PROCUREMENT OF NON-CONSULTANCY SERVICES

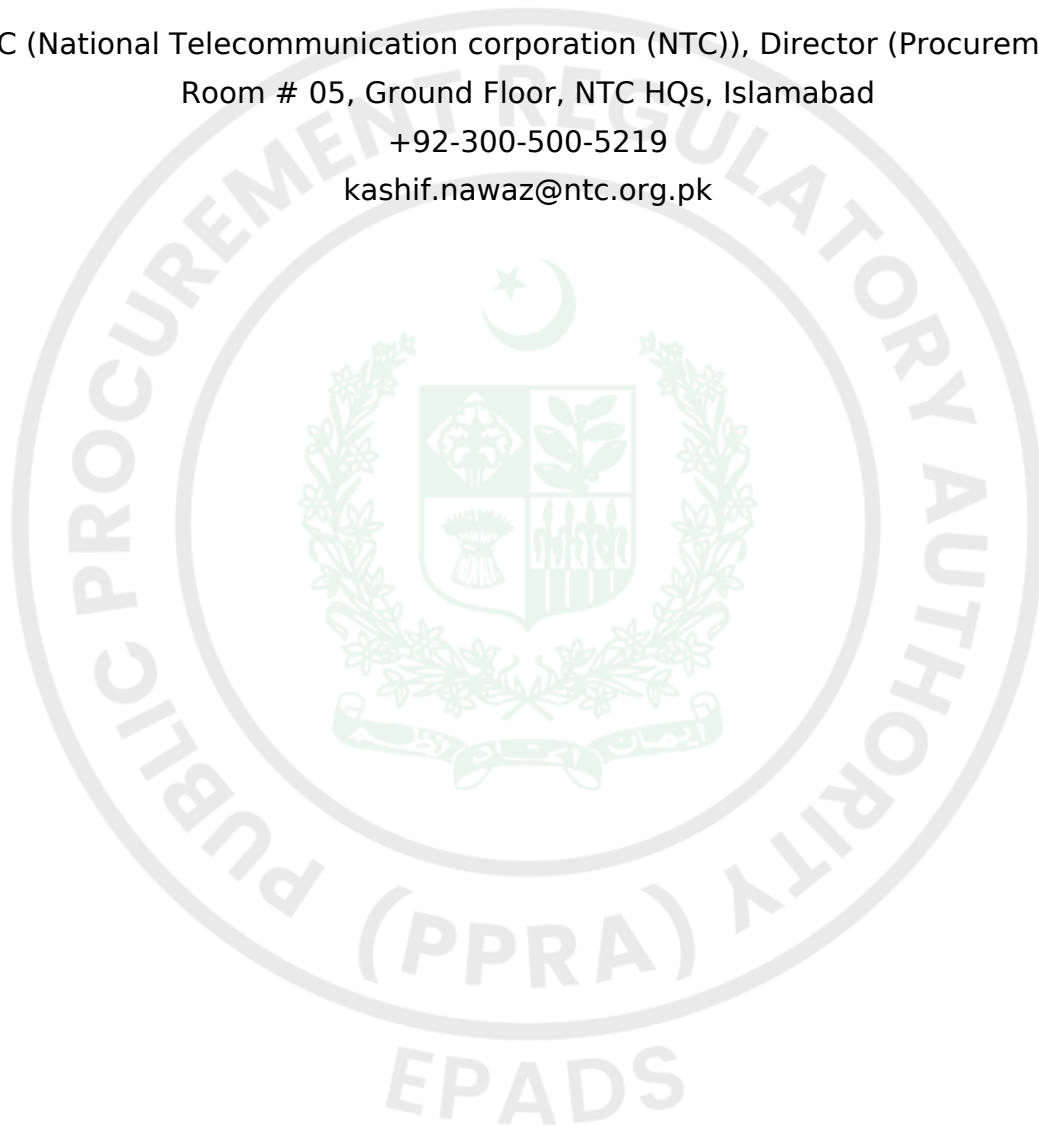
1. The **NTC (National Telecommunication corporation (NTC))** has reserved Funds for the procurement planned for FY **2026-27**. The **NTC (National Telecommunication corporation (NTC))** intends to apply part of the proceeds of this Fund to cover eligible payments under the contract for the **"Provision of Media connectivity through Satellite, Microwave and Optical Fiber for Wi-Fi Connectivity at Punjab Cattle Market Sites on Turnkey Basis"** with the reference of **"P125500"**
2. The **NTC (National Telecommunication corporation (NTC))** invites Bids through **EPADS v2.0** from eligible Bidders registered on **EPADS v2.0** for provision of Non-Consultancy Services.
3. **Single Stage-One Envelope** Procedure of Principal Method of Procurement (i.e. Open Competitive Bidding) will be used by adopting **Least Cost Based Selection (LCBS)** Technique for the subject procurement, in line with the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 and any Regulations, and Instructions issued by the Authority (from time to time).
4. All Bids must be accompanied by a Bid Security described in Bid Security Section in Bidding Document in the form of **Pay Order, Banker's Cheque, Call at Deposit, Bank Guarantee, Demand Draft** or Bid Securing Declaration on the prescribed format described.
5. E-Bidding documents, containing detailed terms & conditions, specifications and requirements etc. are available on **e-Pak Acquisition and Disposal System (EPADS)** at **<https://epads.gov.pk/opportunities/federal/procurements/125500>**.
6. The e-bids, prepared in accordance with the instructions in the e-Bidding documents, must be submitted through **EPADS v2.0** on or before **Thursday, October 15, 2026 11:00 AM**. E-bids will be opened on the same day at **Thursday, October 15, 2026 11:30 AM**. Manual submission of Bids shall not be entertained. Those vendors who have not yet registered on the new

version of **EPADS v2.0**, may register themselves on <https://vendors.epads.gov.pk/>.

7. In terms of Rules 48 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004 Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) is notified for the subject procurement and notification copy is available on the procuring agency's website and also available on **EPADS v2.0** as well as Authority's website at (www.ppra.org.pk).

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Instructions to Bidders

A. Introduction

1. Scope of Bids

1.1. The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the **Bids Data Sheet (BDS)** invites Bids through **EPADS v2.0** for the provision of Non-Consultancy Services for as specified in the BDS and **in Section Evaluation Criteria, Specifications & Schedule of Requirements**. The name, identification, and number of items/deliverables are provided in the **BDS**. **Single Stage-One Envelope** procedure of the open competitive method shall be used. The successful Bidders will be expected to provide the services within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the **BDS**.

