGS

SP-02.1 Drawings in Contract

SP-02.1.1 Specification Drawings

The specification drawings contained in the Contract Documents show the Specifications and Scope of material to be supplied by the Supplier.

SP-02.1.2 Supplier's Bid Drawings

The bid drawings are the drawings prepared by the Supplier for bidding purposes, and shall be part of his Bid.

The specification drawings and Supplier's bid drawings shall not be used for manufacturing of Goods unless specific instructions for such use are given by the Engineer.

SP-02.1.3 Approved Drawings

The manufacturing shall be carried out in accordance with the approved drawings/data.

SP-02.2 Drawings and Other Data to be furnished by the Supplier

All drawings shall be in English language and all dimensions shall be in Metric System. Symbols shall be in accordance with IEC standards. All drawings shall be clearly marked "National Grid Company of Pakistan (NGC)-(specify item name) _____". All drawings/data submitted for approval shall conform to ISO paper sizes A3 or A4.

The Supplier shall submit detailed drawings/data for approval by the Engineer, in accordance with provisions of Contract, and the additional requirements specified in the respective Clauses hereof. The drawings/data shall be complete in all

respects, shall have been reviewed and checked by the Supplier and shall be submitted in due time and in logical order to facilitate proper coordination.

SP-02.2.1 Goods Drawings and Specific Goods Data

The Supplier shall submit the following drawings and Specific Goods Data within fifteen (15) days after issuance of Letter of Acceptance for approval of the Engineer, together with overall and handling weights and dimensions of the Goods to be provided under the Contract.

- (i) Detailed drawings and Specific Goods Data sheets for the Equipment in the respective Lots.
- (ii) Packing details & drawings.
- (iii) Test program indicating arrangement & details of all tests to be carried out and their tentative schedule.
- (iv) Any other information and drawing which may be required by the Engineer.

The time for approval of the Supplier's above mentioned submissions shall be fourteen (14) working days after its receipt thereof.

SP-02.2.2 Data other than Drawings

All applicable requirements of this Clause and mentioned elsewhere in this document with reference to drawings to be prepared by the Supplier shall apply equally to catalogues, cuts, illustrations, printed specifications, or other data submitted for approval.

SP-02.3 Submission and Approvals

SP-02.3.1 Drawings for Approval

Drawings for approval, shall be distributed through international couriers to addresses and in number as specified in Sub-Clause SP-02.3.6 hereof.

All drawings submitted for approval shall be provided with a blank white space, approximately 90 mm in height by 120 mm in width, near the lower right-hand corner to be used for notations by the Engineer.

SP-02.3.2 Approval of Drawings/Data

- (1) All changes will be made and will be marked "APPROVED", "APPROVED EXCEPT AS NOTED" or "RETURNED FOR CORRECTION" on the relevant drawings/data. One print will be returned to the Supplier. The other shall be retained by the Engineer for his own use and for the use of Procuring Agency and shall serve as the Master Copy and shall prevail in case of any doubt or discrepancy subsequently arising.
- (2) If the drawing/data is returned to the Supplier stamped "APPROVED" he may immediately proceed with the manufacturing of Goods. Any drawing/data marked "APPROVED" by the Engineer shall be known as an "Approved Drawing".
- (3) If the drawing/data is returned to the Supplier stamped "APPROVED EXCEPT AS NOTED" he may proceed with the manufacturing of Goods taking into account the corrections and comments noted on the drawing/data. The Supplier shall revise the drawings/data as required and resubmit them in the same routine as before for record purposes.
- (4) If the drawing/data is returned to the Supplier stamped "RETURNED FOR CORRECTION" he shall not proceed with the manufacturing of Goods but shall make the changes and corrections or prepare new drawings/data and resubmit the revised drawing/data to the Engineer for approval at no change in price or Delivery & Completion Schedule. Resubmitted prints and calculations will be subject to the same routine as stated before. Time required for such revisions and re-submittals of drawings/data or calculations will not entitle the Supplier to any extension in Contractual Completion time.
- (5) If the Supplier does not agree with exceptions taken by the Engineer, the Supplier shall state in his letter of re-submittal his reasons for not complying with the Engineer's exceptions. Revision number and date and description of change shall be shown on all drawings or calculations revised.

SP-02.3.3 Manufacturing Prior to Approval

Any manufacturing/fabrication of Goods done prior to the approval of drawings & data shall be at the Supplier's risk. The Engineer shall have the right to reject the said Goods if not conforming to required specifications and drawings or to request additional details and to require the Supplier to make any change(s) which are necessary to conform to the provisions and intent of these Specifications and

such changes shall be made without additional cost to Procuring Agency. The approval of the drawings & data by the Engineer shall not be construed as a complete check but will indicate only that the detailing is satisfactory. Approval by the Engineer of the Supplier's drawings & data shall not be held to relieve the Supplier of the obligations to meet all the requirements of these Specifications or of the responsibility for the correctness of the Supplier's drawings & data or for correct fit and use of assembled Goods furnished by the Supplier.

SP-02.3.4 Sequence of Submission

The sequence of submission of all drawings shall be such that all information is available for checking each drawing when it is received.

SP-02.3.5 Approved Drawings/Data and Revisions

All approved drawings/data shall form part of the Contract. If revisions are required after a drawing/data has been approved, the Supplier shall furnish for approval additional copies specified for the initial submission, prior to such revision(s).

SP-02.3.6 Distribution of Drawings and Documents

The drawings and documents shall be submitted to the Engineer/ Procuring Agency within the time given in the Contract or within such reasonable time as the Engineer may require, and in the number as specified hereunder:

SP-03 STANDARDS AND TYPICAL DESIGN

SP-03.1 General

The Specifications cite or imply International Standards and typical design for Goods. Other equivalent standards and typical designs are equally acceptable provided that they in no way detract from the quality, safety, operation ability of the Goods furnished. However, when standards or typical design other than those cited or implied are offered by a bidder, he shall set forth in his Contract the alternative standards proposed so that a direct comparison can be made before Contract Award. Each specific difference from the Specifications shall be clearly indicated by the bidder. If no alternatives are set forth by the bidder, it will be assumed that offered Goods will be in accordance with the International Standards and typical design as cited or implied in the Specifications.

Where the documents provide requirements for manufacturing by specifying a standard such as, for example, one of the international standard organizations which have its origin in one country, it is not the intention to restrict the requirements solely to that standard and that country. Other standards, including standards of other countries will be accepted provided the requirements thereof in the sole opinion of the Engineer are at least equal to the requirements of the standards specified. The bidder may propose an equivalent standard other than that specified, in which case he shall submit the proposed standard and all other information required by the Engineer and shall submit written demonstration that his proposed standard is equivalent or superior to the one specified herein. The submission must be made in English language. Moreover, the bidder shall also supply copy of the latest revision of the standards used in his bid.

SP-03.2 Applicable Standards and Codes

- (1) All Goods and design shall be generally in accordance with latest revision of the standards specified in the Technical Provisions except where specifically directed otherwise. If these Specifications conflict with any or all the standards stated in the Technical Provisions, these Specifications shall have precedence and shall govern.
- (2) In case deviation from the above standards is minor, approval of the Engineer may be given to use other national standards prevalent in the country of manufacture. No departure from the standards specified will be considered after the Contract has been awarded unless specific authorization is requested in writing from the Engineer.

