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REQUEST FOR BIDS

PROCUREMENT OF GOODS

1. The **Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited (Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited)** has reserved Funds for the procurement planned for FY **2026-27**. The **Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited (Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited)** intends to apply part of the proceeds of this Fund to cover eligible payments under the contract for the "**Tender P-55/2026 Procurement of Hardware, Software Supply & Infrastructure Implementation**" with the reference of "**P112186**"
2. The **Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited (Pakistan Revenue Automation Pvt Limited)** invites sealed Bids from eligible Bidders for procurement of goods described in the bidding documents on **EPADS v2.0**.
3. **Single Stage-Two Envelope** will be used by adopting **Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS)** Technique for the subject procurement, in line with the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 and any Regulations, Regulatory Guides, Procurement Guidelines or Instructions issued by the Authority from time to time.
4. All Bids must be accompanied by a Bid Security amounting described in Bid Security Section in Bidding Document in the form of **Pay Order** or all bids must be accompanied by bid securing declaration in the format specified in the Bidding documents
5. E-Bidding documents, containing detailed terms & conditions, specifications and requirements etc. are available on **e-Pak Acquisition and Disposal System (EPADS)** at **<https://epads.gov.pk/opportunities/federal/procurements/112186>** for all the interested bidders registered on **EPADS v2.0**. Bidders are required to get themselves registered on **EPADS v2.0** to participate in Bidding process.
6. The e-bids, prepared in accordance with the instructions in the e-Bidding Documents, must be submitted through **EPADS v2.0** on or before **Friday, September 25, 2026 03:00 PM**. E-bids will be opened using **EPADS v2.0** on the same day at **Friday, September 25, 2026 03:30 PM**. Manual

submission of Bids shall not be entertained. Those vendors who have not yet registered on the new version of **EPADS v2.0**, may register themselves on <https://vendors.epads.gov.pk/>. A tutorial to explain the registration process is available at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MNW6T38v7tc>

In terms of Rule 48 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004 Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) is notified for the subject procurement and notification copy is available on the procuring agency's website and on Authority's website at (www.ppra.org.pk).

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Instructions to Bidders

A. Introduction

1.Scope of Bids

1.1 The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the **Bids Data Sheet (BDS)** invites Bids **through EPADS v2.0** for the provision of Goods for as specified in the BDS and **in Section V - Evaluation Criteria, Specifications & Schedule of Requirements**. The name, identification, and number of items/deliverables are provided in the **BDS**. The successful Bidders will be expected to provide the goods within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the **BDS**.

2. Source of Funds

2.1 Source of funds is referred in Clause-1 of Invitation for Bids.

3. Eligible Bidders

3.1 A Bidder may be natural person, company or firm or public or semi-public agency of Pakistan or any foreign country, or any combination of them with a formal existing agreement (on Judicial Papers) in the form of a joint venture, consortium, or association. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a Lead Member as nominated in the BDS, who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the joint venture, consortium, or association during the Bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of the contract.

3.2 Verifiable copy of the agreement that forms a joint venture, consortium or association shall be required to be submitted as part of the Bid.

3.3 The appointment of Lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of a valid Power of Attorney to the Procuring Agency.

3.4 Any bid submitted by the joint venture, consortium or association shall indicate the part of proposed contract to be performed by each party and each party shall be evaluated (or post qualified if required) with respect to its contribution only, and the responsibilities of each party shall not be substantially altered without prior written approval of the Procuring Agency and in line with

any instructions issued by the Authority.

(The limit on the number of members of JV or Consortium or Association may be prescribed in BDS, in accordance with the guidelines issued by the PPRA).

3.5 The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective suppliers, manufacturers, or authorized agents / dealers subject to any provisions of incorporation or licensing by the respective national incorporating agency or statutory body established for that particular trade or business. Procuring agencies shall specify the registration/licensing requirements for the foreign bidders keeping in view the requirement of that business.

3.6 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidder may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this Bidding process, if they:

1. are associated or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used for the procurement of the Goods to be purchased under this Invitation for Bids.
2. have controlling shareholders in common; or
3. receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or
4. have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or
5. have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Bids of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Procuring Agency regarding this Bidding process; or
6. Submit more than one Bid in this Bidding process.

3.7 A Bidder may be ineligible if –

1. he is declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm, insolvent;
2. payments in favor of the Bidder is suspended in accordance with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment declaring bankruptcy and resulting (in accordance with the national laws) in the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of its property;

3. the Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any offence involving professional conduct;

4. the Bidder is blacklisted locally or by international organizations and hence debarred due to involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices, or performance failure or due to breach of Bid securing declaration.

3.8 As and when required, bidders shall provide to the Procuring Agency evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.

3.9 Bidders shall submit Bids relating to the nature, conditions and modalities of sub-contracting wherever the sub-contracting of any elements of the contract amounting to more than ten (10) percent of the Bid price is envisaged.

4. Eligible Goods and Related Services

4.1 All goods and related services to be supplied under the contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, and all expenditures made under the contract will be limited to such goods and services. For purpose of this Bid, ineligible countries are the countries declared ineligible by the Federal Government.

5. One Bid per Bidder

5.1 A bidder shall submit only one Bid, in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder or as a member in a joint venture or any similar arrangement.

5.2 The Bidder shall not engage a subcontractor for any portion of the contract if the value of such subcontracting exceeds thirty percent (30%) of the total contract amount.

6. Cost of Bidding

6.1 Any cost incurred by the bidder relating to the preparation and submission of its Bid shall be borne by the bidder, and the Procuring Agency shall in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

B. Bidding Documents

7. Contents of Bidding Document

7.1 The Goods required, Bidding procedures, and terms and conditions of the contract are prescribed in the Bidding Documents. In addition to the Invitation for Bids, the Bidding documents which should be read in conjunction with any addenda issued in accordance with **ITB 9.1** include:

Section I -Invitation to Bids

Section II Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

Section III Bid Data Sheet (BDS)

Section IV Evaluation Criteria, Specifications, Schedule of Requirements

Section V Bid Forms

Section VI General Conditions of Contract (GCC)

Section VII Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)

Section VIII Contract Forms

7.2 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bidding documents. Failure to furnish all the information required in the Bidding documents through **EPADS v2.0** will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of his Bids.

8. Clarification of Bidding documents

8.1 A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding documents may notify the Procuring Agency through **EPADS v2.0**.

8.2 The Procuring Agency will within three (3) working days after receiving the request for clarification, respond to any request for clarification through **EPADS v2.0** provided that such request is received not later than three (03) days prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids as prescribed in **ITB 22**

8.3 Copies of the Procuring Agency's response will be forwarded to all identified Prospective Bidders through **EPADS v2.0**, including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source.

8.4 Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the Bidding document as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under **ITB 9**.

8.5 If indicated **in the BDS**, the Bidder's designated representative is invited at the Bidder's cost to attend a pre-Bid meeting at the place, date and time mentioned **in the BDS**. During this pre-Bid meeting, prospective Bidders may request clarification of the schedule of requirement, the Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the Bidding document.

8.6 Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be uploaded on **EPADS v2.0**. Any modification to the Bidding documents that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to **ITB 9**. Non-attendance at the pre-Bid meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a Bidder.

9. Amendment of Bidding documents

9.1 Before the deadline for submission of Bids, the Procuring Agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or Pre-Bid meeting may modify the Bidding documents by issuing addenda through **EPADS v2.0**.

9.2 The Procuring Agency shall promptly publish the addendum through **EPADS v2.0**.

9.3 Any addendum issued including the notice of any extension of the deadline shall also be communicated through EPADS v2.0 to all the bidders who have already submitted their bids. Such bidders shall have the right to withdraw their already submitted bid and re-submit the revised bid prior to the original or extended bid submission deadline.

9.4 To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum/corrigendum into account in preparing their Bids, the Procuring Agency may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Bids through **EPADS v2.0**:

Provided that the Procuring Agency shall extend the deadline for submission of Bids, if such an addendum is issued within last three (03) days of the Bids submission deadline.

C. Preparation of Bids

10. Language of Bid

10.1 The Bid prepared by the bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bids exchanged by the Bidder and the Procuring Agency shall be written in the English language unless otherwise specified in the BDS. Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the Bidder may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant pages in the English language unless otherwise specified in the **BDS**, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bidder, the translation shall govern.

11. Documents and samples Constituting the Bid

11.1 The Bid prepared by the Bidder shall constitute the documents required in the **BDS**.

Details of sample(s) where applicable and requested in the BDS.

1. Documentary evidence established in accordance with ITB that the Bidder is eligible and/or qualified for the subject bidding process;
2. Documentary evidence establish that the Bidder has been authorized by the manufacturer to deliver the goods into Pakistan, where required and where the supplier is not the manufacturer of those goods;
3. Documentary evidence establish that the goods and related services to be supplied by the Bidder are eligible goods and services, and conform to the Bidding Documents;
4. Bid security or Bid Securing Declaration furnished in accordance with **ITB 18**.

12. Documents Establishing Eligibility of the Goods and Conformity to Bidding documents

12.1 To establish the conformity of the bidder to the Bidding document, the Bidder shall furnish as part of its Bids the documentary evidence that Goods provided conform to the technical specifications and standards.

13. Documents Establishing Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder

13.1 The Bidder shall furnish, as part of its Bid, all those documents establishing the Bidder's eligibility to participate in the Bidding process and/or its qualification to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted.

14. Form of Bids

14.1 The Bidder shall fill the Form of Bid furnished in the Bidding documents. The Bids Form must be completed without any alterations to its format and no substitute shall be accepted.

15. Bids Prices

15.1 The Bids Prices quoted by the Bidder in the Form of Bid and in the Price Schedules shall conform to the requirements specified below or exclusively mentioned hereafter in the Bidding documents.

15.2 All items in the Schedule of Requirement must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedule(s). If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced and neither explicitly denied, their prices shall be construed to be included in the prices of other items.

15.3 Items not listed in the Price Schedule shall be assumed not to be included in the Bid, and provided that the Bid is still substantially responsive in their absence or due to their nominal nature, the corresponding average price of the respective item(s) of the remaining substantially responsive Bidder(s) shall be construed to be the price of those missing item(s).

15.4 The Bid price to be quoted in the Form of Bid in accordance with **ITB 14.1** shall be the total price of the Bid.

15.5 The Bidder shall indicate on the appropriate Price Schedule, the unit prices (where applicable) and total Bid price of the Goods it proposes to provide under the contract.

15.6 Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the contract and not subject to variation on any account. A Bid submitted with an adjustable price will be treated as non-responsive and shall be rejected.

16. Bids Currencies

16.1 Prices shall be quoted in Pakistani Rupees unless otherwise specified in the BDS in accordance with Rule 30 (2) of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

17. Bids Validity Period

17.1 Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the **BDS** after the Bid submission deadline prescribed by the Procuring Agency. A Bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by the Procuring Agency as non-responsive. The period of Bid validity will be determined from the complementary Bid securing instrument, i.e. the expiry period of Bid Security or Bids Securing Declaration as the case may be.

17.2 The procuring agency shall ordinarily be under an obligation to process and evaluate the bid and to issue letter of award within the stipulated bid validity period.

17.3 Under exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the initial Bid validity period, the Procuring Agency may request the Bidders' consent to an extension of the period of validity of their Bids only once through **EPADS v2.0**, for the period not more than the period of initial bid validity. The Bid Security provided under **ITB 18** shall also be suitably extended. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid security or causing to be executed its Bid Securing Declaration. A Bidder agreeing to the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its Bid, but will be required to extend the validity of its Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration for the period of the extension.

18. Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration

18.1 The Bidder shall furnish as part of its Bid, a Bid Security in accordance with Rule 25 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

18.2 The original Bid Security shall be enclosed within the sealed envelope and to be submitted physically before closing time for submission of bids. Whereas, scanned copy of bid security shall be uploaded electronically through EPADS v2.0 before closing hours for submission of bids.