2. Source of Funds

2.1. Source of funds is referred in Clause-1 of Invitation for Bids.

3. Fraudulent & Corrupt Practices

3.1. As defined under Rule 2(1)(f) of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

4. Eligible Bidders

4.1. A bidder is eligible to participate in a procurement process if the bidder:

4.1.1. possesses or has access to the technical competence, financial resources, equipment and other physical facilities, personnel, managerial capability, experience and reputation necessary to complete the procurement contract;

4.1.2. has the legal capacity to enter into a procurement contract;

4.1.3. is not insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up and its activities or affairs are not suspended or being administered under any Act, by a court or by a judicial officer;

4.1.4. is not the subject of legal proceedings for any of the matters mentioned in sub-rule (c);

4.1.5. has fulfilled or has made substantial arrangements satisfactory to the relevant authorities, to fulfil its obligations to pay taxes and social security (where applicable) other contributions of its employees; and

4.1.6. has not, or in the case of a company, its owners and beneficial owners, directors or officers have not, been convicted of a criminal offence related to:

4.1.6.1. its professional conduct; or

4.1.6.2. a bidder (or, in the case of a company, its key individuals such as owners, beneficial owners, directors, or officers) must not have engaged in any prohibited practice, such as fraud, corruption, collusion, or coercion, within the time period stated in the bidding documents, which can be up to three years before the start of the procurement process. Additionally, the bidder must not have been debarred (i.e., banned) from participating in public procurement processes in Pakistan or by any international organization or country. If they have, they are ineligible to participate in the current bidding.

4.2. The procuring agency may require a bidder participating in the procurement process to provide the prescribed documentary evidence or other information to satisfy itself that the bidder is qualified in accordance with the criteria in sub-clause (1).

4.3. A procuring agency shall set out in the bidding document all the criteria for qualification to be applied in accordance with sub-clause (1).

4.4. Except as permitted under the Ordinance, Rules and Regulations, the procuring agency shall not establish a criterion for eligibility of a bidder that:

4.4.1. discriminates against or among a bidder or against categories of bidders; or

4.4.2. is not required for the performance of the procurement contract; or

4.4.3. is not related to the avoidance or management of legal, reputational or economic risk to the procuring agency unless it is in the national interest to do so, and the criteria is set out in the bidding documents.

4.5. A procuring agency shall assess the eligibility of a bidder for participation in the procurement process against the criteria for qualification under sub-clause (1).

4.6. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a lead member as nominated in the BDS,

4.7. who shall have the Authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of Joint venture, consortium, or association during the bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of the contract.

4.8. The appointment of the lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of valid power of Attorney to the procuring agency.

4.9. Subject to the limits specified in the BDS, the procuring agency may allow bidders to participate in the form of a Joint Venture (JV). However, each party in the JV must individually meet the eligibility criteria specified in the BDS

4.10. No Bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bids individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process.

5. Qualification of the Bidder

5.1. All Bidders shall provide in Section VI, Bid Forms, a preliminary description of the proposed work method and schedule, including drawings and charts, as necessary.

B. Bidding Documents

6. Contents of Standard Bidding Document

6.1. The Services required, bidding procedure, and terms and conditions of the contract are prescribed in the bidding document. In addition to the Invitation for Bids, the bidding document which should be read in conjunction with any addendum issued by the Procuring Agency include:

Section I -Invitation to Bid

Section II Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

Section III Bid Data Sheet (BDS)

Section IV Eligible Countries

Section V Evaluation Criteria, Specifications, Schedule of Requirements, and Technical Specifications.

Section VI Bidding Forms

Section VII Fraudulent & Corrupt Practices

Section VIII - Material & Non-material deviation

Section IX General Conditions of Contract (GCC)

Section X Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)

Section XI Contract Forms

6.2. The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, requirements, forms, terms and specifications in the bidding documents. Failure to furnish all the information required in the bidding document will be at the Service provider's risk and may result in the rejection of his bids.

7. Clarifications

7.1. Clarifications of the bidding documents may be requested in writing through EPADS v2.0 by any bidder up to three days prior to the deadline for the submission of bids.

The procuring agency shall respond promptly and in writing to any request by a bidder for clarification of the bidding documents and, in any event, no later than two days prior to the deadline for the submission of bids or proposals.

Responses to requests for clarification shall be communicated simultaneously and in writing to all bidders participating in the procurement proceedings.

No bidder shall be allowed to alter or modify his bid after the bids have been opened however, the procuring agency may seek and accept clarification to the bid that do not change the substance of the bid, through EPADS v2.0.

7.2. Procuring Agency's response will be uploaded on the EPADS v2.0, including a description of the inquiry.

7.3. Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the bidding document as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under **ITB 1.1.**

7.4. If indicated **in the BDS**, the bidder's designated representative is invited at the bidder's cost to attend a pre-bid meeting at the place, date and time mentioned **in the BDS**. During this pre-bid meeting, prospective bidder(s) may request clarification(s) regarding the schedule of requirements, the Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the bidding document.

7.5. Minutes of the pre-bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by bidders, and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be uploaded on EPADS v2.0. Any modification to the bidding document that may become necessary as a result of the pre-bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum.

7.6. To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Bids of the Bidders, the Procuring Agency may, ask any Bidder for a clarification of its bid including breakdown of prices, through EPADS v2.0. Any clarification submitted by a bidder that is not in response to a request by the Procuring Agency shall not be considered.

No change in the prices or substance of the bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted.

The alteration or modification in the bid which in any way affect the following parameters will be considered as a change in the substance of a

bid:

- 7.6.1. evaluation & qualification criteria;
- 7.6.2. required scope of work or specifications;
- 7.6.3. all securities requirements;
- 7.6.4. tax requirements;
- 7.6.5. terms and conditions of bidding documents; and
- 7.6.6. change in the ranking of the bidders.

From the time of bid(s) opening to the time of contract award, if any bidder wishes to contact the procuring agency on any matter related to the bid, it should do so in writing or through electronic form that provides record of the content of communication.

8. Amendment of Bidding documents

8.1. Before the deadline for submission of bids, the procuring agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective bidder or pre-bid meeting may modify the bidding documents by issuing addendum.

8.2. Any addendum issued including the notice of any extension of the deadline shall be part of the bidding document and shall be uploaded on EPADS v2.0 as well as Authority's website. The procuring agency shall promptly publish the addendum at the procuring agency's website indicated in the **BDS**:

Provided that the bidder who had either already submitted his bid, shall have the right to withdraw his already submitted bid and submit the revised bid, prior to the original or extended bid submission deadline.

8.3. To give prospective bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum/corrigendum into account in preparing their bids, the Procuring Agency may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids:

Provided that the Procuring Agency shall extend the deadline for submission of bids, if such an addendum is issued within last three (03) days of the bid submission deadline.

C. Preparation of Bids

9. Documents Constituting the Bids

9.1. The bids prepared by the bidders shall constitute the following components: -

9.1.1. Forms of bid and Bid Prices completed in accordance with ITB BDS, GCC and SCC;

9.1.2. Documentary evidence established in accordance with BDS that services to be provided by the bidder are eligible services, and conform to the bidding documents;

9.1.3. Documentary evidence established in accordance with BDS that the bidder is eligible and/or qualified for the subject bidding process;

9.1.4. Documentary evidence established, that the bidder has been authorized to provide the services;

9.1.5. Bid security or Bids Securing Declaration furnished in accordance with BDS; and

9.1.6. Any other document required in the BDS.

10. Documents Establishing Eligibility of the Services and Conformity to bidding documents

10.1. To establish the conformity of the Non-Consulting Services to the Bidding document, the bidder shall furnish as part of its bid the documentary evidence that services provided conform to the requirements.