SP-04 PORT OF ENTRY AND DISEMBARKATION

The Supplier would have the option to use either Karachi Port or Port Muhammad Bin Qasim or both or any other seaport in Pakistan as the port(s) of entry and disembarkation, at his own risk and costs. For the purpose of clarification, the term "Wharf at the Port of Karachi" wherever used throughout this document shall mean:

- (a) Wharf at the Port of Karachi, and/or
- (b) Wharf at the Port of Muhammad Bin Qasim

SP-05 PACKING AND MARKING

SP-05.1 Packing

- (1) Supplier shall prepare and pack all Goods for shipment/delivery in accordance with the requirements of the Contract Documents and in the best possible manner to withstand damage or loss from repeated handling and extremes of climate during transportation and storage at Site. All Goods shall be packed so as to guarantee safe transportation of the Goods to the Site under any conditions and limitations which may be encountered. The manner of packing shall be such that it protects the Goods against breakages, damages and losses from the factory until its arrival at its final destination at the Site.
- (2) The final packing shall be such that the weight and dimensions of packages are within reasonable limits in order to facilitate handling, storage and transportation.

- (3) Before any shipment/delivery is made, the Supplier shall get detailed drawings of the packing approved by the Engineer.

SP-05.2 Lifting

The method of lifting, type of equipment and type of slings, used for handling the wooden boxes are subject to approval by the Engineer.

SP-05.3 Slings

If the use of slings is necessary, these shall be of a flexible type and preferably manila rope or other non-metallic materials. The use of steel wire, mesh or chain link slings is prohibited unless they are covered with rubber hose or some similar material.

SP-05.4 Marking

SP-05.4.1 Identification Marking

- (1) All members, parts, units or components of the Goods shall be plainly die-indented with a number to identify the member, part, unit or component itself and with a letter to indicate the type of Goods in accordance with approved drawings.

The identification marking shall be plainly legible and durable and shall be so located that the number or letter is not obscured by other member, part, unit or component when in its assembled position. All the marking on ferrous part or unit shall be made before galvanizing.

- (2) Each crate, case, box, package or bundle shall have labels and or tags made from strong waterproof material and marked in indelible and non-fade-able ink securely attached hereto. These labels or tags shall indicate at least the name of the Project, the Consignee and the manufacturer, the type of Goods or component and the quantity it contains so that it can be easily checked upon delivery. A packing list shall be included in each crate or box.
- (3) Each package delivered under the Contract shall be consecutively numbered and shall also be marked with code number or other identification to be approved by Procuring Agency so that various components of the Goods which are shipped, disassembled and which may not be interchangeable can be identified, collected

and stored at the Site together. Additional information and or colour coding that may reasonably be required by Procuring Agency to facilitate identification, shipment to stores or site handling and storage will also be provided.

- (4) All boxes weighing in excess of 500 kilograms shall be adequately marked for straining and lifting. Whenever necessary the boxes shall be provided with lifting hooks attached by means of vertical rods secured to strong bottom supports.

SP-05.4.2 Container Marking

In addition to labels and marking indicated above all packages, bundles, containers cases or boxes shall be clearly and boldly marked on two opposite sides and on the top and all reels on both sides as follows:

SP-06 TRANSPORTATION OF GOODS

SP-06.1 General

The Supplier outside from the Procuring Agency's country shall transport the Goods from its place of manufacture or origin to the Procuring Agency's port and insurance thereof from its place of manufacturer up to storage site/ware house and shall be solely responsible for selection of routes and carriers, and expediting in

order that all shipments are safely and expeditiously transported and arrived at Karachi Sea Port. The Supplier shall carry out insurance from its warehouse to the Procuring Agency's warehouse / designated site and shall cover all risks including inland transportation from Karachi/ any other port in the Procuring Agency's country to its warehouse / designated site.

SP-06.2 Shipping

The shipment of all the consignments relating to Goods shall be arranged by the Supplier through vessels owned or chartered by the Pakistan National Shipping Corporation (PNSC). In case PNSC is not available to transport the Goods within the time period(s) specified in the Contract, the Supplier after obtaining Non-Availability Certificate (NAC) from PNSC may arrange for such transportation on other ocean carriers except those carrying Israeli Flag. For working out a proper schedule to match the completion of delivery, the Supplier will keep a continuous liaison with the Agent of the respective shipping line within the country of origin.

SP-07 SHOP INSPECTION AND ORDERS FOR GOODS

SP-07.1 Inspection

Unless otherwise authorized by the Engineer no Goods shall be shipped from its point of original manufacture or final shop assembly before it has been inspected and approved by the Engineer.

SP-07.2 Goods Orders

The Supplier shall, if requested, provide the Engineer with unpriced copies of the Supplier's purchase orders for Goods or approved sub-Contracted supply at the time any such orders are placed. The Supplier shall also provide the Engineer with any other relevant information requested to ensure proper expediting and scheduling of the deliveries.

SP-07.3 Acceptance of Materials

The approval by the Engineer of any Goods prior to shipment shall in no way relieve the Supplier of any of his responsibilities for meeting all of the

requirements of the Specifications and shall not prevent subsequent rejection if such Goods are later found to be defective or not conforming to the Specifications.

SP-08 SCHEDULE AND MEETINGS

SP-08.1 Schedule

- (1) The Supplier shall manufacture & supply the Goods in accordance with the dates/periods specified in **Form-4 of Section-VI: Standard Form**. The Supplier shall regularly review the Schedule and notify the Engineer promptly of any revisions which in his view may be required from time to time.
- (2) Each group of Goods shall be completely delivered. The Supplier shall keep the Engineer informed of the progress of the Contract and notify the Engineer approximately six (6) weeks in advance, in writing, as to when the Goods will be ready for inspection and for shipping and shall supply lists covering each consignment in sufficient detail to enable the Engineer to check the contents of the packages.
- (3) In preparing the Delivery and Completion Schedule, the Supplier shall fully take into account the requirements (and possibilities) for ocean (or air) freight. Progress of all shipments shall be continuously monitored and the Supplier shall provide staff or agents to expedite all shipments to ensure compliance with the approved Delivery Schedule.

SP-08.2 Meetings

- (1) Soon after the date of Award of Contract, the Engineer will, with the approval of Procuring Agency require a meeting with Procuring Agency and the Supplier at a place mutually agreed upon, to discuss scheduling of drawings & data, manufacture, testing & inspection, scheduled sequences of delivery and other similar problems which may be pertinent to the completion of the Project.
- (2) From time to time during the execution of the Contract, the Engineer may call meetings as deemed necessary for the purpose of progress monitoring and proper execution of the Contract.
- (3) As required by the Engineer, responsible representatives of the Supplier shall attend such meetings.

- (4) All expenses incurred by the Supplier for attending such meetings shall be borne by the Supplier and shall not be reimbursable.

SP-09 COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE ENGINEER

Pursuant to the definition of Engineer, Sub-Clause 1.1(q) of the Particular Conditions of Contract, the Engineer has established a Project Office at Lahore to which the Supplier shall address all communications for the approval of drawings and other submittals etc., as follows:

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 All designs, equipment, materials and workmanship shall comply with and be tested in accordance with requirements and specifications annexed herewith as mandatory requirements and that attached in Volume-II as DDS-11:2023. Equipment or parts, which are not covered by the specifications, shall comply with rules, codes and regulations of the international electro-technical commission or approved National Standardizing bodies.
- 1.2 In case of contradiction between the technical requirements mentioned herein and relevant specifications appended with the tender, the former shall prevail.
- 1.3 The specific reference in these specifications and documents to any material/equipment by brand name, make or catalogue number shall be constructed as establishing standards of quality and performance and not as limiting competition. However, Bidders may offer other similar material/equipment provided they meet the specified standard, design and performance requirements. The Bidder shall furnish adequate technical information about such alternative material/equipment to enable Procuring Agency to determine its acceptability. Procuring Agency shall be the sole judge on the acceptability or otherwise of such alternative material/ equipment.
- 1.4 The Bidder shall note that standards for workmanship, material and equipment and reference to brand names or catalogue numbers designated by Procuring Agency in its Technical Specifications are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. The Bidder may substitute alternative standards, brands name and/or catalogue numbers in its Bid, provided that it demonstrates to Procuring Agency satisfaction that the substitutions are substantially equivalent or superior to those designed in the Technical Specifications.
- 1.5 The contract shall be executed in strict conformity with the specifications and/or Drawings given or mentioned in this section and the supplier shall do no 'Work' without proper specifications, instructions and/or Drawings.
- 1.6 Specifications and/or drawings are intended to complement each other so that if anything is shown on the drawings as required but not mentioned in the specifications or vice versa. It shall be of like effect as if shown or mentioned in both. If any errors, omissions or discrepancies are found in the figures, specifications and/or drawings or, if any feature shall appear to the supplier to be indefinite or unclear, the same shall be referred to the

Procuring Agency whose written explanation and/or clarification shall be obtained before proceeding with the work.