18.3 The Bidder who failed to submit the original Bids security before the submission deadline shall be disqualified straightaway.

18.4 The Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration is required to protect the Procuring Agency against the risk of Bidder's conduct which would warrant the security's forfeiture, pursuant to **ITB 18.7**.

18.5 The Bid Security shall be denominated in the local currency, and it shall be a Bank Draft in the name of the Procuring Agency and valid for twenty-eight (28) days beyond the end of the validity of the Bid. This shall also apply if the period

for Bids/Bid Validity is extended. In either case, the form must include the complete name of the Bidder.

18.6 The Bid Security shall be payable promptly upon written demand by the Procuring Agency in case any of the conditions listed in **ITB 18** are invoked.

18.7 Unsuccessful Bidders' Bid Security will be discharged or returned as promptly as possible, however in no case later than thirty (30) days after the expiration of the period of Bids Validity prescribed by the Procuring Agency pursuant to **ITB 17**. The Procuring Agency shall make no claim to the amount of the Bid Security, and shall promptly return the Bid Security document, after whichever of the following that occurs earliest:

- a. the expiry of the Bid Security;
- b. the entry into force of a procurement contract and the provision of a Performance Guarantee, for the performance of the contract if such a guarantee, is required by the Bid documents;
- c. the rejection by the Procuring Agency of all Bids;
- d. the withdrawal of the Bids prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids, unless the Bids documents stipulate that no such withdrawal is permitted.

18.8 The successful Bidder's Bids Security will be discharged upon the Bidder signing the contract, or furnishing the Performance Guarantee.

18.9 The Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bid Securing Declaration executed:

- a. if a Bidder:
- b. withdraws its Bid during the period of Bid Validity as specified by the Procuring Agency, and referred by the Bidder on the Form of Bids except as provided for in **ITB 17.2**; or
- c. does not accept the correction of errors; or
- d. in the case of a successful Bidder, if the Bidder fails:
- e. to sign the contract; or
- f. to furnish Performance Guarantee.

19. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Bid

19.1 Before Bid submission deadline, any Bidder may withdraw, substitute, or modify its Bid after it has been submitted through EPADS v2.0. Bids requested to be withdrawn, shall be returned unopened to the Bidders through **EPADS v2.0**.

20. Format and Signing of Bid

20.1 The Bidder shall prepare and submit Bids with due diligence after carefully reading all the terms and condition **before bid submission deadline** through EPADS v2.0.

D. Submission of Bids

21. Submission of Bids through EPADS v2.0

21.1 The Technical and Financial Bids if required to submitted, shall be submitted on **EPADS v2.0**.

22. Deadline for Submission of Bids

22.1 Bids shall be received by the Procuring Agency through **EPADS v2.0** before bid submission deadline.

22.2 The Procuring Agency may, under exceptional circumstances, extend the deadline for the submission of Bids, after recording reasons in writing and in an equal opportunity manner.

In such case, all rights and obligations of the Procuring Agency and the Bidders that were previously governed by the original deadline shall thereafter be subject to the revised deadline.

E. Opening and Evaluation of Bids

23. Opening of Bids

23.1 The Bid Evaluation Committee of the Procuring Agency shall open all Bids through the EPADS v2.0, on the date and time specified in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS).

23.2 The Bid Evaluation Committee **shall generate minutes through EPADS v2.0 containing brief details of bid opening process.** The record of the Bid opening shall include, as a minimum: the name of the Bidder, the Bid price if applicable, and the presence or absence of a Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration.

23.3 The procuring agency shall live broadcast the opening of bids on national media or on their website or digital channels, if the volume of procurement exceeds five hundred million rupees in case of goods and services and one thousand million rupees in case of works.

23.4 In case the date of opening of bid has been declared as public holiday or the procuring agency fail to open bid due to any EPADS v2.0 related issues, the submission and opening of bids shall be shifted to the next working day on the same time.

23.5 In case of Single Stage One Envelope Procedure, the Bidders names, the Bid prices, the total amount of each Bid and, the presence or absence of Bid Security, Bid Securing Declaration and such other details as the Procuring Agency may consider appropriate, will be announced by the Bid Evaluation Committee.

24. Clarification of Bids

24.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Bids of the Bidders, the Procuring Agency may, ask any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid including breakdown of prices.

24.2 The request for clarification and the response shall be sought through EPADS v2.0 **before three days prior to the deadline for submission of bids.** No change in the prices or substance of the Bids shall be sought, offered, or permitted.

24.3 The alteration or modification in the BIDS which in any way affect the following parameters will be considered as a change in the substance of a Bids:

1. evaluation & qualification criteria;
2. required scope of work or specifications;
3. all securities requirements;
4. tax requirements;

5. terms and conditions of Bidding documents.

6. change in the ranking of the Bidder

24.4 From the time of Bids opening to the time of Contract award if any Bidder wishes to contact the Procuring Agency on any matter related to the Bids it should do so through **EPADS v2.0**.

25. Preliminary Examination of Bids

25.1 Prior to the detailed evaluation of Bids, the Procuring Agency will determine whether each Bid:

1. meets the eligibility criteria defined in **ITB 3**;
2. has been prepared as per the format and contents defined by the Procuring Agency in the Bidding documents;
3. is accompanied by the required securities; and
4. is substantially responsive to the requirements of the Bidding documents.

25.2 The Procuring Agency's determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the Bid itself.

25.3 A substantially responsive Bid is one which conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bidding documents, without material deviation or reservation. A material deviation or reservation is one that: -

1. affects in any substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of the Goods;
2. limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the Bidding documents, the Procuring Agency's rights or the Bidders obligations under the Contract; or
3. if rectified, would affect unfairly the competitive position of other Bidders presenting substantially responsive Bids.

25.3 If a Bids is not substantially responsive, it will be rejected by the Procuring Agency and may not subsequently be evaluated for complete technical responsiveness.

26. Examination of Terms and Conditions; Technical Evaluation

26.1 The Procuring Agency shall examine the Bids to confirm that all terms and conditions specified in the **GCC** and the **SCC** have been accepted by the Bidder without any material deviation or reservation.

26.2 The Procuring Agency shall evaluate the technical aspects of the Bids submitted, to confirm that all requirements specified in Schedule of Requirements and Technical Specifications of the Bidding documents have been met without material deviation or reservation.

26.3 If after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the Procuring Agency determines that the Bid is not substantially responsive in accordance with **ITB 25.2**, it shall reject the Bid.

27. Correction of Errors

27.1 Bids determined to be substantially responsive will be checked for any arithmetic errors. Errors will be corrected as follows: -

1. if there is a discrepancy between unit prices and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the Procuring Agency there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;
2. if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of sub-totals, the sub-totals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
3. where there is a discrepancy between the amounts in figures and in words, the amount in words will govern.
4. Where there is discrepancy between grand total of price schedule and amount mentioned on the Form of Bids, the amount referred in Price Schedule shall be treated as correct subject to elimination of other errors.

27.2 The amount stated in the Bid will, be adjusted by the Procuring Agency in accordance with the above procedure for the correction of errors and, with the concurrence of the Bidder, shall be considered as binding upon the Bidder. If the Bidder does not accept the corrected amount, its Bid will then be rejected, and the Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bids Securing Declaration may be executed.

28. Conversion to Single Currency

28.1 To facilitate evaluation and comparison, the Procuring Agency will convert all Bids prices expressed in the amounts in various currencies in which the Bids prices are payable. For the purposes of comparison of bids quoted in different currencies, the price shall be converted into a single currency specified in the bidding documents. The rate of exchange shall be the selling rate prevailing on the date of opening of financial bids specified in the bidding documents, in accordance with weighted average customer exchange rates list issued by the State Bank of Pakistan on that day.

29. Evaluation of Bids

29.1 The Bids, quotations, or proposals shall be evaluated by the respective evaluation committees as per evaluation criteria described in the Bidding Documents in accordance with Rule 29 and 30 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

1. Least Cost Based Selection (LCBS)

After meeting the requirements of eligibility, qualification and substantial responsiveness, the bid in compliance with all the mandatory (technical) specifications/requirements and/or requisite quality threshold (if any), and having lowest evaluated cost (or financial proposal) shall be considered Successful Bid.

2. Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS)

In such combination, there shall be some specific weightage of both the technical features and financial aspects of the proposal. The financial marks shall be awarded on the basis of inverse proportion calculations. The successful bid shall be declared, on the basis of combined evaluation.

3. Quality Based Selection (QBS)

After meeting the requirements of eligibility, qualification and substantial responsiveness the bid in compliance with all the mandatory (technical) specifications/requirements and attaining highest marks in the Technical Evaluation considering all other qualitative and/or quantitative parameters (or point rated criteria) for technical proposal(s) such as working methodology, implementation plan, resource allocation, additional functionalities, risk management approach, knowledge transfer techniques, post implementation methodology etc. shall be treated as highest ranked bid. Later on, the financial proposal of highest ranked bidder shall be opened, however, in case of failure to proceed further with such a bidder, the procuring agency may resort to second

highest bidder and so on.

29.2 In case of tie of bids, the bidders shall be provided an opportunity to offer their best and final monetary offer through EPADS v2.0. However, in no case the rates shall be higher than the original financial bids.

30. Domestic Preference

30.1 The procuring agency shall evaluate and compare bids, allow for preference to domestic bidders, while competing with the international bidders in accordance with the policies of Federal Government.

The percentage of preference, to be accorded shall be clearly mentioned in the bidding documents under the bid evaluation criteria.

31. Determination of Successful Bid

31.1 Selection technique will be adopted for determining the Successful Bid in accordance with the criteria referred in the BDS or prescribed in the separate section titled as Evaluation Criteria.

31.2 In case where the Procuring Agency adopts the Cost Based Evaluation Technique and, the Bid with the lowest evaluated price from amongst those which are eligible, compliant and substantially responsive shall be the Successful Bid.

31.3 The Procuring Agency may adopt the Quality & Cost Based Selection Technique due to the following two reasons:

1. Where the Procuring Agency knows about the main features, usage and output of the products; however not clear about the complete features, technical specifications and functionalities of the goods to be procured and requires the bidders to submit their proposals defining those features, specifications and functionalities; or
2. Where the Procuring Agency, in addition to the mandatory requirements and mandatory technical specifications, requires parameters specified in Evaluation Criteria to be evaluated while determining the quality of the goods.

31.4 In such cases, the Procuring Agency may allocate certain weightage to these factors as a part of Evaluation Criteria, and may determine the ranking of the bidders on the basis of combined evaluation in accordance with provisions of Rule 2(1)(h) of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

32. Abnormally Low Financial Bids

32.1 Where the Bid price is considered to be abnormally low, the Procuring Agency shall perform price analysis either during determination of Successful Bids or as a part of the post-qualification process.

32.2 The Procuring Agency may reject an Abnormally low financial bids.

32.3 In order to identify the Abnormally Low Bids (ALB) following approaches can be considered to minimize the scope of subjectivity:

1. Comparing the Bids price with the cost estimate;
2. Comparing the Bids price with the Bids offered by other Bidders submitting substantially responsive Bids; and
3. Comparing the Bids price with prices paid in similar contracts in the recent past either government- or development partner-funded.

32.4 The Procuring Agency will determine to its satisfaction whether the Bidder that is selected as having submitted the successful bid is qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily.

32.5 The determination will take into account the Bidder's financial, technical, and production capabilities. It will be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications submitted by the Bidder, as well as such other information as the Procuring Agency deems necessary and appropriate. Factors not included in these Bidding documents shall not be used in the evaluation of the Bidders' qualifications.

32.6 Procuring Agency may seek "Certificate for Independent Price Determination" from the Bidder and the results of reference checks may be used in determining an award of contract.