10.2. Standards for the provision of the Non-Consulting Services are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive.

11. Documents Establishing Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder

11.1. Pursuant to BDS, the bidder shall furnish, as part of its bid, all those documents establishing the bidder's eligibility to participate in the bidding process and/or its qualification to perform the contract if its bid is accepted.

11.2. The documentary evidence of the bidder's eligibility to bids shall establish to the satisfaction of the procuring agency that the bidder, at the time of submission of its bid, is from an eligible country as defined in Section-IV titled as "Eligible Countries".

11.3. The documentary evidence of the bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted shall establish to the satisfaction of procuring agency that:

11.3.1. the bidder has the financial, technical, and supply/production capability necessary to perform the Contract, meets the qualification criteria specified in BDS.

11.3.2. that the bidder meets the qualification criteria listed in the Bids Data Sheet.

12. Form of Bid

12.1. The bidder shall fill the Form of Bid furnished in the bidding documents. The Bid Forms must be completed without any alterations to its format and no substitute shall be accepted.

13. Bids Prices

13.1. The Bids Prices quoted by the bidder in the Forms of Bid and in the price schedule shall conform to the requirements specified or exclusively mentioned hereafter in the bidding document.

13.2. All items in the Schedule of Requirements must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules. If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced and neither explicitly mentioned, their prices shall be construed to be included in the prices of other items.

13.3. The Bid price to be quoted in the Forms of Bid shall be the total price of the bid, excluding any discounts offered.

13.4. The bidder shall indicate on the appropriate Price Schedule, the unit prices (where applicable) and total bid price of the services, it proposes to provide under the contract.

13.5. Prices quoted by the bidder shall be fixed during the currency of the contract and not subject to variation on any account. A bid submitted with an adjustable price will be treated as non-responsive and shall be rejected, unless otherwise price adjustment is permissible under Conditions of the Contract. (May be reviewed)

14. Price Adjustment

14.1. Price adjustment shall not be applicable.

14.2. Procuring agency may increase the remuneration of the human resources involved in non-consultancy services on annual basis as per agreement.

14.3. Procuring agency shall incorporate the provisions to allow wage rate in compliance with Federal Government's minimum wage notification, subject to the applicability in that case.

15. Bids Currencies

15.1. Prices shall be quoted in Pakistani Rupees unless otherwise specified in the BDS.

16. Bid Validity Period

16.1. Bid(s) shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS after the bid submission deadline prescribed by the Procuring Agency. A Bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by the Procuring Agency as non-responsive. The period of bid validity will be determined from the complementary bid securing instrument i.e. the expiry period of bid security or bid securing declaration as the case may be.

17. Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration

17.1. Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, the bidder shall furnish as part of its bid, in the amount and currency specified in the BDS or Bid Securing Declaration on the format provided in Section VI (Bid Forms) The scanned copy of the Bids Security shall be uploaded in the EPADS v2.0 while submitting bid, whereas the original forms of Bid Security shall be submitted to the procuring agency before the bid submission deadline. The bidder who failed to submit the original bid security before the submission deadline shall be disqualified straightaway.

17.2. The Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration is required to protect the Procuring Agency against the risk of Bidder's conduct which would warrant the security's forfeiture.

17.3. The Bid Security shall be payable promptly upon written demand by the Procuring Agency in case any of the conditions listed in BDS, GCC and SCC are invoked.

17.4. Unsuccessful Bidders' Bid Security will be discharged or returned as promptly as possible after the award of contract, however in no case later than thirty (30) days after the expiration of the period of Bid Validity prescribed by the Procuring Agency. The Procuring Agency shall make no claim to the amount of the Bid Security, and shall promptly return the Bid Security document, whichever of the following that occurs earliest:

17.4.1. the expiry of the Bid Security;

17.4.2. the entry into force of a procurement contract and the provision of a Performance Guarantee, for the performance of the contract if such a guarantee, is required by the bidding document;

17.4.3. the rejection by the Procuring Agency of all Bids;

17.4.4. the withdrawal of the Bid prior to the deadline for the submission of bids, unless the bidding document stipulate that no such withdrawal is permitted.

17.5. The Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bid Securing Declaration executed:

17.5.1. if a bidder:

17.5.1.1. withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity as specified by the Procuring Agency, and referred by the bidder in the Forms of Bid, except as provided for in the ITBs; or

17.5.1.2. does not accept the correction of errors, or

17.5.2. in the case of a successful bidder fails:

17.5.2.1. **to sign the contract in accordance with SCC; or**

17.5.2.2. **to furnish Performance Guarantee in accordance with BDS and SCC.**

17.6. The bid security shall be valid for a period specified in BDS. Bids with shorter bid security validity period shall be rejected straight away.

18. Alternative Bids by Bidders

18.1. Alternatives will not be considered, unless specifically allowed for in the BDS.

18.2. When alternative times for completion are explicitly invited, a statement to that effect will be included in the BDS and the method of evaluating different time schedules will be described in Evaluation and Qualification Criteria.

19. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Bids

19.1. Before Bids submission deadline, any bidder may withdraw, substitute, or modify his bid after it has been submitted.

20. Format and Signing of Bids

20.1. The bidder shall prepare and submit his bid with due diligence after carefully reading all the terms and conditions before submission through

EPADS v2.0.

20.2. Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed by the person(s) signing the forms of bid.

D. Submission of Bids

21. **Submission of Bids through EPADS v2.0 before Dead deadline**

21.1. The Technical and Financial Bids as the case may be, shall be submitted in the due portion of the EPADS v2.0, before bid submission deadline. The bid submission option shall be automatically disabled once the deadline is over.

21.2. The Procuring Agency may, under exceptional circumstances and at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids by amending the Bidding Documents. In such a case, all rights and obligations of the Procuring Agency and the Bidders that were previously subject to the original deadline shall thereafter be subject to the revised deadline.

E. Opening and Evaluation of Bids

22. **Opening & Evaluation of Bids by the Procurement Cell/Evaluation Committee**

22.1. The Procuring Agencies to constitute odd number Bid Evaluation Committee for the purpose of bid opening and evaluation of all procurements. As per Rules 29 & 30 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004, The Procuring Agency is required to establish a Procurement Cell/Evaluation Committee which shall Evaluate the Bids in accordance with the evaluation criteria, terms and conditions given in the bidding documents.

23. **Opening of Bids**

23.1. The Bid Evaluation Committee of the Procuring Agency will open all bids through EPADS, in the presence of bidders' or their representatives who

choose to attend, and other parties with a legitimate interest in the bid proceedings at the place, on the date and at the time, specified in the **BDS**. The Bidders' representatives present shall sign attendance sheet as proof of their attendance.

23.2. The bids shall be opened one at a time, and the following read out and recorded: (a) the name of the bidder; (c) the presence of a bid security, if required; and (d) any other details as the procuring agency may consider appropriate.

23.3. No bid will be rejected at the time of bid opening except for bids whose bid security has not been provided to the procuring agency before submission deadline.