- 1.7 Approval by the Procuring Agency does not relieve the Manufacturer/Supplier of his responsibility to do the work in accordance with the Contract.
- 1.8 The Manufacturer/ Supplier shall be responsible for any discrepancies, errors omissions in any drawings or other particulars supplied by him whether the Procuring Agency has approved such drawings or particulars or not.
- 1.9 All drawings and documents furnished by the Manufacturer/Supplier in accordance with the Contract shall become the property of the Procuring Agency.
- 1.10 Wherever reference is made in the Technical Specifications to specific standards and codes to be met by the goods and materials to be furnished or tested, the provisions of the latest current edition or revision of the relevant standards or codes in effect shall apply, unless otherwise expressly stated in the Contract. Where such standards and codes are national or relates to a particular country or regions, other authoritative standards that ensure substantial equivalence to the standards and codes specified will be acceptable.
- 1.11 NGC reserves the right to delete or increase/decrease any item from any Lot before award of contract.

2. LANGUAGE

All correspondence, literature, drawings, name plates, diagrams, applicable data, equipment details, instructions and maintenance books and manuals, spare parts, books and descriptive data shall be in the English language.

3. TYPE TESTS AS APPLICABLE

- 3.1 The offered equipment shall be type tested as per revised NGC type test policy and in accordance with relevant provisions of the specifications. The said policy is attached with this document.
- 3.2 The bidder shall furnish type test certificates for the said equipment along with the bid. In case of non-submission of type test reports or if type test reports supplied are not to the satisfaction of the Engineer, the bidder shall consent on an affidavit to perform all type tests/special tests on the equipment in accordance with the NGC type test policy within the quoted bid price and stipulated delivery time. The type tests shall be witnessed by two

authorized representatives/inspectors, one nominated by DMD (AD&M) NGC) and 2nd from the Engineer (nominated by the concerned DMD). All expenses in connection with this witnessing shall be borne by the bidder, as per bidding document Section-VIII: Special Conditions of Contract, SCC Clause-21.

All type test certificates/reports, reference list, etc. shall be in English language.

- 3.3 All equipment being supplied shall confirm to type test requirements and shall be subject to routine tests in accordance with requirements stipulated under respective sections.

4. DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

- 4.1 The following technical specifications, appended at the end of bidding document, shall apply. The requirements indicated in subsequent clauses shall also have to be met. In case any requirements given in the said clauses differs from that given in the main specification, the requirements given herein shall prevail.

Soft copies of all these specifications are provided in Volume-II of this bidding documents.

5. PRE-DELIVERY / PRE-SHIPMENT INSPECTION

All the machinery /equipment /goods shall be subject to pre-delivery /pre-shipment inspection as per relevant specification and contract conditions.

6. SCHEDULE OF TECHNICAL DATA (SPECIFIC GOODS DATA)

Schedules of Technical Data/ Specific Goods Data regarding equipment/ material be supplied are provided in **Form-7 of Section-VI: Standard Form** of this bidding document. The bidder is required to fill the requisite schedule of technical data and submit the same with the bid. A bid without Schedule of Technical Data/ Specific Goods Data (filled in) shall be considered as non-responsive.

All allied equipment/material offered as a part of main equipment may have (preferably) values over and above IEC ratings/values if not specified in NGC specifications.

7. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRUCK MOUNTED AERIAL PLATFORMS/ BUCKET CRANES WITH APPROXIMATELY 16 METERS BOOM LENGTH

1. The bidder/ supplier shall provide vehicle registration and other relevant documents issued by Excise and Taxation Department/ concerned authorities.
2. The bidder shall furnish type test/prototype test reports/ certificates for the said bucket cranes along with the bid. In case of non-submission of type test reports or if type test reports supplied are not to the satisfaction of the NGC, the bidder shall give an undertaking on stamp paper stating the consent to perform all type tests/special tests on the equipment at bidder's own cost, in accordance with the relevant specifications within the quoted bid price and stipulated delivery time.
3. All the bucket cranes/ equipment shall be subject to pre-delivery/pre-shipment inspection in accordance with relevant specification and contract conditions along with Third Party Inspection (if required).

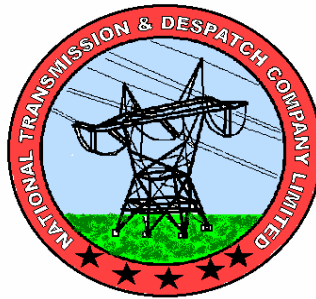

Blacklisting is one of the most effective tools used in the struggle against inefficiencies and corruption in connection with public procurement. In addition, it serves as a major deterrent against any material breach of contract and further ensures the timely execution of projects by holding delinquent persons accountable.

Rule-19 “Blacklisting of suppliers and contractors” of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 (hereinafter “**PPRA Rules**”) stipulates that;

“The procuring agencies shall specify a mechanism and manner to permanently or temporarily bar, from participating in their respective procurement proceedings, suppliers and contractors who either consistently fail to provide satisfactory performances or are found to be indulging in corrupt or fraudulent practices. Such barring action shall be duly publicized and communicated to the Authority: Provided that any supplier or contractor who is to be blacklisted shall be accorded adequate opportunity of being heard.”

In the light of the Clause above, this SOP has been drafted for procurements made by NTDC.

Any capitalised terms and abbreviations used in this SOP which are not defined herein shall have the meanings given to them in Public Procurement Regulatory Authority Ordinance, 2002 (hereinafter “**PPRA Ordinance**”) and PPRA Rules.

1.2 EXTENT OF APPLICATION

- i. The procedure shall be applicable and remain in force, along with any amendments thereto, within NTDC until any clear instructions or guidelines are imparted by the Government through PPRA, PEC, or any other competent forum.
- ii. The procedure shall also be applicable on the pre-qualified firms.
- iii. The procedure shall be applicable on any “Person”, which for the purposes of this SOP shall *interalia* include suppliers, bidders, contractors, consultants, firms, individuals, and organizations transacting business with NTDC.
- iv. Wherever any provision of this SOP shall be in conflict with provisions of any applicable guidelines of donor agencies, or any other applicable Statute / Law or Rule enforced at the time in Pakistan, the provisions of such applicable guidelines, laws, or rules shall prevail.

- v. This SOP shall become a part of the future Bidding Documents and the person(s) will submit an Undertaking along-with his bid that he has read and accepts the provisions of this SOP. Non-submission of an Undertaking may result in rejection of his bid. The said Undertaking will subsequently become part of the Contract Agreement as well.

CHAPTER NO. 2

2. REASONS OF BLACKLISTING

2.1 The causes and reasons to be taken into consideration for Debarment / Blacklisting of any person are given as under:

2.1.1 Pre- Award Stage:

The following shall be considered, *interalia*, the causes / reasons for initiating proceedings under this SOP at the Pre-Award Stage:

- i. Indulging in Corrupt, Fraudulent as well as Collusive practices.
- ii. Submission of false and spurious documents, making false statements, making frivolous complaints and allegations to gain undue advantage.
- iii. Commission of embezzlement, criminal breach of trust, theft, cheating, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, receiving stolen property, false use of trademark, securing fraudulent registration, giving false evidence, furnishing of false information of serious nature.
- iv. Submission of false bid security or infringement of documents to get undue monetary or any other benefit.
- v. Breach of confidentiality of evaluation process as mentioned in Appendix-1 based on illegal access or in any way to get undue benefit or to provide benefit or to frustrate the bidding/evaluation process. This will also include attempts to sabotage the bidding process directly or indirectly.