Explanation: The Certificate shall be furnished by the Bidder. The Bidder shall certify that the price is determined keeping in view of all the essential aspects such as raw material, its processing, value addition, optimization of resources due to economy of scale, transportation, insurance and margin of profit etc.

32.7 An affirmative determination will be a prerequisite for award of the contract to the Bidder. A negative determination will result in rejection of the Bidder's Bids, in which event the Procuring Agency will proceed to the next ranked Bidder to make a similar determination of that Bidder's capabilities to

perform satisfactorily.

F. Award of Contract

33. Criteria of Award

33.1 The Procuring Agency will award the Contract to the Bidder whose Bids has been determined to be substantially responsive to the Bidding documents and who has been declared as Most Advantageous Bidder.

34. Negotiations

34.1 The procuring agency shall not engage in negotiations with respect to scope and price with the bidder except when the procuring agency conducts a procurement using direct **or negotiated** contracting or a request for proposals with evaluation based on quality alone.

34.2 The procuring agency may negotiate with the most advantageous bid with a view to streamline the work or task execution, at the time of contract finalization on methodology, work plan, staffing, finalizing payment arrangements, delivery arrangements, minor amendments to the special conditions of the contract.

35. Procuring Agency Right to reject all bids

35.1 The Procuring Agency reserves the right to reject all bids or proposals at any time prior to the issuance of the Letter of Award, without incurring any liability, in accordance with Rule 33 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

36. Procuring Agency's Right to Vary Quantities at the Time of Award

36.1 The Procuring Agency reserves the right at the time of contract award to increase or decrease the **quantity of** Goods originally specified in these Bidding documents provided this does not exceed **by** 15%, without any change in unit price or other terms and conditions of the Bids and Bidding documents.

37. Notification of Award

37.1 Prior to the award of contract, the procuring agency shall announce and publish the result of bid evaluation on **EPADS v2.0** in accordance with Rule 35

of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

37.2 The Bidder whose Bids has been accepted will be notified of the award by the Procuring Agency prior to expiration of the Bids/Bid Validity period. The Letter of Award will state the sum that the Procuring Agency will pay the successful Bidder in consideration for the delivery of Goods as prescribed by the Contract (hereinafter and in the Contract called the "Contract Price).

37.3 The Letter of award will constitute the formation of the Contract, subject to the Bidder furnishing the Performance Guarantee and signing of the contract.

38. Signing of Contract

38.1 Promptly after issuance of Letter of award, Procuring Agency shall send the successful Bidder the draft Contract, incorporating all terms and conditions as agreed by the parties to the contract.

38.2 Immediately after the Redressal of grievance by the GRC (if any), mandatory standstill period in accordance with Rule 35 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 and **after fulfillment of all condition's precedent** of the Contract Form, the successful Bidder and the Procuring Agency shall sign the Contract.

39. Corrupt & Fraudulent Practices

39.1 Procuring Agencies (including beneficiaries of Government funded projects and procurement) as well as Bidders/Contractors under Government financed contracts, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts, and will avoid to engage in any corrupt and fraudulent practices.

F. Grievance Redressal & Complaint Review Mechanism

40. Constitution of Grievance Redressal

40.1 The Grievance Redressal Committee shall address the grievance, if any submitted by any party, including the bidder, in accordance with Rule 48 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 to be read with Redressal of Grievances Regulations, 2021.

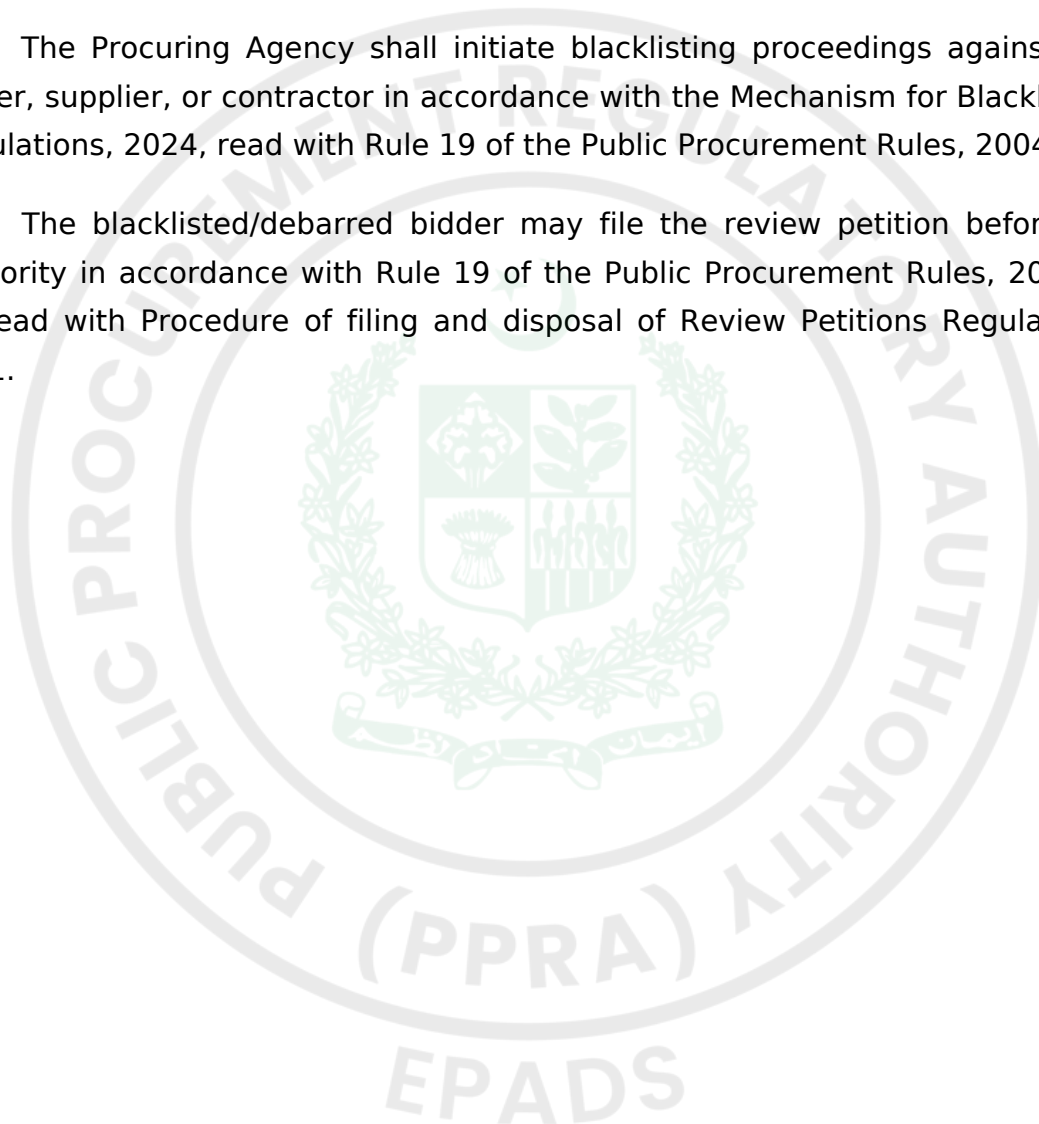
40.2 In case if any party or the bidder is not satisfied with the decision of the GRC or if it fails to decide within ten days, the bidder or the party may file an appeal before the Appellate Committee of the Authority in accordance with Rule 48 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 to be read with Redressal of Grievances Regulations, 2021.

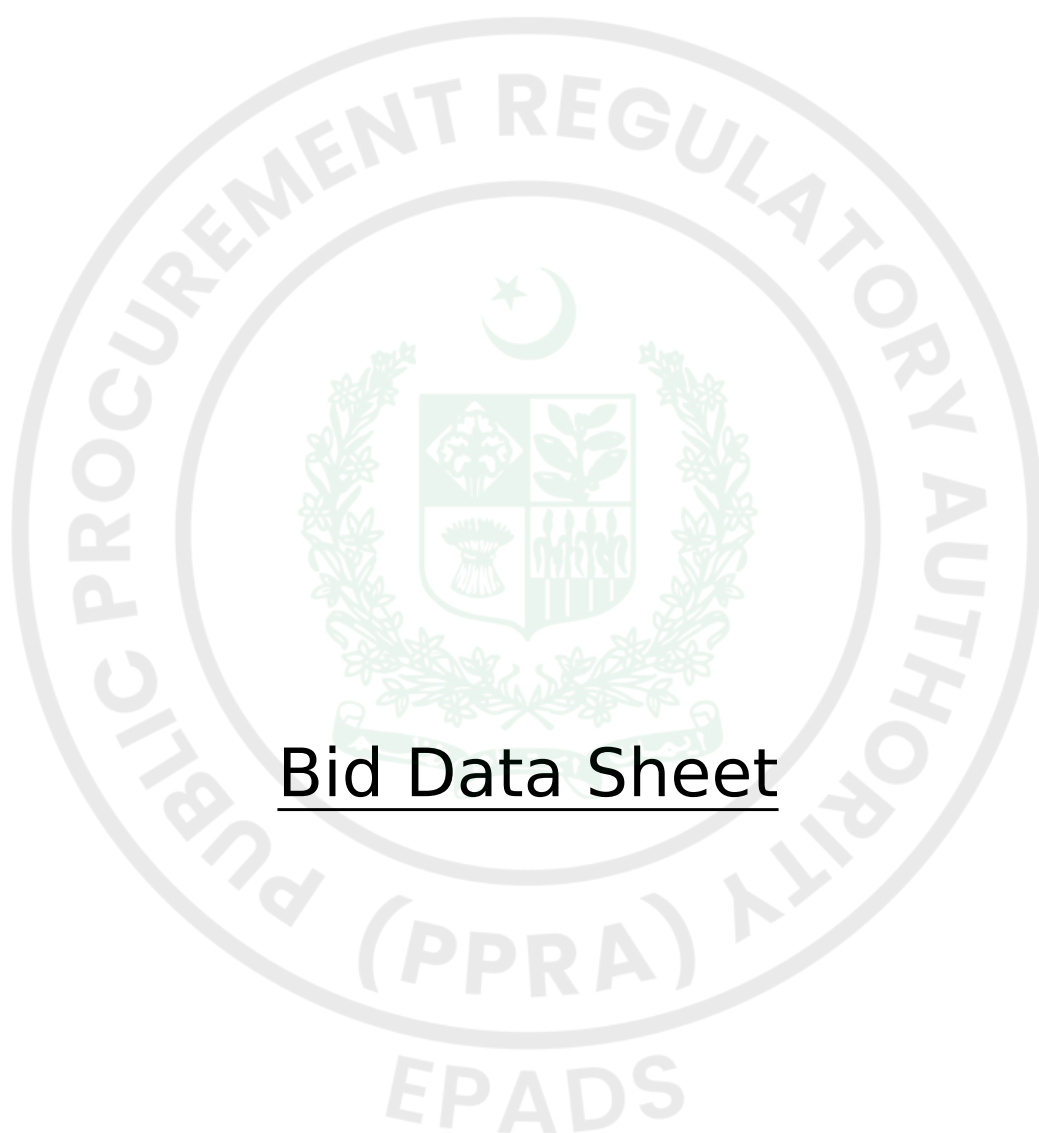
G. Mechanism of Blacklisting

General Conditions of Contract

A. General

1. Definitions

1.1 Unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms whenever used in this Contract shall have the same meaning and shall be interpreted as indicated

 - b. any authority, corporation, body or organization established by or under a Law or which is owned or controlled by the Government;
- c. "The Contract" means an agreement enforceable by law;
- d. "The Contract Price" means the price payable to the Bidder under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations;
- e. "Ancillary Services" means those services ancillary to the provision of Goods, such as transportation and insurance, and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, and other such obligations of the Bidder covered under the Contract;
- f. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract contained in this section;
- g. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract by which the GCC may be amended or supplemented;
- h. "Day" means calendar day unless indicated otherwise.
- i. "Effective Date" means the date on which this Contract comes into force and effect.
- j. "The Bidder" means the individual or corporate body whose Bids to provide the Goods has been accepted by the Procuring Agency;
- k. "The Project Site," where applicable, means the place or places named in Bids Data Sheet and technical Specifications;
- l. "Government" means the Government of Pakistan;
- m. "Subcontractor" means any entity to which the Bidder subcontracts any part of the Goods.
- n. "Service" means any object of procurement other than goods or works;
- o. "Party" means the Procuring Agency or the Bidder, as the case may be, and "Parties" means both of them;
- p. "Foreign Currency" means any currency other than the currency of the country of the Procuring Agency;

q. "Completion Date" means the date of completion of the contract by the Bidder as certified by the Procuring Agency;

r. "In Writing" means communicated in written form with proof of receipt;

s. "Local Currency" means the currency of Pakistan;

2. Application and Interpretation

2.1 These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not superseded by provisions of other parts of the Contract.