23.4. The procuring agency shall prepare minutes of the bid opening. The record of the bid opening shall include, as a minimum: the name of the bidder and the bid price, if applicable.

24. Confidentiality

24.1. Information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of bids and recommendation of contract award shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other person(s) not officially concerned with such process, until the time of the announcement of the respective evaluation report.

24.2. Any effort by a bidder to influence the procuring agency processing of bids or award decision may result in the rejection of his bid.

25. Preliminary Examination of Bids

25.1. Prior to the detailed evaluation of bids, the procuring agency will determine whether each bid:

25.1.1. meets the eligibility criteria defined in **BDS**;

25.1.2. has been prepared as per the format and contents defined by the procuring agency in the bidding document;

25.1.3. is accompanied by the required securities; and

25.1.4. is substantially responsive to the requirements of the bidding document.

25.2. The procuring agency will confirm that the documents and information specified under **BDS, GCC and SCC** have been provided in the bids. If any of these documents or information is missing, or is not provided in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders, the bids shall be rejected.

25.3. If a bid is not substantially responsive, it will be rejected by the procuring agency and may not subsequently be evaluated for complete technical responsiveness.

26. Examination of Terms and Conditions, Technical Evaluation

26.1. The procuring agency shall evaluate the technical aspects of the bids submitted in accordance with **BDS**, to confirm that all requirements specified in **Evaluation Criteria, Technical Specifications and Schedule of Requirements**, prescribed in the bidding document have been met without material deviation or reservation.

26.2. If after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the procuring agency determines that the bid is not substantially responsive in accordance with **BDS**, it shall reject the bids.

27. Correction of Errors

27.1. Bids determined to be substantially responsive will be checked for any arithmetic errors. Errors will be corrected as follows: -

27.1.1. if there is a discrepancy between unit prices and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the procuring agency there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;

27.1.2. if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of sub-totals, the sub-totals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and

27.1.3. where there is a discrepancy between the amounts in figures and in words, the amount in words will govern.

27.1.4. Where there is discrepancy between grand total of price schedule and amount mentioned on the Forms of bid, the amount referred in Price Schedule shall be treated as correct subject to elimination of other errors.

27.2. The amount stated in the bid will be adjusted by the procuring agency in accordance with the above procedure for the correction of errors and, with the concurrence of the bidder that shall be considered as binding upon the bidder. If the Bidder does not accept the corrected amount, his bid will then be rejected, and the Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bid Securing Declaration may be executed.

28. Conversion to Single Currency

28.1. As per Rule 30 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

29. Evaluation of Bids

29.1. The procuring agency shall evaluate bids in accordance with Rule 30 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004 and compare only those bids determined to be substantially responsive.

29.2. In evaluating the Technical Bids of each Bidder, the Procuring Agency shall apply the evaluation criteria and methodologies specified in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS) and in accordance with the Statement of Requirements and Technical Specifications. No other evaluation criteria or methodologies shall be permitted.

29.3. In case of tie of bids, the bidders shall be provided an opportunity to offer their best and final monetary offer through EPADS. However, in no case the rates shall be higher than the original financial bids.

29.4. The Procuring agency evaluation of a bid will take into account:

29.4.1. the bid price, excluding provisional sums and the provision, if any, for contingencies in the summary bill of quantities, but including day work items, where priced competitively;

29.4.2. price adjustment for correction of arithmetic errors in accordance with **ITB 6**;

29.5. converting the amount resulting from applying (a) and (b) above, if relevant, to a single currency in accordance with **ITB 7**;

29.6. The estimated effect of the price adjustment provisions of the Conditions of Contract, applied over the period of execution of the Contract, shall not be taken into account in bid evaluation.

29.7. If these bidding documents allow bidders to quote separate prices for different lots, and the award to a successful bidder of multiple lots, the methodology of evaluation to determine the lowest evaluated lot combinations in the Form of Bid, is specified in the **BDS**.

30. Determination of Most Advantageous Bids

30.1. Selection technique will be adopted for determining the Successful Bid in accordance with the criteria referred in the **BDS** or prescribed in the separate section titled as Evaluation Criteria.

31. Abnormally Low Financial Bids

31.1. Procuring agency may reject a bid if it has determined that the price, in combination with other constituent elements of the bid, is abnormally low in relation to the subject matter of the procurement, such that it raises material concerns on the part of the procuring agency, as to the ability of the bidder to perform the procurement contract satisfactorily for the offered price.

A procuring agency shall not reject a bid as abnormally low under sub-clause (1) above unless the procuring agency -

31.1.1. requested in writing through EPADS from the bidder a written clarification of his bid, including a detailed price analysis of his bid price in relation to the subject matter of the procurement contract, scope, methodology, schedule, allocation of risks and responsibilities and any other requirements of the bidding document; and

31.1.2. having taken account, the information provided by the bidder in response to a request under paragraph (a) and the information included in the bid, the procuring agency determines that the bidder has failed to demonstrate its ability to perform the procurement contract satisfactorily for the offered price.

The procuring agency shall promptly communicate to the bidder concerned its decision to reject the bid, including the reasons for the decision.

32. Rejection of Bids

32.1. As per Rule 33 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004

33. Single Responsive Bid

33.1. The procuring agency may consider single responsive bid subject to underlying conditions of Rule 38(b) of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

34. Arbitration

34.1. As per Rule 49 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004.

F. Award of Contract

43. Criteria of Award

43.1. The procuring agency will award the Contract to the bidder whose bid has been determined to be substantially responsive to the bidding document and who has been declared as most advantageous Bid.

44. Procuring Agency's Right to reject All Bids

44.1. The procuring agency reserves the right to reject all the Bids and to annul the procurement process at any time prior to acceptance of the bid(s), without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder(s).

45.3. The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract, subject to the condition that bidder furnish the Performance Guarantee and signing of the contract.

46. Signing of Contract

46.1. Promptly after notification of award, Procuring Agency shall send the successful bidder the draft agreement, incorporating all terms and conditions as agreed by the parties to the contract. The successful bidder and the procuring agency shall sign the contract.