2.1.2 Post- Award Stage:

The following shall be considered, *interalia*, the causes / reasons for initiating proceedings under this SOP at the Post-Award Stage:-

- i. Extraordinary delay in signing or refusal to accept the Notification of Award and/or the contract without any cogent reason.
- ii. Misconduct, i.e., failure to proceed with the signed contract, withdrawal of commitments, quoting an unreasonably and unfairly low financial offer and subsequently withdrawing such an offer, frustrating the evaluation/bidding process and not responding to written communication in a reasonable time.
- iii. Causes mentioned in Clause 2.1.1 (i, ii & iii) above.
- iv. Submission of fake / frivolous or mutilated Performance Guarantee or Advance Payment Guarantee etc.

- v. Non-satisfactory performance as mentioned in Appendix-2 during the execution of the contract.
- vi. Non-performance or Breach of provisions / clauses of the contract agreements.
- vii. Notwithstanding the warranty/defect liability period, any defect in a product, equipment, plant, facility or services rendered that may subsequently surface during field operations within 5 years of its commissioning.
- viii. Failure to honour obligations within warranty period or defect liability period as defined in the contract.

2.1.3 Other Causes

- i. The person is blacklisted by any Government department in Pakistan, or it is established that the firm is involved in any kind of corruption or corrupt practices anywhere in the world.
- ii. Violations of provisions / instructions set down in the Bidding Documents.
- iii. Any attempt / activity to malign or bring NTDC into disrepute and harm its interest(s).
- iv. Person(s) blacklisted by International Financial Institutions (donor agencies) will be liable to be blacklisted after receipt of confirmation from the donor agencies without any further proceeding.
- v. Any other cause deemed just and appropriate by NTDC in the given circumstances.

Note:

- (1) If above mentioned causes occur either on part of the principal bidder or the local agent, both shall be considered for blacklisting / debarment.
- (2) The authorization of the foreign bidder to local agent shall contain his complete particulars including the name of the company, name of the owner, National Tax number (NTN), CNIC (Computerized National Identity Card) No. etc. In case, the said information is found to be missing, even after calling for the same within a reasonable time, the authority letter shall not be accepted.
- (3) The Bidding Documents shall be issued against original authority letter or in case of scanned copy, the email of the foreign bidder shall be enclosed. However, at the time of bidding, the original authority letter shall be attached with the bid. In the absence of the same, the bid shall be rejected.

CHAPTER NO. 3

3. FORMULATION OF “NTDC’S RIGHTS PROTECTION COMMITTEE”

3.1 A permanent Committee namely “NTDC’s Rights Protection Committee (**RPC or Committee**)” comprising of the following members shall examine the justification of the reasons given by the Project Authority prior to blacklisting / debarment of any firm/supplier/contractor/ individual.

Depending upon the nature of the case, the Committee may consult or appoint / nominate additional members from within NTDC with the approval of Managing Director (NTDC), provided that the Committee consists of an odd number of individuals as per spirit of Rule 48(1) of the PPRA Rules. Independence of any additional members shall be ensured while making the selection of such additional members. Furthermore, the aforementioned RPC shall also be authorized to seek external expert advice as and when required.

CHAPTER NO. 4

4.1 PROCEDURE FOR BLACKLISTING

Upon receipt of or obtaining information and/or knowledge that any person(s) is involved in practices mentioned in Chapter-2 earlier, the concerned Project Authority / formation shall promptly formulate its recommendations and submit through MD NTDC to NTDC RPC along with its findings, details of charges and documentary evidences to initiate proceedings under this SOP.

4.2 INITIATION OF AN ACTION

- (i) Within a period of 15 days after receiving the recommendations of Blacklisting / Debarment from the concerned Project Authority, the Convener of the Committee shall issue a Show Cause Notice (“**Notice**”) thereby informing the Person about the alleged charges and shall provide an opportunity to the defend said charges within a time period of 15 (fifteen) days.
- (ii) The person(s) shall be accorded adequate opportunity of hearing in order to defend the charges within the given timelines.
- (iii) The Notice to the Person shall be sent at the mailing/postal address as provided under the Contract or any other address provided by way of subsequent written communication by the Person. The non-receipt of the Notice due to incorrect / change in mailing address without any written communication shall not be attributable to NTDC. In case of non-receipt of any reply from the accused person within the formulated time, but not less than the time given in 4.2 (i) above, the Committee shall have the right to proceed on Ex-parte basis.

4.3 DECISION

- i. The committee shall hold an independent inquiry/investigation as the case may be, and, which may include site visits and interviews with the parties concerned. The Committee shall complete the entire inquiry/investigation, preferably within a period of 30 days after receipt of response from the person against whom proceedings under this SOP have been initiated and shall present the report to the MD NTDC.

- ii. If required, the Committee may report the case to an appropriate law enforcement agency depending upon the nature of the case for detailed investigations with the prior approval of Managing Director (NTDC).
- iii. The person against whom proceedings have been initiated under this SOP shall not proceed for arbitration/litigation during the proceedings for blacklisting.

4.4 COMMUNICATION OF DECISION

After recommendation for blacklisting by “NTDC’s Rights Protection Committee (RPC)”, the person concerned shall be informed within 10 days of such decision. The decision of the Committee will be notified on NTDC’s and PPRA’s websites and shall also be conveyed to Pakistan Engineering Council. Blacklisting of firms shall also be conveyed by circular to other Government Departments. All other relevant procuring agencies including PEPCO, DISCOs, and WAPDA, etc., will also be informed simultaneously.

4.5 PERIOD OF DEBARMENT FOR BLACKLISTED FIRMS

- (i) The Blacklisting on the grounds and reasons specified herein above in Chapter No. 2 shall be for a reasonable specified period of time and as a general rule of prudence, the period may not exceed three years, except in cases where debarment/blacklisting has been done by any other government department or an International Financial Institution (Donor Agency).
- (ii) In case the person has been blacklisted by the government department or the International Financial Institution (donor agency), the period of blacklisting/debarment shall be for a maximum period of 3 years or the time period for which the concerned government department/International Financial Institution (Donor Agency) debarred the contractor (whichever is higher).

4.6 ACTION AFTER PERSONS ARE PLACED ON BLACKLISTING LIST.

- i. The decision of blacklisting will be immediately circulated to all concerned as mentioned at Clause 4.4 above.
- ii. In case of a contract already awarded to a person which has been blacklisted and termination is either not possible or not feasible, the concerned Project Authority may proceed in this case to complete the contract with the approval of Competent Authority.
- iii. The blacklisted person shall stand disqualified from bidding from the date of decision against them. Any pending bids shall also stand rejected. If a contract has

already been awarded to person, it shall be voidable at the option of NTDC as per 4.6 (ii) above.

- iv. A separate register or data base will be maintained for blacklisted firms indicating reasons and period.

4.7 EFFECTIVENESS

These guidelines / SOP or any amendments thereof shall take effect immediately after its approval from Board of Directors of NTDC.

APPENDIX-1

PROCESS TO DEAL WITH FRIVOLOUS COMPLAINTS

It has been frequently observed that after opening of tenders, the bidders start to influence the evaluation process. Such attempts result in delay in finalizing of award of contract and cause financial loss to the National exchequer. The evaluation process is confidential till publication of award of contract process.

Provision of guidelines of international donor agencies and PPRA provides sufficient opportunity to bidders for redressal of their grievances. Hence, the attempts made by the bidders during evaluation process or thereafter to influence the contract award decisions fall under the definition of corrupt and fraudulent practices. Therefore, during bidding stage, the following mechanism shall be adopted in case of receipt of any frivolous complaint from the bidder.