2.2 In interpreting these Conditions of Contract headings and marginal notes are used for convenience only and shall not affect their interpretations unless specifically stated; references to singular include the plural and vice versa; and masculine include the feminine. Words have their ordinary meaning under the language of the Contract unless specifically defined.

3. Applicable Law

3.1 The contract shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of Pakistan, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

4. Governing Language

4.1 The Contract as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Contract exchanged between the Bidder and the Procuring Agency, shall be written in the **English language** unless otherwise stated in the **SCC**. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Contract may be in another language provided these are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Contract, this translation shall govern.

5. Notices

5.1 Any notice, request, or consent made pursuant to this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been made when delivered in person to an authorized representative of the Party to whom the communication is addressed, or when sent by registered mail, telex, telegram, or facsimile to such Party at the address specified in the **SCC**.

6. Delivery/Location

6.1 The Goods shall be delivered to such locations as the Procuring Agency may approve and as specified in **SCC**.

7. Authorized Representatives / Authority of Member in charge

7.1 Any action required or permitted to be taken, and any document required or permitted to be executed, under this Contract by the Procuring Agency or the Bidder may be taken or executed by the officials specified in the **SCC**.

B. Commencement, Completion, Modification, and Termination of Contract

8. Effectiveness of Contract

8.1 This Contract shall come into effect on the date the Contract is signed by both parties and such other later date as may be stated in the **SCC**.

9. Commencement of Services

9.1 The Bidder shall confirm availability of Key Experts and begin carrying out the Services not later than the number of days after the Effective Date specified in the SCC.

10. Program

10.1 Before commencement of the Services, the Bidder shall submit to the Procuring Agency for approval a Program showing the general methods, arrangements, order and timing for all activities. The Services shall be carried out in accordance with the approved Program as updated.

11. Starting Date/Expiration Date

11.1 The Bidder shall start carrying out the Services Five (05) days after the date the Contract becomes effective, or at such other date as may be specified in the SCC.

11.2 Unless terminated earlier pursuant to Clause **GCC 15** hereof, this Contract shall expire at the end of such time period after the Effective Date as specified in the SCC.

12. Entire Agreement

12.1 This Contract contains all covenants, stipulations and provisions agreed by the Parties. No agent or representative of either Party has authority to make, and the Parties shall not be bound by or be liable for, any statement, representation, promise or agreement not set forth herein.

13. Modification

13.1 Any modification or variation of the terms and conditions of this Contract, including any modification or variation of the scope of the Services, may only be made by written agreement between the Parties. However, each Party shall give due consideration to any Bids for modification or variation made by the other Party.

13.2 In cases of any modifications or variations, the prior written consent of the Procuring Agency is required.

14. Force Majeure

14.1 Definition

For the purposes of this Contract, “Force Majeure” means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a Party and which makes a Party’s performance of its obligations under the Contract impossible or so impractical as to be considered impossible under the circumstances.

14.2 No Breach of Contract

The failure of a Party to fulfill any of its obligations under the contract shall not be considered to be a breach of, or default under, this Contract in so far as such inability arises from an event of Force Majeure, provided that the Party affected by such an event (a) has taken all reasonable precautions, due care and reasonable alternative measures in order to carry out the terms and conditions of this Contract, and (b) has informed the other Party as soon as possible about the occurrence of such an event.

14.3 Extension of Time

Any period within which a Party shall, pursuant to this Contract, complete any action or task, shall be extended for a period equal to the time during which such Party was unable to perform such action as a result

of Force Majeure.

14.4 Payments

During the period of their inability to perform the Services as a result of an event of Force Majeure, the Bidder shall be entitled to continue to be paid under the terms of this Contract, as well as to be reimbursed for additional costs reasonably and necessarily incurred by them during such period for the purposes of the Services and in reactivating the Service after the end of such period.

15. Termination

15.1 By the Procuring Agency

The Procuring Agency may terminate this Contract in case of the occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraphs (a) through (e) of this Clause. In such an occurrence the Procuring Agency shall give at least thirty (30) calendar days' written notice of termination to the Bidder in case of the events referred to in (a) through (d); at least sixty (60) calendar days' written notice in case of the event referred to in (e);

- a. If the Bidder fails to remedy a failure in the performance of its obligations hereunder, as specified in a notice of suspension;
- b. If the Bidder becomes (or, if the Bidder consists of more than one entity, if any of its members becomes) insolvent or bankrupt or enter into any agreements with their creditors for relief of debt or take advantage of any law for the benefit of debtors or go into liquidation or receivership whether compulsory or voluntary;
- c. If the Bidder fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of arbitration proceedings;
- d. If, as the result of Force Majeure, the Bidder is unable to perform a material portion of the Services for a period of not less than sixty (60) calendar days;
- e. If the Procuring Agency, in its sole discretion and for any reason whatsoever, decides to terminate this Contract;

15.2 By the Bidder

The Bidder may terminate this Contract, by not less than thirty (30) calendar days' written notice to the Procuring Agency, in case of the occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraphs (a) through (d) of this Clause.

- a. If the Procuring Agency fails to pay any money due to the Bidder pursuant to this Contract and not subject to dispute within forty-five (45) calendar days after receiving written notice from the Bidder that such payment is overdue.
- b. If, as the result of Force Majeure, the Bidder is unable to perform a material portion of the Services for a period of not less than sixty (60) calendar days.
- c. If the Procuring Agency fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of arbitration.
- d. If the Procuring Agency is in material breach of its obligations pursuant to this Contract and has not remedied the same within forty-five (45) days (or such longer period as the Bidder may have subsequently approved in writing) following the receipt by the Procuring Agency of the Bidder's notice specifying such breach.

C. Obligations of the Bidder

16. General

16.1 Standard of Performance

1. The Bidder shall deliver the product and carry out the Services with all due diligence, efficiency and economy, in accordance with generally accepted professional standards and practices, and shall observe sound management practices, and employ appropriate technology and safe and effective equipment, machinery, materials and methods. The Bidder shall always act, in respect of any matter relating to this Contract or to the Services, as a faithful adviser to the Procuring Agency, and shall at all times support and safeguard the Procuring Agency's legitimate interests in any dealings with the third parties.

16.2 Law Applicable to Goods

The Bidder shall deliver the goods in accordance with the Contract and in accordance with the Law of Pakistan and shall take all practicable steps to ensure that any of its Experts and Sub-Bidders, comply with the Applicable Law.

17. Conflict of Interests

17.1 Bidder Not to Benefit from Commissions and Discounts.

The remuneration of the Bidder shall constitute the Bidder's sole remuneration in connection with this Contract or the Services, and the Bidder shall not accept for their own benefit any trade commission, discount, or similar payment in connection with activities pursuant to this Contract or to the Services or in the discharge of their obligations under the Contract, and the Bidder shall use their best efforts to ensure that the Personnel, any Subcontractors, and agents of either of them similarly shall not receive any such additional remuneration.

17.2 Bidder and Affiliates Not to be Otherwise Interested in Project

The Bidder agree that, during the term of this Contract and after its termination, the Bidder and its affiliates, as well as any Subcontractor and any of its affiliates, shall be disqualified from providing Goods for any project resulting from or closely related to the Services.

17.3 Prohibition of Conflicting Activities

Neither the Bidder nor its Subcontractors nor the Personnel shall engage, either directly or indirectly, in any of the following activities:

- a. during the term of this Contract, any business or professional activities in the Government's country which would conflict with the activities assigned to them under this Contract;
- b. during the term of this Contract, neither the Bidder nor their Subcontractors shall hire public employees in active duty or on any type of leave, to perform any activity under this Contract;

18. Confidentiality

18.1 Except with the prior written consent of the Procuring Agency, the Bidder and the Experts shall not at any time communicate to any person or entity any confidential information acquired in the course of the contract.

19. Insurance to be Taken Out by the Bidder

19.1 The Bidder(a) shall take out and maintain, and shall cause any Subcontractors to take out and maintain, at its (or the Subcontractors', as the case may be) own cost but on terms and conditions approved by the Procuring Agency, insurance against the risks, loss or damage, and for the coverage, as shall be specified in the SCC; and (b) at the Procuring Agency's request, shall provide evidence to the Procuring Agency showing that such insurance has been taken out and maintained and that the current premiums have been paid.

20. Bidder's Actions Requiring Procuring Agency's Prior Approval

20.1 The Bidder shall obtain the Procuring Agency's prior approval in writing before taking any of the following actions:

- (a) appointing such members of the Personnel not provided by the Bidder;
- (b) changing the Program of activities; and
- (c) any other action that may be specified in the SCC.

21. Reporting Obligations

21.1 The Bidder shall submit to the Procuring Agency the reports and documents in the numbers, and within the periods as prescribed by the Procuring Agency.

22. Liquidated Damages

22.1 If the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods or to perform the Services within the period(s) specified in the Contract, the Procuring Agency shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the Contract, deduct from the Contract Price, as liquidated damages, a sum equivalent to the percentage specified in SCC of the delivered price of the delayed Goods or unperformed Services for each week or part thereof of delay until actual delivery or performance, up to a maximum deduction of the performance security (or guarantee) specified in SCC. Once the said maximum is reached, the Procuring Agency may consider termination of the Contract pursuant to **GCC Clause 15**.

22.2 Correction for Over-payment

If the Intended Completion Date is extended after liquidated damages have been paid, the Procuring Agency shall correct any overpayment of liquidated damages by the Bidder by adjusting the next payment certificate. The Bidder shall be paid interest on the overpayment, calculated from the date of payment to the date of repayment, at the rates specified in SCC.

22.3 Lack of performance penalty

If the Bidder has not corrected a Defect within the time specified in the Procuring Agency's notice, a penalty for Lack of performance will be paid by the Bidder. The amount to be paid will be calculated as a percentage of the cost of having the Defect corrected, assessed as specified in the SCC.

23. Performance Guarantee

23.1 Within Seven (07) days from the issuance of acceptance letter from the Procuring Agency, the successful Bidder shall furnish the Performance Guarantee in shape of ----- at the discretion of the PA in the amount **specified in SCC**. In case the amount of Bids security is equal or greater than

23.2 The proceeds of the Performance Guarantee shall be payable to the Procuring agency as compensation for any loss resulting from the Supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract.

23.3 The Performance Guarantee shall be denominated in the currency of the Contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the Procuring agency and shall be in the acceptable form as specified in SCC.

23.4 The Performance Guarantee will be discharged by the Procuring agency and returned to the Supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the Supplier's performance obligations under the Contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise **specified in SCC**.