47. Performance Guarantee

47.1. After the receipt of the Letter of Acceptance, the successful bidder, within the specified time, shall deliver to the Procuring Agency a Performance Guarantee in the amount and in the form stipulated in the **BDS**

47.2. 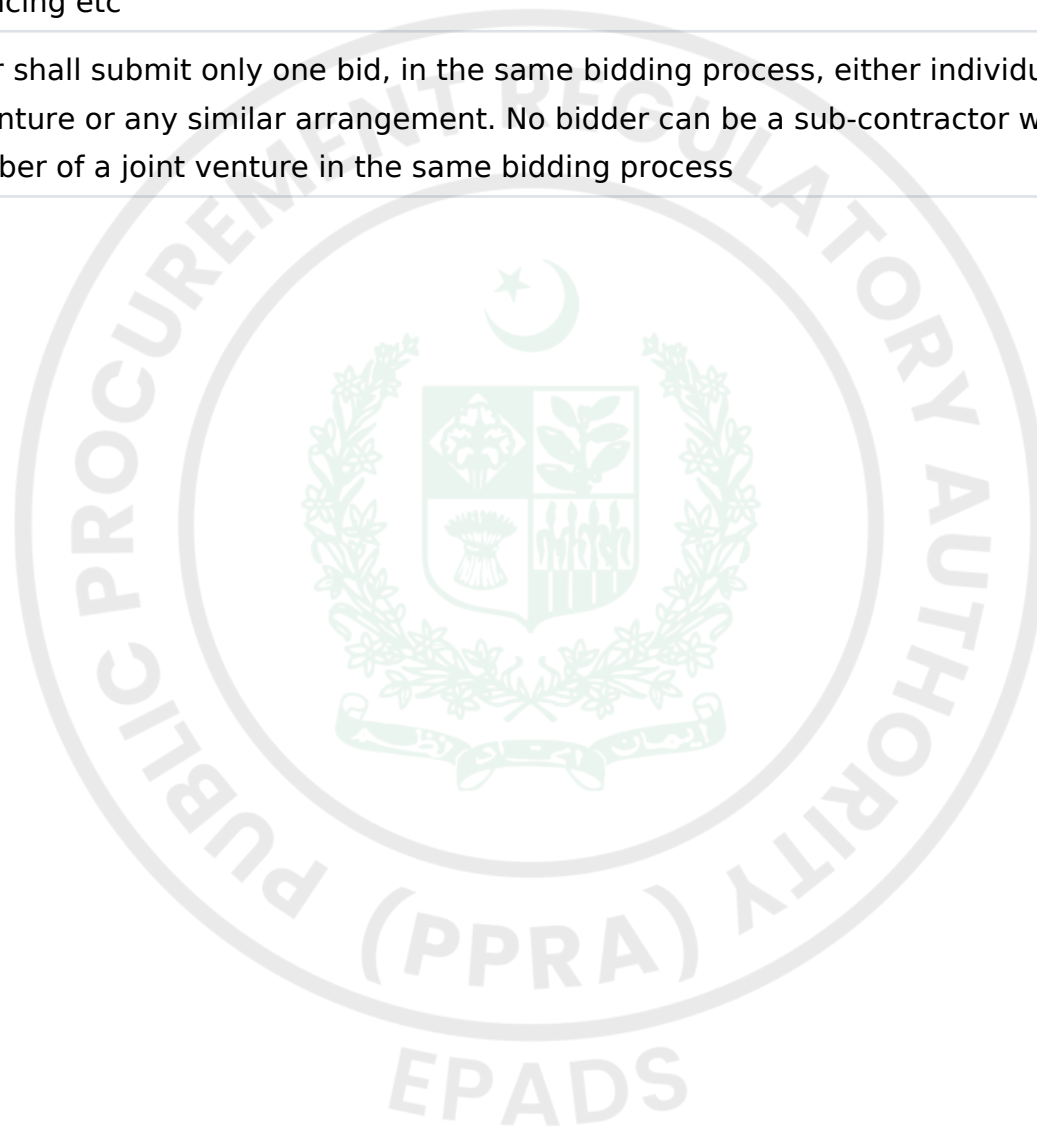

General Conditions of Contract

A. General

1. Definitions

1.1. Unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms whenever used in this Contract shall have the same meaning and shall be interpreted as indicated

1.1.1. "Applicable Law" means the laws and any other instruments having the force of law in the Government's Country, or in such other country as may be specified in the Special Conditions of the Contract (SC), as they may be issued and in force from time to time;

1.1.2. "The Contract" means an agreement enforceable by law;

1.1.3. "The Contract Price" means the price payable to the Contractor under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations;

1.1.4. "The Services" means the work to be performed by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract and as prescribed in the Specifications and Schedule of Activities included in the Contractor's Bid;

1.1.5. "Ancillary Services" means those services ancillary to the provision of Services, such as transportation and insurance, and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, and other such obligations of the Contractor covered under the Contract;

1.1.6. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract contained in this section;

1.1.7. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract by which the GCC may be amended or supplemented;

1.1.8. "Day" means calendar day unless indicated otherwise;

1.1.9. "Effective Date" means the date on which this Contract comes into force and effect;

1.1.10. "The Contractor" means the individual or corporate body whose Bids to provide the Services has been accepted by the Procuring Agency;

1.1.11. "The Project Site," where applicable, means the place or places named in Bid Data Sheet and technical Specifications;

1.1.12. "Government" means the Government of Pakistan;

1.1.13. "Local Currency" means the currency of Pakistan;

1.1.14. "In Writing" means communicated in written form with proof of receipt;

1.1.15. "Completion Date" means the date of completion of the Services by the Contractor as certified by the Procuring Agency;

1.1.16. "Foreign Currency" means any currency other than the currency of the country of the Procuring Agency;

1.1.17. "Party" means the Procuring Agency or the Contractor, as the case may be, and "Parties" means both of them;

1.1.18. "Service" means any object of procurement other than goods or works;

1.1.19. "Subcontractor" means any entity to which the Bidder subcontracts any part of the Services.

2. Applicable Law

2.1. The contract shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of Pakistan, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

3. Language

3.1. The Contract as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Contract exchanged between the Contractor and the Procuring Agency, shall be written in the **English language** unless otherwise stated in the SCC. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Contract may be in another language provided these are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Contract, this translation shall govern.

4. Notices

4.1. Any notice, request, or consent made pursuant to this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been made when delivered in person to an authorized representative of the Party to whom the communication is addressed, or when sent by registered mail, telex, telegram, or facsimile to such Party at the address specified in the SCC.

5. Location

5.1. The Services shall be performed at such locations as the Procuring Agency may approve and as specified in SCC.

6. Authorized Representatives / Authority of Member in charge

6.1. Any action required or permitted to be taken, and any document required or permitted to be executed, under this Contract by the Procuring Agency or the Contractor may be taken or executed by the officials specified in the SCC.

B. Commencement, Completion, Modification, and Termination of Contract

7. Effectiveness of Contract

7.1. This Contract shall come into effect on the date the Contract is signed by both parties and such other later date as may be stated in the SCC.

8. Commencement of Services

8.1. The Contractor shall confirm availability of Key Experts and begin carrying out the Services not later than the number of days after the Effective Date specified in the SCC.

9. Program schedule

9.1. Before commencement of the Services, the Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Agency for approval a Program showing the general methods, arrangements, order and timing for all activities. The Services shall be carried out in accordance with the approved Program as updated.

10. Starting Date/Expiration Date

10.1. The Contractor shall start carrying out the Services Five (05) days after the date the Contract becomes effective, or at such other date as may be specified in the SCC.

10.2. Unless terminated earlier pursuant to Clause **GCC 14** hereof, this Contract shall expire at the end of such time period after the Effective Date as specified in the SCC.

11. Entire Agreement

11.1. This Contract contains all covenants, stipulations and provisions agreed by the Parties. No agent or representative of either Party has authority to make, and the Parties shall not be bound by or be liable for, any statement, representation, promise or agreement not set forth herein.