- i. Anonymous complaints shall not be entertained.
- ii. The Procuring Agency reserves the right to call for an affidavit from the complainant verifying the truthfulness and correctness of the contents of the complaint.
- iii. The notice of displeasure and explanation will be immediately sent to those persons who lodge frivolous complaint(s) during the evaluation process.
 - iii (a) If the person itself or through its agent or any third party does not refrain from making frivolous complaints in the same tender or any other tender, an official warning will be sent and their case may be sent to “NTDC’s Rights Protection Committee” which may analyse the situation and suggest action including the rejection of the bid of the complainant. However, Project Authority may reject the bid even in first instance depending upon nature of the case or provision of the Bidding Documents.
 - iii (b) If the same person itself or through its agent or any third party lodges a frivolous complaint in another tender floating in parallel before decision of the Grievance Committee, its bid will straight forwardly be rejected by the project authority. It may also be debarred to participate in the next tender for a minimum period of six months under intimation to the Grievance Committee and MD NTDC.
- iv. In order to monitor the record of the persons, a data base will be maintained at NTDC’s website and the offices of the project authorities regarding such persons who consistently lodge frivolous complaints during the evaluation process by making clandestine access to confidential record and hamper the award of contract process.

NOTE: It is clarified that the process provided above in Appendix 1 is to discourage anonymous and frivolous complaints only, and does not bar any person feeling aggrieved by any act of the procuring agency from lodging a genuine complaint/grievance as provided under Rule 48 of the PPRA Rules, 2004.

APPENDIX-2

GUIDELINES FOR EVALUATION OF PERFORMANCE OF CONTRACTORS

- i. After signing of the contract, the Project authority (or the Consultant / Engineer) must monitor and evaluate the Contractor's performance, that is, whether the Contractor is fulfilling his obligations based on the terms of the contract and plans that were developed and agreed upon with the Project authority at the time of signing of contract or during kick-off meetings..
- ii. Though the performance evaluation of any person is an on-going process, which takes place throughout the duration of the contract and also during the Defect Liability / Warranty Period, nevertheless, a person's Performance Evaluation Report may be prepared for the consumption and benefit of the procuring agency or for any other purpose at the completion of the project, as the case may be.
- iii. The performance evaluation report shall be prepared for all contracts of more than Rs. 100 million. When based on the Evaluation Report, the performance of a person is non-satisfactory, the procuring agency may initiate the case for blacklisting of the person in accordance with the terms of this SOP. For the avoidance of doubt, consistent failure to provide satisfactory performance shall also include performances in a single or multiple contracts executed or being executed by the same person, as the case may be.
- iv. In case of any extra-ordinary delay in performance of a single contract of vital and critical importance, the procuring agency shall have the right to initiate proceedings under this SOP and/or avail any other remedy provided under the law which may *interalia* include: termination of the contract, recovery of losses, debarring the person from participation in future tenders. The procuring agency shall be the sole judge to determine the projects of vital or critical importance.
- v. In case of ordinary delay in performance in 2 consecutive contracts within a period of 3 years, the procuring agency shall have the right to initiate proceedings under this SOP and/or avail any other remedy provided under the law which may *interalia* include: termination of the contract, recovery of losses, debarring the person from participation in future tenders.
- vi. The proceedings under this SOP shall not prejudice any other rights and/or remedies available to the procuring agency under the contract documents and/or any other law in force.

4. The test performed at any other lab which are exclusively required to be performed at labs mentioned in Annex-A and Inspection report** thereof shall not be acceptable except for the provision made in Annex-B (marked by *).
5. The Type Test Reports shall include the complete information regarding outsourced components/ parts of the equipment type tested. The Report shall also include complete identification of the equipment along with drawings stamped by the concerned lab.
6. The following provisions have been made in this Policy with respect to bidding process:
 - i. The Bidder shall submit an unconditional Undertaking duly signed and stamped by bidder duly supported by manufacturer(s) in technical bid that in case of award of contract if submitted type test reports are not according to NTDC type test policy, he will carry out type tests as per NTDC Type Test Policy within the quoted Bid price and without affecting the delivery/ completion period as mentioned in the Bidding Documents. In case of failure to submit an Undertaking of type tests as per NTDC type test policy along with the bid or in response to post bid clarification:
 - a. In supply contract, bid shall be rejected.
 - b. In EPC contract, such manufacturer shall not be accepted and bidder will be bound to replace the same with acceptable manufacturer. In case of noncompliance, the bid shall be rejected.
 - ii. Within 30 days from signing of contract, the contractor shall submit schedule of type testing from lab.
 - iii. After award of contract, the bidder shall be required to perform requisite type tests before delivery of equipment without affecting the delivery/completion period as mentioned in the Bidding Document with in the quoted bid price. In case of delay or non-compliance of the said requirement, NTDC reserves the right to cancel the contract agreement including encashment of performance guarantee and initiate the process for blacklisting as per NTDC SOP for blacklisting.

Note:

- a) The manufacturers may avail this opportunity for carrying out type tests as per NTDC Policy. NTDC can also nominate its inspectors upon request provided that all such costs shall be borne by the manufacturer.
- b) NTDC reserves the right to change all or any parts of the type test policy at any time in the best interest of company.
- c) For the purpose of type testing, latest IEC and NTDC standards shall be applicable.



**NTDC SPECIFICATION DDS-11:2023****INSULATED BUCKET MOUNTED UTILITY VEHICLE****0 FOREWORD**

- 0.1 This specification has been prepared by the office of Chief Engineer (S&S) NTDC Lahore in consultation with PPMC/DISCOs to fulfil their requirements.
- 0.2 This specification supersedes the previous specification DDS-11:2019 (Amended to-date).
- 0.3 This specification is intended for the procurement of material and does not include provision of the contract.
- 0.4 This standard applies only to position personnel to work on 11kV and below lines/structures/PCC poles. Use of Insulated Bucket Mounted Utility Vehicle/Mobile Elevating Work Platform (MEWP) as a load carrier is not recommended.
- 0.5 This specification is subject to revision as stakeholders and improvement in technology demands.
- 0.6 Insulated Bucket Mounted Utility Vehicle is recommended to be used on dead/de-energized line(s)/equipment having nominal AC voltages 11 kV (rms) or below, at power frequency. Further, before starting the work, all precautionary/safety measures should be taken and ensure that line(s) /equipment are dead/ de-energized and earthed via portable Grounding or earthing switch.

1 REFERENCE STANDARDS

- 1.1 The reference standards for design, manufacturing, supply, testing and operation of insulated bucket mounted utility vehicle according to requirements shall be as follow:
 - I. Latest International Electrotechnical Commission IEC-61057 (for rated line voltage of aerial device 46 kV (rms) and below) or American National Standard Institute standard ANSI/SAIA A92.2-2015 (Category 'C' for rated line voltage of aerial device 46 kV and below) along with latest BS EN 280 Standard for design and stability calculations.
 - II. Latest International Electrotechnical Commission IEC-61057 (for rated line voltage of aerial device 22 kV and below) or American National Standard Institute standard ANSI/SAIA A92.2-2015 (Category 'E' for rated line voltage of aerial device 20 kV and below) along with latest BS EN 280 Standard for design and stability calculations.


The DISCO/ Purchaser shall specify its requirement as per any one of the above applicable standards at the time of tendering and also in its purchase order.

Note:-

All tests mentioned in Clauses-20 and 21 of Specification DDS-11:2023 (amended to date) shall be carried out as per specified requirements laid down in the above mentioned relevant/applicable standards on Insulated bucket mounted utility vehicle along with other tests mentioned in the applicable standard specified by the DISCO in its tender document and purchase order.