24. Fraud and Corruption

24.1 The Procuring Agency requires the Supplier to disclose any commissions or fees that may have been paid or are to be paid to agents or any other party with respect to the Bidding process or execution of the Contract. The information disclosed must include at least the name and address of the agent or other party, the amount and currency, and the purpose of the commission, gratuity or fee.

25. Sustainable Procurement

25.1 The Bidder shall conform to the sustainable procurement contractual provisions, if and as specified in the SCC.

D. Bidder's Personnel

26. Description of Personnel

26.1 The titles, agreed job descriptions, minimum qualifications, and estimated periods of engagement in the carrying out of the Services of the Bidder's Key Personnel. The Key Personnel listed by title as well as by name are hereby approved by the Procuring Agency.

27. Removal and/or Replacement of Personnel

27.1 Except as the Procuring Agency may otherwise agree, no changes shall be made in the Key Personnel. If, for any reason beyond the reasonable control of the Bidder, it becomes necessary to replace any of the Key Personnel, the Bidder shall provide as a replacement a person of equivalent or better qualifications.

27.2 If the Procuring Agency finds that any of the Personnel have (i) committed serious misconduct or have been charged with having committed a criminal action, or (ii) have reasonable cause to be dissatisfied with the performance of any of the Personnel, then the Bidder shall, at the Procuring Agency's written request specifying the grounds thereof, provide as a replacement a person with qualifications and experience acceptable to the Procuring Agency.

27.3 The Bidder shall have no claim for additional costs arising out of or incidental to any removal and/or replacement of Personnel.

E. Obligations of the Procuring Agency

28. Assistance and Exemptions

28.1 The Procuring Agency shall use its best efforts to ensure that the Government shall provide the Bidder such assistance and exemptions as specified in the SCC.

29. Change in the Applicable Law

29.1 If, after the date of this Contract, there is any change in the Applicable Law with respect to taxes and duties which increases or decreases the cost of the related Services rendered by the Bidder, then the remuneration and reimbursable expenses otherwise payable to the Bidder under this Contract shall be increased or decreased accordingly by agreement between the Parties, and corresponding adjustments shall be made to the amounts referred in the SCC.

30. Services and Facilities

30.1 The Procuring Agency shall make available to the Bidder and the Experts, for the purposes of the Services and free of any charge, the services, facilities and property described , at the times and in the manner specified in the SCC or terms of reference.

30.2 In case that such services, facilities and property shall not be made available to the Bidder, the Parties shall agree on (i) any time extension that it may be appropriate to grant to the Bidder for the performance of the Services, (ii) the manner in which the Bidder shall procure any such services, facilities and property from other sources, and (iii) the additional payments, if any, to be made to the Bidder as a result thereof.

F. Payments to the Bidder

31. Contract Price

31.1 The price payable shall be in Pakistani Rupees unless otherwise specified in the SCC. Prices charged by the Supplier for Goods delivered under the Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its Bid.

32. Terms and Conditions of Payment

32.1 Payments will be made to the Bidder according to the payment schedule stated in the SCC and as per actual invoice submitted by the Bidder.

32.2 Unless otherwise stated in the SCC, the advance payment shall be made against the provision by the Bidder of a bank guarantee for the same amount, and shall be valid for the period stated in the SCC. Any other payment shall be made after the conditions listed in the SCC for such payment have been met, and the Bidder have submitted an invoice to the Procuring Agency specifying the amount due.

33. Currency of Payment

33.1 Any payment under this Contract shall be made in the currency(ies) specified in the SCC.

G. Quality Control

34. Identifying Defects

34.1 The principle and modalities of Inspection of the Goods by the Procuring Agency shall be as indicated in the SCC. The Procuring Agency shall check the Bidder's performance and notify him of any Defects that are found. Such checking shall not affect the Bidder's responsibilities. The Procuring Agency may instruct the Bidder to search for a Defect and to uncover and test any service that the Procuring Agency considers may have a Defect. Defect Liability Period is as defined in the SCC.

35. Correction of Defects, and

Lack of Performance Penalty

35.1 The Procuring Agency shall give notice to the Bidder of any Defects before the end of the Contract. The Defects liability period shall be extended for as long as Defects remain to be corrected.

35.2 Every time notice a Defect is given, the Bidder shall correct the notified Defect within the length of time specified by the Procuring Agency's notice.

35.3 If the Bidder has not corrected a Defect within the time specified in the Procuring Agency's notice, the Procuring Agency will assess the cost of having the Defect corrected, the Bidder will pay this amount, and a Penalty for Lack of Performance.

36. Taxes and Duties

36.1 A Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted Goods to the Procuring Agency.

H. Settlement of Disputes

37. Alternate Dispute Resolution

37.1 The disputes between the parties to the contract may be settled in accordance with Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

37.2 The procuring agency shall refer the matter to the Chief Justice Islamabad High Court or Managing Director PPRA or the Secretary Ministry of Law & Justice for appointment of Arbitrator.

37.3 The fee for the Arbitrator shall be specified in Pak Rupees as determined by the appointing authority which shall be borne and shared equally by the contracting parties.

The cost of the mediation and arbitration shall be shared by the parties in equal proportion however the both parties shall bear their own costs and lawyer's fees regarding their own participation in the mediation and arbitration. However, the Arbitrator may make an award of costs upon the conclusion of the arbitration making any party to the dispute liable to pay the costs of another party to the dispute.

v. Arbitration proceedings as mentioned in the above clause regarding resolution of disputes may be commenced prior to, during or after completion of the contract.

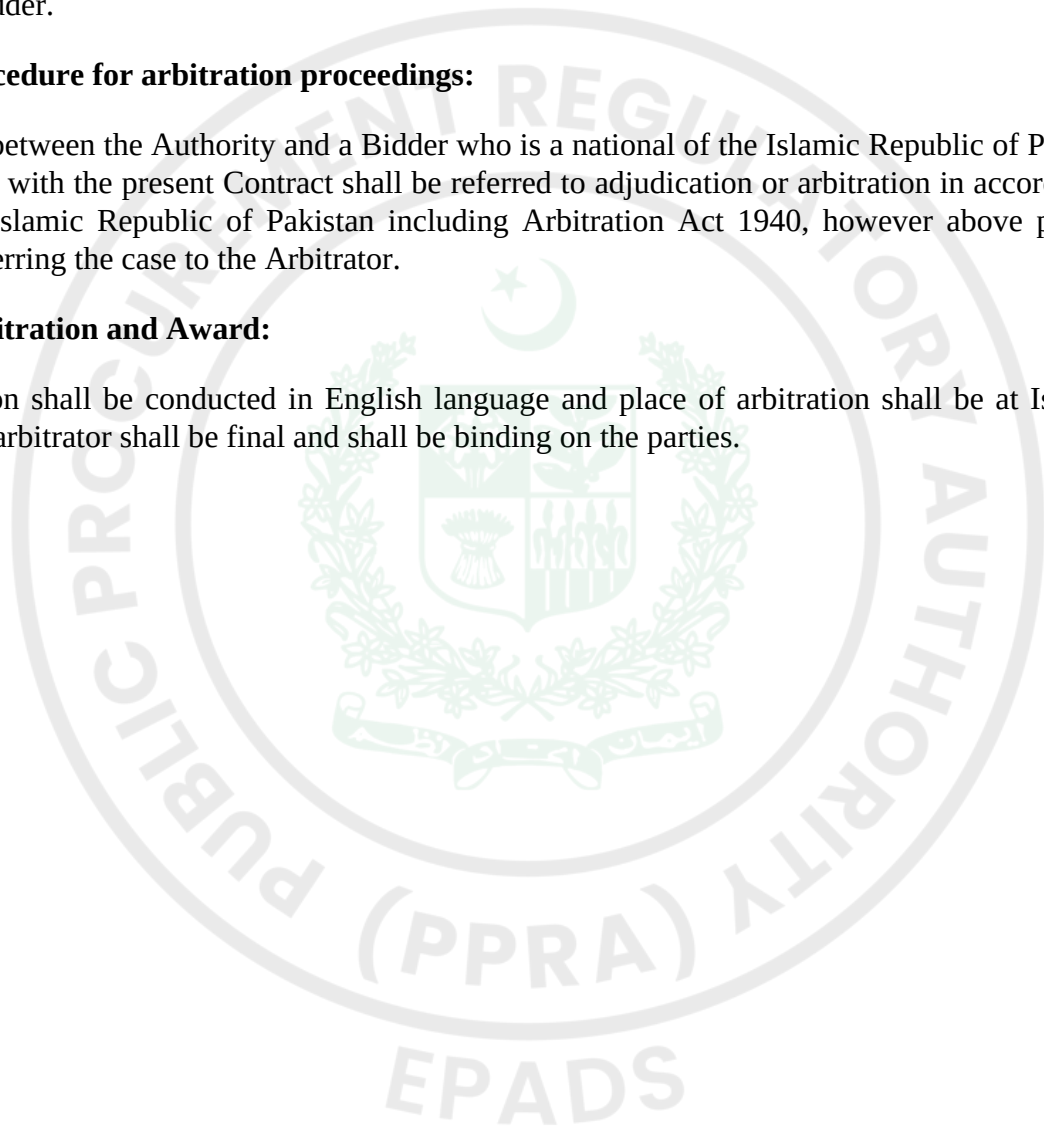

1. Purpose of RFP

This RFP solicits bids for the supply, licensing, and infrastructure implementation of a production-ready Modern Data Platform, deployed strictly on on-premises infrastructure. The Platform shall serve as the Central Data Hub, the permanent intelligence backbone for data-driven, intelligence-led tax administration at national scale. This RFP covers hardware supply, software licensing, and infrastructure commissioning; application-level configuration, data pipeline build, and platform go-live are covered under a separately contracted Data Platform & Application Implementation Services engagement, coordinated per Section 19 (Vendor Coordination & Interface Management).

Current systems are optimized for transaction recording and filing processing. They do not support economic behavior analysis, compliance risk prediction, or enforcement optimization. The Central Data Hub shall close this gap by establishing an integrated, governed, and auditable data foundation across all tax domains.

The following components shall be supplied and licensed in their entirety, with the underlying infrastructure installed and commissioned by the Vendor:

- On-premises compute, storage, and networking hardware.
- Enterprise ELT pipeline tool license, with schema enforcement and data quality control capabilities.
- Distributed S3-compatible object storage software license, constituting the Lakehouse foundation.
- A distributed compute cluster (hardware and software license) for AI/ML workloads and micro-batch streaming; the Vendor shall propose the technology stack for real-time data processing.
- Massively Parallel Processing (MPP) Enterprise Data Warehouse license, with native object storage connectivity.
- High-availability in-memory caching cluster (hardware and software license) for low-latency operational queries.
- All associated commercial and open-source software licenses required to operate the complete Platform.
- A Data Governance Tool license.

The Platform shall be architected to AI-ready standards, including a Feature Store and semantic layer, to support integration of AI components under future procurement instruments.

1.1 Compliance and Vendor Accountability

- The selected Vendor shall assume single-point accountability for hardware provisioning, software licensing and installation, infrastructure commissioning, infrastructure acceptance testing, and structured knowledge transfer of the infrastructure environment to PRAL's Data and Operations team.
- Infrastructure Acceptance, as defined in Section 7 (Infrastructure Implementation & Commissioning), shall be achieved upon project completion, at which point the environment shall be ready for the separately contracted Implementation Vendor to commence data platform and application implementation.

2. Project Scoping & General Obligations

2.1 In Scope

- Supply and provisioning of all on-premises hardware including compute, storage, and networking infrastructure for entire solution.
- Supply of all commercial and open-source software licenses required to operate the complete platform for the full contract duration; no component shall be left unlicensed or subject to separate procurement.
- Installation, configuration, and commissioning of all supplied hardware and infrastructure components (compute, storage, and networking) up to the point of Infrastructure Acceptance, in accordance with Section 7 (Infrastructure Implementation & Commissioning).