12. Modification

12.1. Any modification or variation of the terms and conditions of this Contract, including any modification or variation of the scope of the Services, may only be made by written agreement between the Parties. However, each Party shall give due consideration to any modification(s) or variation(s) made by the other Party.

12.2. In cases of any modification(s) or variation(s), the prior written consent of the Procuring Agency is required.

13. Force Majeure

13.1. Definition

For the purposes of this Contract, "Force Majeure" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a Contractor and which makes a Contractor's performance of its obligations under the Contract impossible or so impractical as to be considered impossible under the circumstances.

13.2. No Breach of Contract

The failure of a Party to fulfill any of its obligations under the contract shall not be considered to be a breach of, or default under, this Contract in so far as such inability arises from an event of Force Majeure, provided that the Party affected by such an event (a) has taken all reasonable precautions, due care and reasonable alternative measures in order to carry out the terms and conditions of this Contract, and (b) has informed the other Party as soon as possible about the occurrence of such an event.

13.3. Extension of Time

Any period within which a Contractor shall, pursuant to this Contract, complete any action or task, shall be extended for a period equal to the time during which such Party was unable to perform such action as a result of Force Majeure.

13.4. Payments

During the period of their inability to perform the Services as a result of an event of Force Majeure, the Contractor shall be entitled to continue to be paid under the terms of this Contract, as well as to be reimbursed for additional costs reasonably and necessarily incurred by them during such period for the purposes of the Services and in reactivating the Service after the end of such period.

14. Termination

14.1. By the Procuring Agency

The Procuring Agency may terminate this Contract in case of the occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraphs (a) through (e) of this Clause. In such an occurrence the Procuring Agency shall give at least thirty (30) calendar days' written notice of termination to the Contractor in case of the events referred to in (a) through (d); at least sixty (60) calendar days' written notice in case of the event referred to in (e);

14.1.1. If the Contractor fails to remedy a failure in the performance of its obligations hereunder, as specified in a notice of suspension;

14.1.2. If the Contractor becomes (or, if the Contractor consists of more than one entity, if any of its members becomes) insolvent or bankrupt or enter into any agreements with their creditors for relief of debt or take advantage of any law for the benefit of debtors or go into liquidation or receivership whether compulsory or voluntary;

14.1.3. If the Contractor fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of arbitration proceedings;

14.1.4. If, as the result of Force Majeure, the Contractor is unable to perform a material portion of the Services for a period of not less than sixty (60) calendar days;

14.1.5. If the Procuring Agency, in its sole discretion and for any reason whatsoever, decides to terminate this Contract;

14.2. By the Contractor

The Contractor may terminate this Contract, by not less than thirty (30) calendar days' written notice to the Procuring Agency, in case of the occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraphs (a) through (d) of this Clause.

14.2.1. If the Procuring Agency fails to pay any money due to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract and not subject to dispute within forty-five (45) calendar days after receiving written notice from the Contractor that such payment is overdue;

14.2.2. If, as the result of Force Majeure, the Contractor is unable to perform a material portion of the Services for a period of not less than sixty (60) calendar days;

14.2.3. If the Procuring Agency fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of arbitration;

14.2.4. If the Procuring Agency is in material breach of its obligations pursuant to this Contract and has not remedied the same within forty-five (45) days (or such longer period as the Bidder may have subsequently approved in writing) following the receipt by the Procuring Agency of the Contractor's notice specifying such breach.

C. Obligations of the Contractor

15. General

15.1. Standard of Performance

15.1.1. The Contractor shall perform the Services and carry out the Services with all due diligence, efficiency and economy, in accordance with generally accepted professional standards and practices, and shall observe sound management practices, and employ appropriate technology and safe and effective equipment, machinery, materials and methods. The Contractor shall always act, in respect of any matter relating to this Contract or to the Services, as a faithful adviser to the Procuring Agency, and shall at all times support and safeguard the Procuring Agency's legitimate interests in any dealings with the third parties;

15.1.2. The Contractor shall employ and provide such qualified and experienced Experts and Sub-Contractors as are required to carry out the Services.

15.2. Law Applicable to Services

The Contractor shall perform the Services in accordance with the Contract and in accordance with the Law of Pakistan and shall take all practicable steps to ensure that any of its Experts and Sub-Bidders, comply with the Applicable Law.

16. Conflict of Interests

16.1. Contractor Not to Benefit from Commissions and Discounts

The remuneration of the Contractor shall constitute the Contractor's sole remuneration in connection with this Contract or the Services, and the Contractor shall not accept for their own benefit any trade commission, discount, or similar payment in connection with activities pursuant to this Contract or to the Services or in the discharge of their obligations under the Contract, and the Contractor shall use their best efforts to ensure that the Personnel, any Subcontractors, and agents of either of them similarly shall not receive any such additional remuneration.

16.2. Contractor and Affiliates Not to be Otherwise Interested in Project

The Contractor agree that, during the term of this Contract and after its termination, the Contractor and its affiliates, as well as any Subcontractor and any of its affiliates, shall be disqualified from providing Services (other than the Services and any continuation thereof) for any project resulting from or closely related to the Services.

16.3. Prohibition of Conflicting Activities

Neither the Bidder nor its Subcontractors nor the Personnel shall engage, either directly or indirectly, in any of the following activities:

- 16.3.1. during the term of this Contract, any business or professional activities in the Government's country which would conflict with the activities assigned to them under this Contract;
- 16.3.2. during the term of this Contract, neither the Contractor nor their Subcontractors shall hire public employees in active duty or on any type of leave, to perform any activity under this Contract;
- 16.3.3. after the termination of this Contract, such other activities as may be specified in the SCC.

17. Insurance to be Taken Out by the Contractor

17.1. The Contractor(a) shall take out and maintain, and shall cause any Subcontractors to take out and maintain, at its (or the Sub-contractors', as the case may be) own cost but on terms and conditions approved by the Procuring Agency, insurance against the risks, and for the coverage, as shall be specified in the SCC; and (b) at the Procuring Agency's request, shall provide evidence to the Procuring Agency showing that such insurance has been taken out and maintained and that the current premiums have been paid.

18. Contractor's Actions Requiring Procuring Agency's Prior Approval

18.1. The Contractor shall obtain the Procuring Agency's prior approval in writing before taking any of the following actions:

- 18.1.1. appointing such members of the Personnel not provided by the Contractor;
- 18.1.2. changing the Program of activities; and
- 18.1.3. any other action that may be specified in the SCC.

19. Reporting Obligations

19.1. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Agency the reports and documents in the numbers, and within the periods as prescribed by the Procuring Agency.

20. Liquidated Damages

20.1. Payments of Liquidated Damages

The Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the Procuring Agency at the rate per day stated in the SCC for each day that the Completion Date is later than the Intended Completion Date. The total amount of liquidated damages shall not exceed the amount defined in the SCC. The Procuring Agency may deduct liquidated damages from payments due to the Contractor. Payment of liquidated damages shall not affect the Contractor's liabilities.