2 DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 **Aerial Device.** Any device, extensible, articulating, or both, which is primarily designed and used to position personnel. The device may also be used to handle material, if designed and equipped for that purpose.
- 2.2 **Anchorage (s).** A secure point of attachment to be used with personal fall protection (PFP) equipment
- 2.3 **Articulating-Boom Aerial Device.** An aerial device with two or more hinged boom sections.
- 2.4 **Authorized Personnel.** A person(s) approved or assigned to perform a specific type of duty (s) or to be at a specific locations (s) at the job site.
- 2.5 **Boom.** The main structural components of an aerial device that support and elevate the platform and load.
- 2.6 **Conductive Shield (Guard Ring).** A device used to shield the lower test electrode system from capacitive coupling.
- 2.7 **Certification.** A written statement, signed by a qualified person of manufacturer/supplier, verifying that the design, manufacture, installation and testing of the aerial device is in accordance with this standard and as well as ANSI A92.2 / IEC 61057 and BS EN 280 (amended to-date) standards.
- 2.8 **Chassis.** A vehicle on which the aerial device is mounted.
- 2.9 **Chassis Insulating System.** A system of non-conductive (insulating) components installed between the chassis and the structure supporting the upper boom. Such a system, when properly maintained, may provide insulation of the chassis should the portion of the aerial device between the boom and this system inadvertently contact an energized conductor or other apparatus.
- 2.10 **Gradeability.** Ability of a vehicle to climb slopes.
- 2.11 **Instability.** A condition of a Mobile Elevating Work Platform (MEWP) in which the sum of the moments tending to overturn the unit is equal to or exceeds the sum of the moments tending to resist overturning.

- 2.12 **Insulated.** Separated from other conducting surfaces by a dielectric substance or air space offering a high resistance to the passage of electrical current and to disruptive discharge through the substance or space. When any object is said to be insulated, it is understood to be insulated in a manner suitable for the conditions to which it is subjected.
- 2.13 **Installer.** A person (s) or entity who mounts an aerial device on a vehicle.
- 2.14 **Insulating Aerial Device.** An aerial device with electric components designed and tested to meet the specific electrical insulating rating consistent with the manufacturer's identification plate.
- 2.15 **Insulating Liner.** An insert made of non-conductive (insulating) material and designed to fit inside the platform.
- 2.16 **Mobile Unit (MEWP).** A combination of an aerial device, its chassis, and related equipment. Mobile unit (MEWP) is equivalent to the term Mobile Elevating Work Platform.
- 2.17 **Manufacturer.** A person or entity who makes, builds, or produces an aerial device.
- 2.18 **Operator.** A person trained, authorized, and engaged in the operation of aerial device.
- 2.19 **Override.** The takeover of aerial device movement and winch control functions at the platform controls by the activation of lower control station controls.
- 2.20 **Platform.** The personnel carrying component of an aerial device such as a bucket, baskets, stand, or equivalent.
- 2.21 **Platform Capacity.** The component of rated load capacity consisting of the weight of personnel and all items carried on or in the platform, including the liner.
- 2.22 **Platform Height.** The distance measured at maximum elevation from the bottom of the platform to the ground.
- 2.23 **Platform Reach.** The distance measured horizontally from the centerline of the pedestal (rotation) to the outer edge (rail) of the platform.
- 2.24 **Stowed Position (of the Boom).** The position of the boom on the vehicle where it is intended for non-use and/or transport.
- 2.25 **Supplementary Capacity.** The component of rated load capacity which may be fixed directly to the boom(s), or to load carrying attachments on the aerial device.
- 2.26 **Technical Specification.** A specification often refers to a set of documented requirements to be satisfied by a material, design, product, or service. Technical specification is referred herein as this standard and as well as ANSI A92.2 / IEC 61057 and BS EN 280 (amended to-date) standards.

- 2.27 **Telescopic Articulating Boom Aerial Device.** An aerial device, except the aerial ladder type, with a telescopic or extensible boom.
- 2.28 **Trainer.** A qualified person who conducts the training of an aerial device/mobile unit (MEWP) operator or service personnel.
- 2.29 **Training.** Instruction to enable the trainee to become a qualified person regarding the task to be performed, including knowledge regarding potential hazards.
- 2.30 **Vehicle.** A carrier for an aerial device also called chassis.
- 2.31 **Voltage.**
- 2.31.1 **Rated Line Voltage.** The nominal phase to phase voltage at which electrical systems are rated.
- 2.31.2 **Design Voltage.** The maximum rated line voltage for which the aerial device has been designed, and for which it can be qualified.
- 2.31.3 **Qualification Voltage.** The rated line voltage for which the aerial device has been actually tested.

3 GENERAL

- 3.1 Insulated bucket mounted utility vehicle (vehicle mounted Aerial platform) shall be a two man hydraulically powered, telescopic articulating type according to the applicable standards (amended to date) referred herein in this specification and available for working on 7.5 meters to 13.72 meters (minimum) working height, and continuous rotation of 360 degrees in both directions (clockwise and anti-clockwise). It will be a rear double wheel drive viz 4x2. The vehicle should have two front seats and control at any suitable place to ensure visibility and safety for the operator. The structure shall be center mounted or at any suitable place that qualifies technical specification especially in respect to stability of the Aerial Platform and should rest with bucket at the backside of the vehicle. The sides of the vehicle shall be having cabinets of appropriate sizes to keep the tools and plants, safety harness belts, first aid box, disconnecting sticks, cutting saw, hydraulic press, spares and other vehicle accessories. One spare tyre be housed at proper place.
- 3.2 The bucket should be in U-frame or should be self-aligning type.
- 3.3 Two adjustable search lights, placed suitably at such a location that these should be in a position to light up working area while working in the bucket during night hours. In addition one portable light shall also be provided. The lights shall be having intensities of 600 lux minimum. Suitable space at the back of the vehicle should be available for the seating of four personnel of line staff.

3.4 Service Conditions

The MEWP shall be suitable for operation in all DISCOs areas.

Ambient Temperature

Maximum	55°C Maximum
Maximum mean over 24 hours	45°C
Mean in a year	39°C
Minimum	-10°C

Relative Humidity Range up to 100%

3.5 Any additional feature(s) specified by DISCOs/Purchaser in tender and purchase order as per their requirement.

4 PEDESTAL

The pedestal shall be of integrally welded construction and made of steel for supporting turntable, booms and bucket loads. This pedestal is to be designed by the Aerial Platform manufacturer and shall be installed on vehicle chassis frame.

5 OUT RIGGERS

5.1 Four (04) Nos. hydraulically controlled out riggers/jacks shall be provided. The height of out riggers should be adjustable independently to vary ground contact areas, when operated. The out riggers shall be H-type with nearest to vertical spread.

5.2 An interlock device shall be provided that prevents the boom from being operated from the stowed position until the outriggers have been deployed.

6 TURN TABLE


The turn table shall be of welded steel construction having sufficient strength to support booms and bucket loads. The turn table should be rotatable by a hydraulic motor through a worm gear.

7 BOOMS

7.1 Both upper and lower booms shall be constructed of high-grade steel, Box/Round Construction capable to qualify all the tests according to the applicable standards (amended to date) referred herein in this specification.

The inner telescopic boom shall be made of Reinforced Fiber Plastic or Polyethylene or any other proper resin for at least a distance of 2 meters from bucket side.

7.2 The rotational angle shall be 360 degrees in both directions (clockwise and anti-clockwise). The manufacturer must provide means so that working personnel shall easily get into bucket from the ground.

- 7.3 Hoses and Cables shall be properly protected / concealed inside the booms for maximum protection.