2.2 Out of Scope

- Modifications, upgrades, or patches to any FBR/PRAL source system, including IRIS, eFBR, RegSys, TAMS, and VAT; source systems shall be consumed as-is.
- Development or modification of any FBR transactional or operational application.
- Procurement or setup of end-user devices, workstations, or operator terminals.
- Any data processing, storage, or transmission outside on-premises network perimeter.
- Data platform and application-layer implementation, including ELT/ETL pipeline development, data governance configuration, BI/AI-ML implementation, and any activity beyond Infrastructure Acceptance; these are covered under the separately contracted Data Platform & Application Implementation Services engagement

2.3 General Obligations

- The awarded Vendor shall assume full responsibility for the completeness, quality, and functional readiness of all hardware, software licensing, and infrastructure commissioning deliverables under this contract. Partial or component-only delivery shall not be accepted, and infrastructure performance shortfalls shall not be attributed to factors outside the Vendor's supplied scope.
- All hardware and infrastructure delivered under this contract shall operate exclusively within the designated on-premises network perimeter, and no data shall be transmitted, stored, or processed outside that boundary at any point.
- The Vendor shall coordinate infrastructure delivery and commissioning timelines with the separately contracted Data Platform & Application Implementation Services Vendor, in accordance with Section 19 (Vendor Coordination & Interface Management), to ensure Infrastructure Acceptance is achieved without delay to downstream implementation activities.

3. Business Goals

The objective of this procurement is to establish a robust, secure, and scalable on-premises hardware, software licensing, and infrastructure foundation for the Central Data Hub (CDH), enabling FBR and PRAL's subsequent transition to a data-driven, intelligence-led, and AI-enabled tax administration ecosystem under a separately contracted Data Platform & Application Implementation Services engagement.

This procurement shall deliver the following foundational capabilities:

- **Infrastructure Capacity & Scalability:** compute, storage, and networking infrastructure sized and licensed to support national-scale data volumes and concurrent workloads, with capacity for onboarding future sources and domains through configuration alone, without structural hardware changes.
- **Software Licensing Completeness:** all commercial and open-source software licenses required to operate the complete Platform for the full contract duration, with no component left unlicensed or subject to separate future procurement.
- **Infrastructure Security & Compliance:** hardware- and OS-level security controls (encryption at rest, network segmentation, access control) implemented in compliance with applicable regulatory and legal requirements, forming the secure foundation on which platform-level governance controls (RBAC, PII masking, audit logging) will subsequently operate.
- **High Availability & Resilience:** infrastructure architected for high availability, redundancy, and disaster recovery consistent with the reference architecture (Section 5.2) and sizing requirements (Section 6).

- **Infrastructure Readiness for Platform:** infrastructure installed, configured, and commissioned to a state of Infrastructure Acceptance (Section 7), enabling the separately contracted Implementation Vendor to commence data platform and application build activities without infrastructure-related delay.
- **Technology Refresh & Long-Term Viability:** a Vendor-delivered technology refresh roadmap covering the full warranty period, ensuring the infrastructure and licensed software remain supportable and extensible as CDH usage scales.

4.Success Criteria

The success of this procurement shall be measured against the following outcomes:

Infrastructure Delivery & Commissioning

- All hardware and software components delivered, installed, and commissioned per the approved Bill of Materials and the sizing specifications defined in Section 6.
- Infrastructure Acceptance achieved within the committed project timeline, with no critical or major defects outstanding at sign-off.

Licensing Completeness

- 100% of required commercial and open-source software licensed for the full contract duration; zero components left unlicensed or requiring separate future procurement.

Security & Compliance

- Hardware- and OS-level security baseline (encryption at rest, network segmentation, access control, directory service integration) implemented and validated.
- Zero tolerance for infrastructure-level data leakage; all infrastructure operating exclusively within the designated on-premises perimeter.

Availability & Performance

- Infrastructure availability and performance (network throughput, latency, HA failover) validated against the targets defined in Section 8 (Performance & Scalability) and Section 10 (HA, Backup & Disaster Recovery).
- Infrastructure sized and validated to sustain the workloads and concurrency levels defined in Section 6, without requiring re-architecture for at least the five-year sizing horizon.

Scalability & Future Readiness

- Modular infrastructure capable of onboarding additional compute and storage capacity through configuration alone, without structural changes or service interruption.
- A Vendor-delivered technology refresh roadmap in place, covering the full warranty period, identifying planned upgrades, end-of-life component replacements, and recommended evolution paths for all major infrastructure components.

Handover Readiness

- Structured knowledge transfer of the infrastructure environment completed to PRAL's Data and Operations team.
- Infrastructure documentation (as-built diagrams, runbooks, configuration records) delivered and accepted.

5.Functional and Technical Requirements

This section contains the Functional and Technical requirements that would enable the vendors to design the proposed solution.

5.1 As-Is Architecture

The current data ecosystem at FBR primarily comprises of two database systems. These are:

- Microsoft SQL Server
- Oracle Exadata

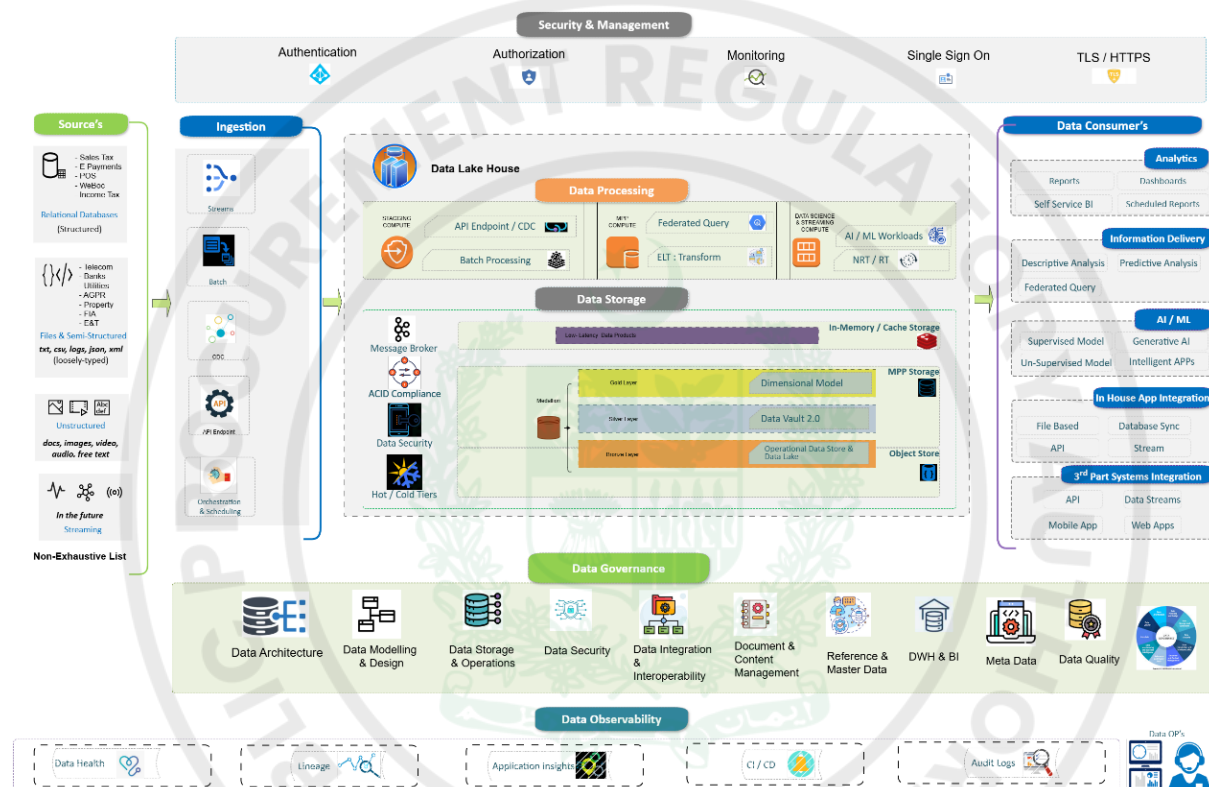
The SQL Server is a legacy system which was developed to serve the initial set of FBR applications. The web applications transactional data was stored in this instance. Apart from storing and serving the applications, the SQL Server also serves as an ODS (Operational Data Store) for downstream BI & Reporting. There is no proper Enterprise Datawarehouse construct for analytical reporting. Once all the data is collected in the ODS, it serves downstream dashboards, reports and replicated to Oracle Exadata ODS.

The Oracle Exadata serves the latest set of FBR applications like IRIS is also a transactional system. It is one appliance which is partitioned into three DB instances (Transactional System for IRIS, ODS & FBRDWH). Just like the SQL Server, the ODS in Oracle Exadata collects the replicated data from the Oracle Transactional tables and further serves it downstream for BI & reporting. The third DB instance FBRDWH is not a proper Datawarehouse but only serves Data Marts. In summary FBR today does not have a proper Enterprise Datawarehouse that can be used for Analytical reporting.

In this RFP, one of the primary requirements is to set up a comprehensive Modern Data Platform that ingests data from the SQL Server, Oracle transactional systems, Third Party, Commercial Projects and a non-exhaustive list of data sources. We will not use the existing ODS instances both SQL Server & Oracle as data sources.

Please see Annexure A listing data sources that will need to be ingested.

5.2 Proposed Reference Architecture



Data Sources

The architecture supports three categories of source data. Structured data comes from relational databases connected to operational systems like sales tax, e-payments, POS, and income tax. Semi-structured and unstructured data includes files, logs, JSON, XML, documents, images, audio, and free text. There's also a forward-looking "In the future" streaming category, covering IoT and real-time event sources.

Data Ingestion

Four ingestion patterns are supported. Streaming handles real-time data flows. Batch covers bulk periodic loads. CDC (Change Data Capture) tracks database changes incrementally. Consumption from API endpoints. Scheduling and Orchestration coordinate and automate the pipelines.

Data Processing

The Data Lakehouse houses three processing layers. The Staging Compute layer handles API-based data processing, CDC transformations, and batch processing. The MPP (Massively Parallel Processing) Compute layer supports Federated Queries and ELT transformations. Lastly compute clusters for AI/ML workloads, near real-time and real-time data processing.

Data Storage

"Storage is organized into three tiers. The Object Store (Bronze Layer) holds raw operational data and Data Lake files in open file and open table formats. The Silver Layer stores curated data using a structured, auditable modeling approach. The Gold Layer contains the Dimensional Model for analytics-ready consumption. Supporting this are an MPP Storage engine, In-Memory/Cache Storage for low-latency data products, and a Message Broker for event streaming.

Data Governance

This layer spans the full data lifecycle across ten domains: Data Architecture, Data Modelling & Design, Data Storage & Operations, Data Security, Data Integration & Interoperability, Document & Content Management, Reference & Master Data, DWH & BI, Metadata management, and Data Quality. This ensures consistency, compliance, and trustworthiness across all data assets.

Data Consumers

The right-hand side of the architecture represents all downstream users and systems. The Analytics layer serves reports, dashboards, self-service BI, and scheduled reports. Information Delivery supports descriptive and predictive analysis as well as federated queries. The AI/ML layer enables supervised and unsupervised models, generative AI, and intelligent applications. In-House App Integration covers file-based, database sync, API, and stream-based connectivity. Third-Party Systems Integration extends reach through APIs, data streams, mobile apps, and web apps.

Security & Management

A cross-cutting layer that spans the entire architecture. Authentication integration with on-premises Active Directory and LDAP. Vendor should propose components for Authorization and Data Access Policy Enforcement. Monitoring to be powered by SIEM tools. Single Sign-On is a requirement managed through an Identity Provider. All data in transit is protected via TLS (v1.3/HTTPS).