20.2. Correction for Over-payment

If the Intended Completion Date is extended after liquidated damages have been paid, the Procuring Agency shall correct any overpayment of liquidated damages by the Contractor by adjusting the next payment certificate. The Contractor shall be paid interest on the overpayment, calculated from the date of payment to the date of repayment, at the rates specified in SCC.

20.3. Lack of performance penalty

If the Contractor has not corrected a Defect within the time specified in the Procuring Agency's notice, a penalty for Lack of performance will be paid by the Contractor. The amount to be paid will be calculated as a percentage of the cost of having the Defect corrected, assessed as specified in the Contractor

21. Performance Guarantee

21.1. Within the time stipulated in the acceptance letter from the Procuring Agency, the successful Bidder shall furnish the Performance Guarantee in shape and amount **specified in SCC**.

21.2. The proceeds of the Performance Guarantee shall be payable to the Procuring agency as compensation for any loss resulting from the Supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract.

21.3. The Performance Guarantee shall be denominated in the currency of the Contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the Procuring agency and shall be in the acceptable form as specified in **SCC**.

21.4. The Performance Guarantee will be discharged by the Procuring agency and returned to the Supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the Supplier's performance obligations under the Contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise **specified in SCC**.

22. Sustainable Procurement

22.1. The Contractor shall conform to the sustainable procurement contractual provisions, if and as specified in the **SCC**.

D. Contractor's Personnel

23. Description of Personnel

23.1. The titles, agreed job descriptions, minimum qualifications, and estimated periods of engagement in the carrying out of the Services of the Contractor's Key Personnel. The Key Personnel listed by title as well as by name are hereby approved by the Procuring Agency.

24. Removal and / or Replacement of Personnel

24.1. Except as the Procuring Agency may otherwise agree, no changes shall be made in the Key Personnel. If, for any reason beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor, it becomes necessary to replace any of the Key Personnel, the Contractor shall provide as a replacement a person of equivalent or better qualifications.

24.2. If the Procuring Agency finds that any of the Personnel have (i) committed serious misconduct or have been charged with having committed a criminal action, or (ii) have reasonable cause to be dissatisfied with the performance of any of the Personnel, then the Contractor shall, at the Procuring Agency's written request specifying the grounds thereof, provide as a replacement a person with qualifications and experience acceptable to the Procuring Agency.

24.3. The Contractor shall have no claim for additional costs arising out of or incidental to any removal and/or replacement of Personnel.

E. Obligations of the Procuring Agency

25. Change in the Applicable Law

25.1. If, after the date of this Contract, there is any change in the Applicable Law with respect to taxes and duties which increases or decreases the cost of the Services rendered by the Contractor, then the remuneration and reimbursable expenses otherwise payable to the Contractor under this Contract shall be increased or decreased accordingly by agreement between the Parties, and corresponding adjustments shall be made to the amounts referred in the SCC.

26. Services and Facilities

26.1. The Procuring Agency shall make available to the Contractor and the Experts, for the purposes of the Services and free of any charge, the services, facilities and property described in the Terms of Reference, at the times and in the manner specified in the Terms of Reference.

26.2. In case that such services, facilities and property shall not be made available to the Contractor, the Parties shall agree on (i) any time extension that it may be appropriate to grant to the Contractor for the performance of the Services, (ii) the manner in which the Contractor shall procure any such services, facilities and property from other sources, and (iii) the additional payments, if any, to be made to the Contractor as a result thereof.

F. Payments to the Contractor

27. Contract Price

27.1. The price payable shall be in Pakistani Rupees unless otherwise specified in the SCC.

28. Terms and Conditions of Payment

28.1. Payments will be made to the Contractor according to the payment schedule stated in the SCC and as per actual invoice submitted by the Contractor.

28.2. Unless otherwise stated in the SCC, the advance payment shall be made against the provision by the Contractor of a bank guarantee for the same amount, and shall be valid for the period stated in the SCC. Any other payment shall be made after the conditions listed in the SCC for such payment have been met, and the Contractor have submitted an invoice to the Procuring Agency specifying the amount due.

29. Quality Control Identifying Defects

29.1. The principle and modalities of Inspection of the Services by the Procuring Agency shall be as indicated in the SCC. The Procuring Agency shall check the Contractor's performance and notify him of any Defects that are found. Such checking shall not affect the Contractor's responsibilities. The Procuring Agency may instruct the Contractor to search for a Defect and to uncover and test any service that the Procuring Agency considers may have a Defect. Defect Liability Period is as defined in the SCC.

30. Correction of Defects, and Lack of Performance Penalty

- 30.1. The Procuring Agency shall give notice to the contractor of any Defects before the end of the Contract. The Defects liability period shall be extended for as long as Defects remain to be corrected.
- 30.2. Every time notice a Defect is given; the contractor shall correct the notified Defect within the length of time specified by the Procuring Agency's notice.
- 30.3. If the contractor has not corrected a Defect within the time specified in the Procuring Agency's notice, the Procuring Agency will assess the cost of having the Defect corrected, the contractor will pay this amount, and a Penalty for Lack of Performance.

31. Settlement of Disputes Amicable Settlement

- 31.1. The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably all disputes arising out of or in connection with this Contract or its interpretation.

32. Dispute Settlement

32.1. Arbitration

If any dispute of any kind whatsoever shall arise between the procuring agency and the contractor in connection with or arising out of the Contract, including without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, any question regarding its existence, validity or termination, or the execution of the contract, the parties shall seek to resolve any such dispute or difference by mutual consultation. If the parties fail to resolve such a dispute or difference even after negotiations or mediation, then the dispute shall be referred within fourteen (14) days in writing by either party to the Arbitrator, with a copy to the other party.

Any dispute in respect of which a notice of intention to commence arbitration has been given, in accordance with **GCC sub-clause 32.1**, shall be finally settled by arbitration. Arbitration may be commenced prior to or after completion of the Contract. Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with Arbitration Act 1940. Notwithstanding any reference to arbitration herein, the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless otherwise agreed. The Procuring Agency shall continue to pay the Contractor any undisputed amounts due under the Contract during the resolution of any dispute.

However, the Arbitrator may make an award of costs upon the conclusion of the arbitration making any party to the dispute liable to pay the costs of another party to the dispute.
- v. Arbitration proceedings as mentioned in the above clause regarding resolution of disputes may be commenced prior to, during or after completion of the contract.

Notwithstanding any reference to the arbitration herein, the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree that the Authority shall pay the Bidder any monies due to the Bidder.