8 ADDITIONAL ACCESSORIES


- 8.1 The circular/chain saw hydraulically driven shall be light weight rigged tool which shall be able to handle the heavier work with ease, cut trees or branches upto 150 mm in diameter. The length of the handle shall be 2 to 2.5 meters and its weight shall be 3.5 to 4.5 KGs. Provision to be made by the side of bucket for a suitable bracket to hang the saw. It shall be attach/detachable type with hydraulic plugs provided in the bucket. (The purchaser shall specify the exact type of cutting saw at the time of tendering.)
- 8.2 The manufacture shall establish the provision of hydraulic press (with suitable dies) for the operations related to punching/pressing of dead end bodies, different joints, etc. as specified by the DISCOs at the time of bidding.

9 DESIGN REQUIREMENTS

- 9.1 **Basic Principles.** The design and manufacturing of the Insulated Bucket Mounted Utility Vehicle shall conform to the principles laid down in the applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification, which will be specified by the DISCO/Purchaser at the time of tendering and also in purchase order.
- 9.2 **Structural Analysis.** Structural elements of the aerial device which support the platform, the platform itself, and material carrying attachments, if so equipped, shall have a calculated design stress based on the combined rated load capacity and weight of the support structure. The structural analysis shall consider all the effects mentioned in the applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification.
- 9.3 **Stability.** The stability of the aerial device shall conform to the specified requirements laid down in the applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification. There shall be no instability.
- 9.4 **Wind Speed.** The wind forces shall conform to the specified requirements laid down in the applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification.

10 CONTROLS

- 10.1 **General Aerial devices** shall have both upper and lower controls for boom positioning. All controls shall be clearly identifying their function and protected from damage and unintentional actuation. The boom positioning and material carrying attachment controls shall return to their neutral position when released by the operator.

- 10.2 **Unlocking or Enabling Device.** The use of an unlocking or enabling device shall precede the use of boom positioning controls. The unlocking or enabling device may be incorporated into each control. A separate control that has to be continuously activated by the operator in order for any motion to take place meets this requirement. Foot controls, if so equipped, shall have slip-resistant surfaces and be easy to clean. The unlocking or enabling device shall return to the locked or disabled position when the control is released by the operator.
- 10.3 **Visibility at Control Positions.** Any control positions shall allow the operator to see the resulting movements.
- 10.4 **Upper Controls.** Upper controls shall be in or beside the platform and readily accessible to the operator. On a two-platform aerial device, control operation from either platform shall be accomplished with reasonable ease and without the need to disengage personal fall protection equipment.

In order to protect against unintentional actuation of the boom positioning controls at the platform, the use of an unlocking or enabling device shall precede the use of the control itself. The unlocking or enabling device shall return to the locked or disabled position when the control is released by the operator. The unlocking or enabling device may be incorporated into each control.

- 10.5 **Lower Controls.** Lower controls shall be readily accessible in all boom positions and shall provide a means to override the boom positioning upper controls provided the upper control system is intact.

The override mode shall maintain its function while unattended. The lower control of insulating aerial devices shall be designed in such a manner that an operator is not placed in the electrical part between the aerial device and ground.

- 10.6 **Emergency Stop.** An additional control shall be provided at the platform at the lower controls to affect an emergency stop of the powered upper control functions. These controls shall be permanently marked and shall not require continuous actuation for as stop condition. At the lower controls, the override control may be used as an emergency stop provided it is clearly identified as an "emergency stop".
- 10.7 **Outriggers Control.** When the aerial device is equipped with outriggers controls, these controls shall be guarded to protect against unintentional operation, and shall return to neutral when released by the operator.

The controls shall be located so that the operator can see the outriggers being operated.

11 SECURING DEVICES

- 11.1 **Boom Securing device.** Aerial devices shall be equipped to ensure that the boom(s) remain in the cradled position during transportation.

- 11.2 **Platform Security.** Platforms shall be designed to withstand vibration and shock loading during transportation.
- 11.3 **Locking Pins.** Any locking pins shall be secured against unintentional disengagement and loss.


12 INSULATING BUCKET

The bucket(s) shall be made of Reinforced Fiber Glass/ Reinforced Fiber Plastic with lining of moulded thermofuse polyethylene. The manufacturer shall provide a bucket of size (L x W x H) 1.22 x 0.61 x 1.00 meters (with cover) having a rated load of 200 KGs (minimum) (Two persons). Preferably the bucket shall have a hydraulically controlled swinging property with an angle of 60 to 90 degrees on either side. The insulating bucket shall withstand all the tests according to the applicable standards (amended to date) referred herein in this specification.

13 HYDRAULIC SYSTEM

- 13.1 **Bursting Safety Factors.** All hydraulic components whose failure could result in motion of the platform or material lifting device or both shall have a minimum bursting strength of at least four times the maximum operating pressure for which the system is designed. All other hydraulic components normally rated according to bursting strength, such as hose, tubing, and fittings, shall have a minimum bursting strength of at least three times the operating pressure for which the system is designed. All other hydraulic components normally rated according to performance criteria, such as rated flow and pressure, life cycles, pressure drop, rpm, torque, and speed, shall have a minimum bursting strength of at least two times the maximum operating pressure for which the system is designed. Such components generally include pumps, motors, directional controls, and similar functional components.
- 13.2 **Venting of Air.** The design of the hydraulic system shall allow entrapped air to be vented if required for proper operation
- 13.3 **Reservoir Vent Filter.** Any fluid reservoir vent shall be equipped with a filter.
- 13.4 **Fluid Level Indicators.** Hydraulic reservoirs for the aerial device shall be equipped with a device to indicate the permissible liquid level for normal operation.
- 13.5 **Fluid Cleanliness.** Each hydraulic system shall have means to maintain the fluid cleanliness, necessary level for operation of the system and its components. The manufacturer shall provide necessary instructions for proper maintenance.
- 13.6 **Gas-Loaded Accumulators.** Hydraulic systems shall incorporate gas-loaded accumulators and a means shall be provided to vent the liquid pressure automatically or to isolate positively the accumulator when the system is in the unpressurized state. Duplicate information shall be provided in the maintenance manual.

13.7 Non-conductive hydraulic hoses to be used in the system.


14 STABILITY

Stability test(s) should be performed as per specified requirements laid down in the applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification.

15 SECURITY FEATURES

- 15.1 Safety relief valve to be included in multi-control valve to prevent over-pressure.
- 15.2 Pilot-operated holding and check valves to be equipped direct on cylinders to prevent cylinder retraction load and hold each cylinder in position in case hydraulic failure occurs.
- 15.3 Boom angle controller to be installed to keep the unit within working range. Emergency lowering mechanism employed to lower the bucket in the event of primary hydraulic power source failure i.e. rotation of turntable to be achieved by rotating the shaft of rotation speed reducer with crank handle. Lowering of upper and lower booms to be performed by bleeding pilot operated holding and check valves.
- 15.4 An operating control in the bucket to be designed in such a way that they may be operated only by an intention. They shall return automatically to their off (stop) position as soon as the operator ceases to use them.
- 15.5 A safety ring shall be located at the end of upper boom to anchor operator safety belt.
- 15.6 Warning lights shall be placed underneath the aerial platform on each side and shall start flashing when platform controls are activated. A rotation beacon shall be placed to the side of the turntable which shall start flashing when platform controls are activated.
- 15.7 For detecting nearby energized lines the provision of beeper shall be made.
- 15.8 A way of communication shall be provided between lineman in the bucket and driver/operator.
- 15.9 6 Nos. barricades shall be provided by the supplier.
- 15.10 Light reflectors shall be pasted at suitable places for safe working at night.
- 15.11 A load sensing device shall be provided on platform and as well as on chassis to ensure safe load limits through beep alarms.
- 15.12 Level indicator to be provided for stability.
- 15.13 Insulated upper controls for complete isolation of work platform/buckets.
- 15.14 Boom material sheet yield strength on steel shall be as per applicable standard.
- 15.15 Pin material yield strength on steel shall be as per applicable standard.

**16 WARRANTY**

The bidder/supplier shall provide 5 years warranty for successful operation of MEWP including its maintenance and spare parts for 2 years (free of cost) wherever required.