Data Observability

Provides end-to-end visibility across the platform. Data Health monitoring tracks pipeline and dataset quality. Lineage maps data origin and transformations. Application Insights monitors runtime behavior. CI/CD pipelines automate deployment and testing. Audit Logs capture access and change history for compliance.

Data Ops

Represented at the bottom-right of the observability layer, DataOps bridges the technical and operational aspects of the platform. It involves dedicated operations personnel who monitor pipeline health, manage incidents, coordinate deployments via CI/CD, and ensure SLA adherence across ingestion, processing, and storage layers. They work in close coordination with the observability tooling to maintain reliability and data trust across the entire ecosystem.

API Framework

The CDH shall incorporate a bidirectional, centrally managed API Framework that governs both inbound data ingestion via APIs and outbound data serving to internal and external consumers. This framework is a first-class platform component and must be designed, implemented, and governed as part of the core architecture.

Inbound API Integration (Data Ingestion)

- Support for REST, SOAP, GraphQL, and webhook-based API connections for ingesting data from source systems and external data providers.
- Configurable API connectors with scheduled, event-triggered, and real-time polling modes - manageable without bespoke development per source.
- Secure credential management, token rotation, and OAuth 2.0 / API key authentication for all inbound connections.
- Automatic schema detection, payload validation, and error handling with dead-letter queue management for failed API calls.
- Rate limiting, throttling controls, and retry logic to protect source systems from overload during ingestion.
- Full lineage tracking for all API-ingested data - origin endpoint, ingestion timestamp, payload version, and transformation history maintained end-to-end.

Outbound API Services (Data Serving)

- A managed API gateway layer enabling the CDH to expose governed data products, aggregates, and analytical outputs as secure, versioned REST APIs - consumable by

internal FBR applications, operational systems, and authorized downstream platforms.

- API catalogue maintained within the data governance layer - documenting all published endpoints, data products served, consumer access policies, SLOs, and versioning history.
- Business-requirement-driven API provisioning: new outbound APIs definable and publishable through a governed request and approval workflow without requiring core platform changes.
- Field-level access control on all outbound API responses - consumers receive only the data fields their role and clearance permit, enforced at the API gateway layer.
- API versioning and deprecation management - backward compatibility guaranteed for active API consumers with a minimum notice period before breaking changes or deprecations.
- Rate limiting, usage monitoring, and consumer-level throttling enforced across all outbound APIs - with usage dashboards available to the CDO Office.
- Support for both synchronous (request-response) and asynchronous (event-driven / webhook push) outbound API patterns to accommodate varied consumer system architectures.

API Governance & Operations

- All APIs (inbound and outbound) registered in the central API catalogue with ownership, SLA, data classification, and consumer mapping documented.
- API health monitoring integrated into the Data Observability layer - latency, error rates, availability, and throughput tracked per endpoint with alerting on SLA breach.
- API security scanning and vulnerability assessment included in the CI/CD pipeline for all new and updated API endpoints.
- Audit logs maintained for all inbound API calls and outbound API responses - capturing consumer identity, timestamp, endpoint, and payload size for compliance and forensic purposes.

5.3 Data Integration and Ingestion Platform

We require an Enterprise-grade Data Integration and Ingestion Platform comprising an Extract, Load & Transform (ELT) pipeline engine and, a distributed real-time message broker. The Integration Platform shall serve as the primary data movement and orchestration layer for the Central Data Hub, replacing an existing proprietary ELT tool

currently executing 3000 + active jobs. The platform shall be deployed strictly on-premises and shall satisfy all requirements specified in this section in their entirety.

Current-State Baseline

The specifications below are informed by an operational analysis of the incumbent ELT environment.

Universal Connectivity and Native Adapters

Generic JDBC/ODBC bridges shall not satisfy connectivity requirements where native connectors are commercially available. The following native connector capabilities are mandatory:

5.4 Data Modeling and Platform Design

The Platform shall implement a structured, on-premises Lakehouse architecture organized as an Extended Medallion Data Model. This model shall comprise four named layers Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Cache. The architecture shall unify the scalability and schema flexibility of object storage with the query performance and ACID compliance of a Massively Parallel Processing (MPP) Enterprise Data Warehouse, connected through a federated query engine accessible across all layers without data movement. The model is designed to serve

national-scale tax data workloads spanning ingestion from 30+ heterogeneous source systems through to low-latency analytical serving.

The Reporting Workload is 80% Transactional reports that require very quick response time and 20% Analytical Reports this would be a key metric in solution finalization.

The Platform shall provide native multi-modelled processing capability, handling both Online Transaction Processing (OLTP) and Online Analytical Processing (OLAP) data models within a single unified engine, coupled with Hybrid Transactional and Analytical Processing (HTAP), enabling transactional and analytical workloads to be served concurrently from the same platform without ETL-driven duplication between systems.

To transform, enhance, and augment data in CDH to bring in higher-value information assets that directly support FBR's analytical, operational, and decision-making needs. The proposed platform shall provide the capabilities, frameworks, and processes required to systematically enrich data across all business domains.

Enrichment Capabilities

The platform shall support the following categories of enrichment:

- **Derived Attributes & Computed Fields:** Generation of calculated fields, ratios, trends, and aggregations not present in source systems (e.g., year-on-year filing growth, payment-to-declaration ratios).
- **Classification & Segmentation:** Automated tagging and categorization of taxpayers, transactions, and entities based on defined business rules and ML-driven models (e.g., risk tiers, taxpayer segments, sector classification).
- **Scoring & Indexing:** Generation of composite scores such as risk scores, compliance scores, and tax scores, combining multiple underlying indicators into business-consumable metrics.
- **Reference Data Matching & Standardization:** Matching and standardizing entity records (taxpayers, businesses, addresses) against reference and master data to resolve duplicates, correct inconsistencies, and establish golden records.
- **Geospatial Enrichment:** Appending geographic and jurisdictional context (tax office, region, geocoded address) to support geospatial analytics.

- **Lifecycle Enrichment:** Appending time-based context such as fiscal periods, filing cycles, and historical comparison windows to support trend and lifecycle analysis.
- **Cross-Domain Linkage:** Establishing relationships and linkages between datasets across business domains (e.g., linking sales tax filings to income tax declarations for the same taxpayer) to enable cross-subject area analysis and Taxpayer 360 profiles.

All platform components shall operate exclusively within the on-prem network perimeter, support air-gapped deployment, and have no dependency on external networks or services for any aspect of their operation. The platform shall not require any GPU hardware for its operation or for the development of AI/ML models. The platform will provide AI/ML workload compute cluster using the underlying object storage, MPP storage and other data storage layers when applicable.

The following functional requirements shall apply to the development of AI/ML models.

- Deployment and base configuration of observability infrastructure (agents, log shippers, monitoring endpoints), excluding application-level SLA/latency instrumentation, which is the Data Platform Implementation Vendor's responsibility

5.10 Data Governance

Data Governance, as defined by the latest Data Management Association's *DMBOK* framework, is the exercise of authority, control, and shared decision-making over the management of data assets encompassing policies, processes, standards, roles, and metrics that ensure data is managed as a strategic organizational resource across its full lifecycle. Grounded in DMBOK's knowledge areas from Data Quality, Metadata Management, Data Security, Privacy and Master Data Management. Governance establishes the stewardship structures, accountability frameworks, and operational controls that enable an organization to trust its data, demonstrate regulatory compliance, and derive consistent, measurable value from its information assets.

The Platform shall implement a comprehensive, enterprise-grade Data Governance capability that establishes and enforces policies, roles, responsibilities, processes, and controls across the entire data lifecycle. All requirements in this section are mandatory unless stated otherwise.

5.11 BI & Analytics

The proposed Tool and Solution shall establish a centralized, scalable, enterprise-grade, Business Intelligence (BI) & Analytics ecosystem capable of supporting enterprise reporting and analytical requirements for operational users, field formations, analysts, management, and executive leadership. The platform shall support near real-time transactional reporting, pre-built/canned reports and dashboards, interactive reporting, self-service analytics, and high-performance aggregated and executive dashboards, enabling operational, strategic, and executive decision-making through a unified enterprise analytics environment.

The proposed solution shall support both **analytical and transaction-level** reporting, with the ability to navigate from summarized and aggregated information down to the lowest available grain of transactional data, subject to defined business requirements and access controls. The platform shall support multiple data consumption horizons, ranging from near real-time operational data to summarized, aggregated, and historical datasets, based on business use cases and performance requirements.

For ease of use and mass-scale adoption, the solution shall enable the development, publishing, organization, and maintenance of pre-built/canned reports and dashboards for standardized and recurring business requirements. Authorized end users shall be able to readily access and consume these reports without requiring technical or report-development expertise. Interactive capabilities shall include, where applicable, prompts, filters, sorting, drill-down, drill-through, navigation, and aggregation.

The proposed solution shall provide a centralized, governed, and scalable enterprise BI and semantic layer, making relevant subject areas, dimensions, measures, KPIs, hierarchies, business attributes, and analytical metrics available to authorized users within the BI tool and integration with the data governance tool. These analytical objects shall be centrally defined, reusable, and consistently available across canned reports, dashboards, ad-hoc reporting, and self-service analytics, thereby ensuring consistent business definitions and a Single Version of Truth (SVOT) across PRAL/FBR.

The platform shall support cross-functional and cross-subject-area analysis, enabling authorized users to analyze and correlate information across enterprise business domains through common/conformed dimensions, measures, and integrated enterprise data models.

The solution shall be designed for enterprise-scale performance, availability, and scalability, capable of supporting mass users and concurrent workloads while accommodating increasing data volumes and evolving analytical requirements. The architecture shall allow the addition and extension of data sources, subject areas, dimensions, measures, KPIs, reports, dashboards, analytical workloads, and users without requiring fundamental redesign of the platform.

The scope of this initiative includes the modernization, migration, enablement, and operationalization of the enterprise BI & Analytics ecosystem, including the migration and rationalization of existing reports, dashboards, analytical workloads, business rules, and associated semantic/data models to the proposed target platform.

Current Baseline

Currently, PRAL/FBR utilizes **Oracle Analytics Server (OAS)** to support enterprise-wide reporting requirements for mass users and field formations. The platform provides dashboards and detailed transactional reporting, including drill-down capabilities to the **lowest grain level of data**.

In parallel, PRAL/FBR has recently acquired **Tableau** as its strategic visualization and analytics platform for **senior management, headquarters, and executive-level reporting**

6. Sizing Estimation for Reference

IMPORTANT NOTICE: REFERENCE SIZING ESTIMATE

All hardware specifications, node counts, and storage capacities presented in this section constitute reference sizing estimates only. These estimates are derived from analysis of current on-premises data footprints and projected growth trajectories. The Vendor shall conduct a formal capacity planning exercise based on their certified technology stack and licensing architecture. The Vendor's validated sizing shall supersede all reference figures contained herein. The procuring authority shall not be bound by these reference estimates during contract negotiation.

This section presents reference hardware sizing estimates for all major platform components of the Central Data Hub. The estimates are derived from analysis of the existing on-premises data footprint, schema-level storage measurements, and projected data growth trajectories over a five-year horizon. The New-Technology components that are missing in the existing ecosystem are benchmarked based on Software tool Specification or Entry Grade Enterprise Production specification.

The section is organized into two primary groups. Group 1 covers the core analytical platform components, comprising the Massively Parallel Processing (MPP) Enterprise Warehouse, the ELT Processing Nodes, and the Object Store. Group 2 covers supporting infrastructure components, comprising Streaming and AI/ML Workloads, Data Governance, Security and Monitoring, and the In-Memory Cache Cluster.

6.1 Core Analytical Platform Components

This group encompasses the primary data processing and storage infrastructure. Sizing within this group is driven directly by measured on-premises database footprints and the storage requirements of the Medallion (Bronze / Silver / Gold) architecture to be implemented on the new platform.