17 TRAINING

The successful bidder shall arrange comprehensive training of at least 15 days by a trainer regarding operation and maintenance of Aerial devices including recognition and avoidance of hazards associated with their operation. Such training shall include class room training and on job training. A certificate shall be given to successful trainees on completion of training.

18 STANDARD COLOUR

18.1 Chassis should be ED (Electrophoretic deposition) paint for rust proofing.

18.2 The standard colour requirement for Insulated Bucket Mounted Utility Vehicle shall be as follow:

- i. WHITE colour for aerial device with rated line voltage of 46kV (rms) and below.
- ii. YELLOW colour for aerial device with rated line voltage of 22kV and below or with rated line voltage of 20kV and below.

19 MARKING

19.1 Every vehicle shall be marked/engraved with word "DISCO Name" of suitable size at the following points:

- 1) Bucket
- 2) First section of boom
- 3) Two different locations of the vehicle,

19.2 The manufacturer shall provide an identification Plate(s) to indicate the following minimum information:

- i. Make
- ii. Model
- iii. Insulating or non-insulating
- iv. Qualification voltage and date of test
- v. Serial Number
- vi. Year of manufacturing
- vii. Rated load capacity
- viii. Rated platform height
- ix. Aerial device System Pressure or Aerial Device Control System Voltage or both
- x. No. of Platform
- xi. Size of Tyres
- xii. Category of Insulating Aerial device

- xiii. Ambient temperature range for which the Aerial device is designed.
- xiv. Name and Location of manufacturer
- xv. Installer
- xvi. Unit equipped with material handling attachment or not.

- 19.3 The identification plate should be made of stainless steel having minimum dimensions 254mm x 203mm and thickness of 0.5mm.
- 19.4 Clearly visible Category/Voltage Level with minimum size 100 mm shall be printed on upper boom and bucket at suitable locations.

20 PROTOTYPE APPROVAL

- 20.1 The manufacturers/suppliers shall offer the sample along with three sets of drawings of chassis and structure to the office of Chief Engineer (Standards and Specifications) for getting prototype approval. When prototype is offered for first time for each category, the representatives of office of Chief Engineer (S&S) NTDC and Chief Engineer (MI) PPMC will visit manufacturer's premises for verification of Manufacturing, Testing and Assembling facilities/capabilities.
- 20.2 The offered prototype sample shall be subjected to all but not limited to the following tests as per applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification.

1.	Visual Inspection & Verification of Components
2.	Verification of Hydraulic System and Hydraulic Cylinder
3.	Verification of working of anchorage
4.	Verification of Protection System of Platform or load Motion
5.	Stability Testing
6.	Platform Creep Test
7.	Qualification Test/Dielectric Tests of the upper insulating system
8.	Test for Chassis Insulating System
9.	Test of Insulating Liner of Bucket
10.	Confirmation Test of upper control components with High Electrical Resistance
11.	Electrical Tests for Insulating Aerial Devices. (Before Use Test)

The testing shall be carried out at HV & SC Lab. NTDC Rawat or PCSIR Lab. The testing may also be carried out at any other ILAC/PNAC accredited laboratory subject to the condition that the proficiency testing under ILAC / PNAC certification covers those tests. In any case the prototype testing will be duly witnessed by the office of Chief Engineer (Standards and Specifications) NTDC at the cost of supplier.

- 20.3 All necessary Import documents shall be maintained by the supplier/manufacturer in order to ensure the authenticity of the quality of the product and shall be readily available.

- 20.4 The supplier shall also present the certificate from the manufacturer that the complete Aerial Device has been designed, manufactured and tested as per

applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification.

- 20.5 The manufacturer shall be having latest OHSAS 18001/45001 safety standard and shall be duly verified by the office of CE (S&S) NTDC during the prototype testing of Aerial Platform.
- 20.6 The manufacturer of Aerial device shall have in-house manufacturing facility and state of the art Laboratory equipped with latest equipment/instruments duly calibrated from PNAC/ILAC accredited Laboratory for in-house/routine testing necessary during and after the final product.
- 20.7 All expenses like testing fee, expenditure incurred for shipment of MEWP from manufacturer's premises to the testing lab., traveling, lodging, boarding and daily allowance of two NTDC Engineers shall be borne by the manufacturer.

21 INSPECTION

- 21.1 The successful bidder/supplier shall offer MEWPs for inspection/testing. The supplier shall have workshop or at least have an agreement with the independent workshops for repair and maintenance work.

21.2 Routine Testing

Routine testing shall be carried out by the office of Chief Engineer (MI) PPMC along with representative of DISCO. Following testing shall be carried out on the units being purchased.

1. Visual Inspection and Verification of Dimensions & Components
2. Stability Testing
3. Qualification Test/Dielectric Tests of the upper Insulating system
4. Test for Chassis Insulating System
5. Test of Insulating Liner of Bucket

- 21.3 In addition to above tests, following operational test shall also be performed on MEWP to ensure strict compliance with the operational requirements.

1. Booms
2. Elevating and lowering mechanism
3. Boom extension mechanism
4. Rotating mechanism
5. Safety Devices
6. Verification of components as per specification.

- 21.4 Tests mentioned in clause 21.2 and 21.3 shall be carried out at manufacturer/supplier's lab. having testing equipment duly calibrated from ILAC/PNAC accredited lab. or at HV & SC Lab. NTDC Rawat, PCSIR Lab. or any other ILAC/PNAC accredited laboratory at the cost of supplier..

- 21.5 Tests mentioned in clause 21.2 and 21.3 shall be carried out on each manufactured unit. If any unit fails in any test then that unit shall be rejected. If more than one (01) unit fails in any test then the complete offered quantity shall be rejected.

21.6 Annual Joint Testing

One (01) No. complete unit shall be randomly selected jointly by representative(s) of office of CE (MI) PPMC and CE (S&S) NTDC from any DISCO's Purchase Order for each category of each manufacturer/supplier once in a calendar year. The selected sample shall be tested at HV & SC Lab. NTDC Rawat, PCSIR Lab. or any ILAC/PNAC accredited laboratory for following tests as per applicable standards (amended to date) mentioned herein in this specification:

1. Stability Testing
2. Qualification Test/Dielectric Tests of the upper insulating system
3. Test for Chassis Insulating System
4. Test of Insulating Liner of Bucket

The testing shall be carried out at the cost of supplier and witnessed by office of CE (MI) PPMC and CE (S&S) NTDC jointly.

If the selected unit fails in any test then the offered quantity shall be rejected and manufacturer/supplier shall offer the same quantity after improvement and the testing process as mentioned above shall be repeated. If the randomly selected unit again fails in any test then the prototype approval shall be considered as invalid and the manufacturer/supplier shall have to obtain new prototype approval from the office of Chief Engineer (S&S) NTDC.

22 PRECAUTIONS FOR OPERATORS

Before and during each use, the operator shall:

- i. Check for overhead obstructions and electrical conductors.
- ii. Maintain adequate clearance from obstructions and electrical apparatus.
- iii. Ensure that the load and its distribution on the platform and/or load lifting device is in accordance with the manufacturer's requirements.
- iv. Ensure that outriggers and stabilizers are used if the manufacturer's instructions require their use.
- v. Use outrigger pads when necessary to provide firm footing.
- vi. Cease operation of the Aerial device and request further information from the user should the operator encounter any suspected malfunction of the aerial device or any hazard potentially unsafe condition.
- vii. If the platform or elevating assembly becomes caught, snagged, or otherwise prevented from normal motion by external obstacles such that control reversal does not free the platform, all personnel should be removed from the platform before attempts are made to free the platform or elevating assembly.
- viii. Before starting the work, all precautionary/safety measures shall be taken and ensure that line (s) /equipment are dead/ de-energized and earthed via portable grounding or earthing switch.