7. Infrastructure Implementation & Commissioning

This section formalizes the Vendor's responsibility to physically install, configure, secure, and commission all infrastructure shown in the architecture diagram (Section 5.2 and Annexure), across both Production and Development/Test environments, up to the point where the environment is ready for data platform implementation to begin

7.1 Scope of Work

- Site preparation coordination: verification of rack space, power, cooling, and network cross-connect readiness in coordination with PRAL's facilities team.
- Physical installation (rack-and-stack) of all compute, storage, and networking hardware per the approved Bill of Materials and the sizing specifications defined in Section 6.
- Cabling, network configuration, and connectivity validation across all environments, including VLAN segmentation, firewall rules, and inter-environment isolation consistent with Section 09 (Environments).
- Operating system installation, hardening, and patching for all nodes, aligned to FBR/PRAL's security baseline requirements.
- Installation and base configuration of all licensed platform software components (Lakehouse/object storage engine, MPP Enterprise Data Warehouse, compute cluster runtime, in-memory cache cluster, and supporting infrastructure software) up to the point of readiness for the data platform Implementation Vendor to begin pipeline configuration.
- High-availability and redundancy configuration for all infrastructure components per the architecture diagram and Section 10 (HA, Backup & Disaster Recovery).
- Infrastructure-level backup and disaster recovery configuration (storage replication, backup agents, DR site connectivity) as a physical/platform-layer capability, distinct from the application-level DR procedures
- Infrastructure security hardening: network segmentation, encryption-at-rest configuration, access control at the OS/hypervisor level, and integration with FBR/PRAL's directory services.
- DR failover testing to validate that backup/replication/failover actually works as configured.
- Infrastructure-level performance testing (throughput, latency, IOPS) to confirm the environment meets sizing specifications in Section 6, prior to formal handoff.
- Walkthrough or training sessions for PRAL's internal team and/or the Data Platform Implementation Vendor on the deployed infrastructure.

7.2 Infrastructure Acceptance

"Infrastructure Acceptance" is defined as a formal milestone, marking the point at which all infrastructure is installed, configured, secured, and validated as ready for data platform implementation to commence.

- Infrastructure Acceptance Testing shall include hardware burn-in tests, network throughput and latency validation, HA failover testing, and a security baseline scan.
- Testing shall be jointly witnessed by PRAL and, where applicable, the separately contracted data platform Implementation Vendor.
- Written sign-off from PRAL is mandatory before infrastructure is handed over for data platform implementation.

7.3 Deliverables

- As-built infrastructure **diagrams** and configuration documentation.
- **Network and security configuration documentation:** VLAN mapping, firewall rule sets, IP addressing scheme, and access control matrix.
- **Asset inventory register:** complete list of hardware/software assets including serial numbers, warranty start/end dates, and license keys.
- **HA/DR configuration and failover test report:** documentation of the high-availability setup and results of the DR failover test/drill.
- **Infrastructure Acceptance** Test Report for the entire solution.
- **Environment readiness certificate:** formal sign-off document confirming the infrastructure is ready for the Data Platform Implementation Vendor to begin pipeline configuration.
- **Infrastructure runbooks**, including power-on/power-off procedures, hardware maintenance procedures, and escalation contacts.

7.4 Implementation Timelines & Milestones

This timeline covers infrastructure readiness only, scoped exclusively to the hardware, software licensing, and infrastructure commissioning activities defined in this RFP. The total duration for this scope is 5 months (20 weeks) from contract signing to Infrastructure Acceptance. Data platform and application implementation timelines are defined separately under the Data Platform & Application Implementation Services engagement and commence only after Infrastructure Acceptance is achieved, consistent with Section 19 (Vendor Coordination & Interface Management).

8. Performance & Scalability

Purpose & Strategic Context

This section defines how infrastructure performance targets are set, how compute, storage, and network components are validated against these targets before go-live, and how the infrastructure is confirmed to meet the sizing, high-availability, and capacity requirements defined in Section 6 and Section 11, prior to handoff for data platform implementation.

Scope of Work

The Performance and Scalability workstream should address nine interdependent domains, each contributing to a platform that is fast, elastic, cost-efficient, and operationally transparent:

- **Compute Performance Benchmarking:** CPU/core performance validation (e.g., SPEC benchmarks or equivalent) confirming compute nodes meet the sizing specifications defined in Section 6.
- **Storage Throughput & IOPS Testing:** validating read/write throughput, latency, and IOPS of storage systems against vendor-specified and RFP-required performance thresholds.
- **Network Bandwidth & Latency Validation:** testing inter-node, inter-environment, and cross-connect network performance (throughput, latency, packet loss) against architecture requirements.

- **Memory Performance Validation:** validating in-memory cache cluster and node-level memory throughput/latency meet specified performance targets.
- **HA Failover Performance Testing:** measuring failover time and performance impact during simulated node/component failure, confirming it meets RTO targets defined in Section 11.
- **Backup & Recovery Performance Testing:** validating backup completion times and recovery/restore times against defined RPO/RTO targets.
- **Resource Headroom Validation:** confirming available CPU, memory, storage, and network capacity headroom at go-live against projected infrastructure sizing (not workload/application sizing, which is the Data Platform Vendor's responsibility).
- **Infrastructure Stress Testing:** validating stability and performance of compute, storage, and network components under sustained peak load conditions, prior to formal handoff.
- **HTAP Performance:** HTAP performance report showcasing metrics and usage.

09. Environments

The vendor shall deliver a three-tier environment architecture comprising Development, Test, and Production, deployed across two physically segregated infrastructure footprints.

Environment Structure

- Production shall reside on a dedicated physical environment, fully isolated at the hardware, network, and storage levels from all non-production workloads. Under no circumstances shall Production share physical compute, storage, or network fabric with Development or Test.
- Development and Test shall be co-located on a single, capacity-reduced secondary physical environment, logically segregated from one another through independent namespaces, isolated execution contexts, dedicated service accounts, and logically segregated storage.
- The Development and Test environment shall not constitute a fully running replica of Production. It shall be deliberately scaled down in node count and per-node capacity to minimize total cost of ownership while preserving full functional coverage of every Production component. The vendor shall propose and justify all sizing and capacity reduction factors.

Production Environment

- Production shall be provisioned as a complete, fully operational, end-to-end instantiation of the target platform.

- All components including the ELT orchestration layer, compute cluster, MPP Enterprise Data Warehouse, object storage, and in-memory caching tier shall be deployed at full production capacity.
- All performance, concurrency, throughput, and high-availability SLAs specified in this RFP shall be met exclusively against the Production environment.

Security and Isolation

- Each tier shall be governed by formally enforced security boundaries preventing unauthorized lateral movement of data, credentials, configurations, or workloads.
- Development and Test shall have zero direct network reachability to Production data assets, compute resources, credential stores, or metadata repositories.
- RBAC policies, service accounts, secrets management, and audit logging shall be independently maintained per environment.
- All cross-environment activity shall traverse a controlled, auditable pipeline aligned with governance principles.

Environment Parity

- Development and Test shall remain structurally and functionally identical to Production with respect to component versions, patch levels, schema definitions, data models, pipeline logic, and configuration parameters at all times, notwithstanding their reduced capacity.
- The vendor shall provide tooling and documented procedures to detect, report, and remediate parity drift on a continuous basis.

Data Masking and Synthetic Data

- The vendor shall implement a data masking and synthetic data management capability enabling policy-governed promotion of representative datasets from Production into lower tiers.
- Static masking shall be applied at promotion time. Dynamic masking shall be applied at query execution time.
- Masking shall cover all PII and taxpayer-sensitive attributes per the platform's data classification taxonomy.
- Masked datasets shall preserve referential integrity, statistical distribution, and structural fidelity sufficient to support meaningful development, testing, and model validation.

10. HA, Backup & Disaster Recovery

High Availability

All critical components including the ELT pipeline engine, compute clusters, MPP Enterprise Data Warehouse and in-memory caching cluster shall be deployed in an active-active or active-passive configuration appropriate to their workload profile.

No single point of failure shall be permitted at any tier including compute, storage, and network layers.

Automatic failover mechanisms shall be implemented across all layers with formally defined and contractually binding Recovery Time Objectives (RTO) and Recovery Point Objectives (RPO).

Health monitoring, heartbeat detection, and self-healing capabilities shall be implemented to minimize manual intervention during fault conditions.

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Backup

The platform shall incorporate a SAN-based backup framework protecting all ecosystem components without reliance on tape-based media.

The platform shall expose all necessary APIs, connectors, and integration hooks to enable application-aware backup operations across the ELT tool, compute cluster state, MPP Warehouse data and metadata, object storage buckets, and the in-memory cache layer.

Disaster Recovery

The vendor to propose, supply, install, and commission a dedicated Disaster Recovery (DR) environment at a geographically separate location from the primary production site.

The DR environment shall be architecturally identical to production in terms of software stack, component versions, configuration baselines, and functional capability.

To optimize total cost of ownership, the DR environment needs to be provisioned at a reduced capacity footprint during normal operations, including:

Post-warranty support shall include hardware/software patches, security updates, and infrastructure-level performance tuning for the duration specified in the contract.

13. Software and Hardware Services and Warranty

Software and Infrastructure Warranty

The Vendor shall provide warranty coverage for all hardware and infrastructure software components, including operating systems, virtualization/platform software, and supporting infrastructure tools, delivered under this contract for a minimum period of five years from the date of Infrastructure Acceptance. During this period, the Vendor shall rectify, at no additional cost, any defects, bugs, performance issues, or non-conformities identified in the delivered infrastructure and its deliverables.

Hardware Warranty

All hardware components procured and commissioned under this contract, including compute nodes, storage appliances, networking equipment, and associated infrastructure, shall carry a minimum five-year warranty from the date of Infrastructure Acceptance. The Vendor shall ensure next-business-day on-site replacement for any failed hardware component. No single hardware failure shall result in platform downtime exceeding the RTO defined in Section 10 of this RFP.

Software Maintenance and Updates

Throughout the warranty period, the Vendor shall provide all software updates, security patches, and version upgrades for every licensed platform component at no additional cost. All updates shall be tested in the Development/Test environment before promotion to Production. The Vendor shall notify FBR/PRAL of all critical security patches within 24 hours of release and shall apply them within a mutually agreed maintenance window.

18. Liquidated Damages

1. Scope of Penalty Application:

- The Vendor must deliver the agreed hardware, software, and infrastructure scope within the specified timeline as outlined in Section 7.4 (Implementation Timelines and Milestones).
- Failure to implement the system within the agreed timeframe will result in the following penalties.

2. Liquidated Damages:

- **Rate:** A penalty of 0.02% of the total project value per day of non-compliance.
- **Maximum Deduction:** The cumulative penalty shall not exceed the value of the performance guarantee submitted by the Vendor.

3. Escalation of non-compliance:

- If the delay or failure extends beyond 40 days, PRAL reserves the right to:

- A joint site-readiness walkthrough shall be conducted between PRAL, the Infrastructure Vendor, and the Implementation Vendor prior to Infrastructure Acceptance sign-off.
- PRAL shall act as the single coordinating authority for schedule alignment between both Vendors; neither Vendor shall be entitled to claim relief for delay caused by the other party without PRAL's documented concurrence.
- Any Infrastructure Vendor-caused delay to Infrastructure Acceptance that demonstrably impacts the Implementation Vendor's committed timeline shall be assessed by PRAL and may result in a corresponding schedule adjustment for the Implementation Vendor, without prejudice to Liquidated Damages applicable to the Infrastructure Vendor under its own contract.
- Shared environment access, credential provisioning, and change control coordination between both Vendors shall follow a joint Change Management process, with PRAL as final approval authority for any change affecting both scopes.