Arbitrator's fee:

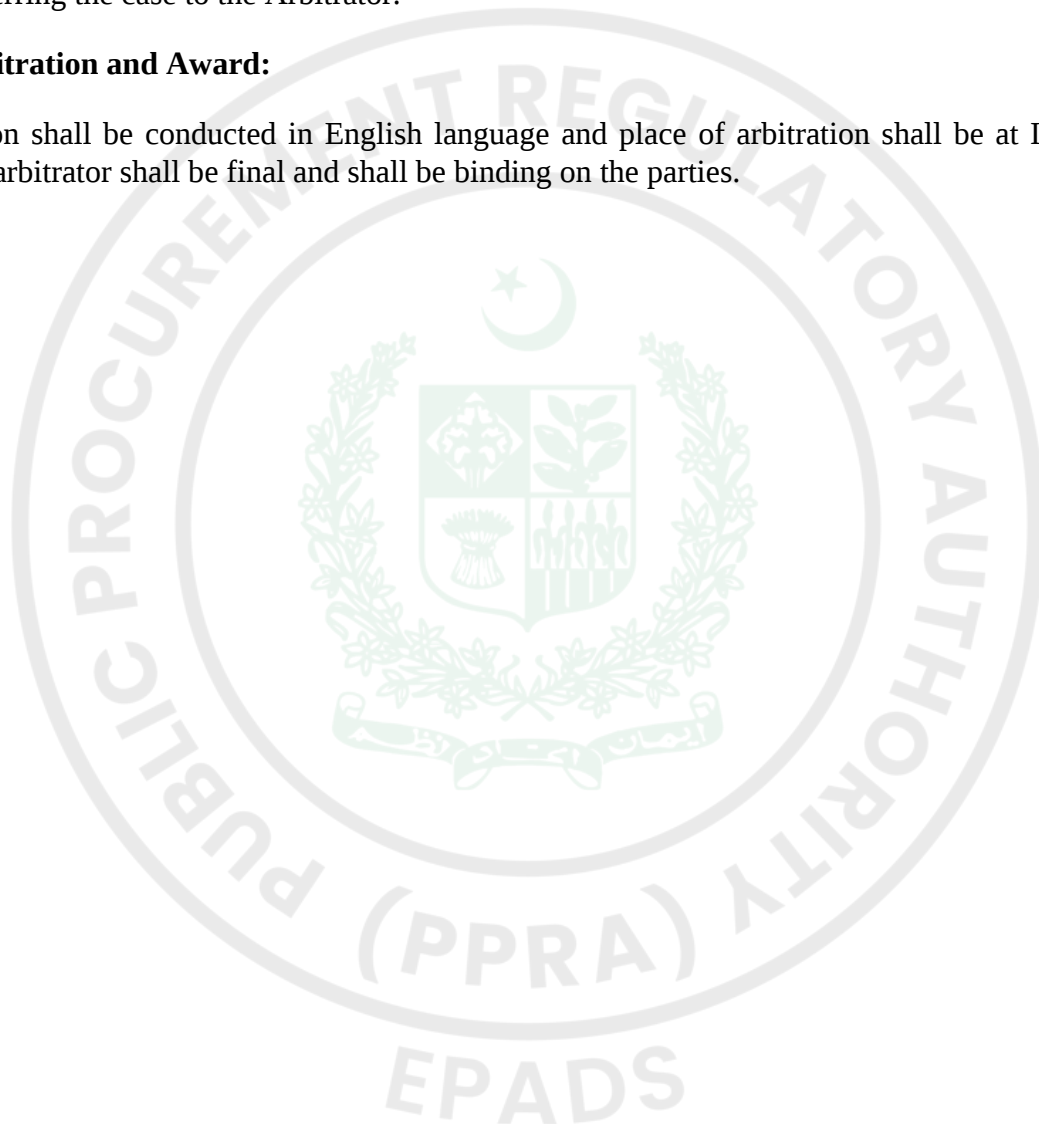

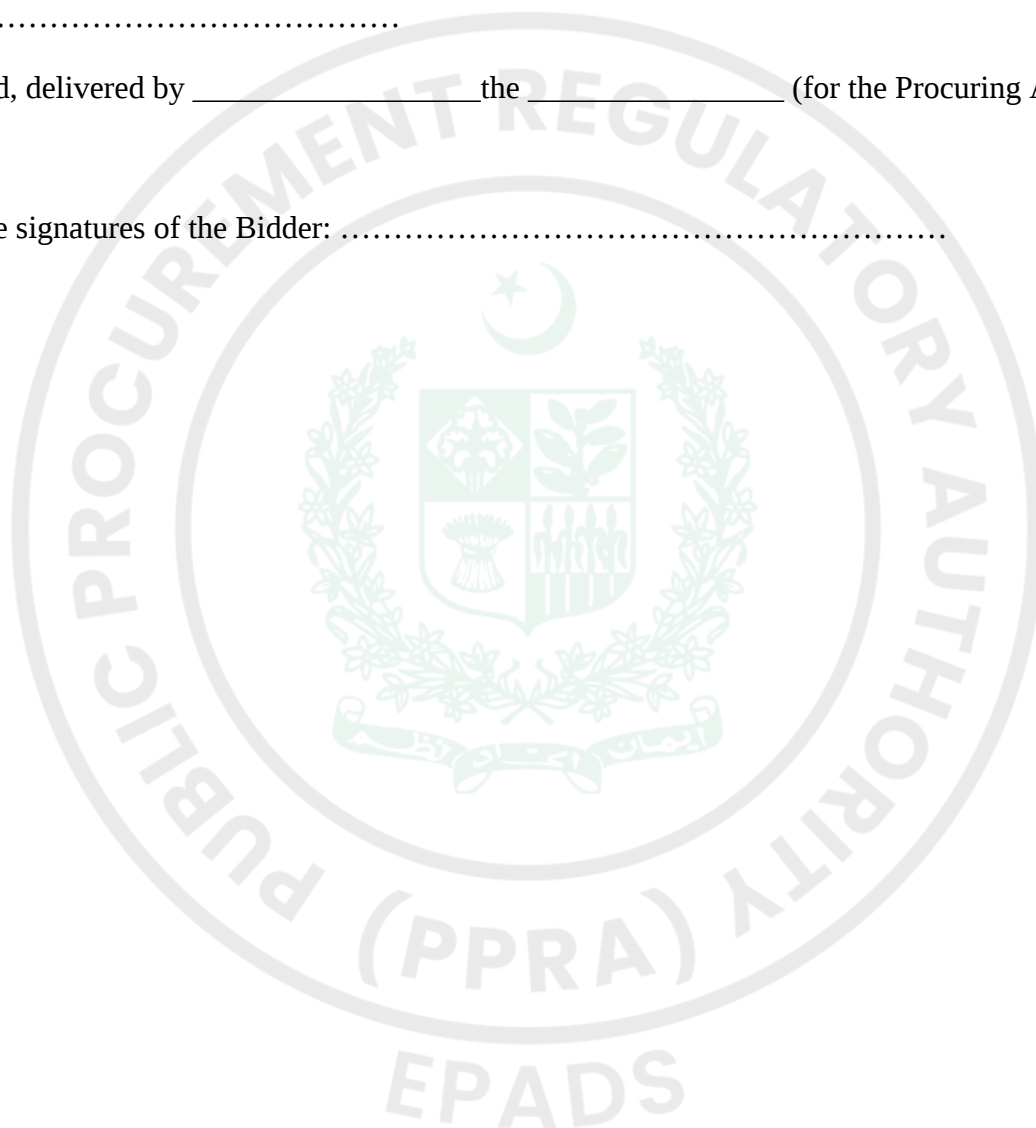

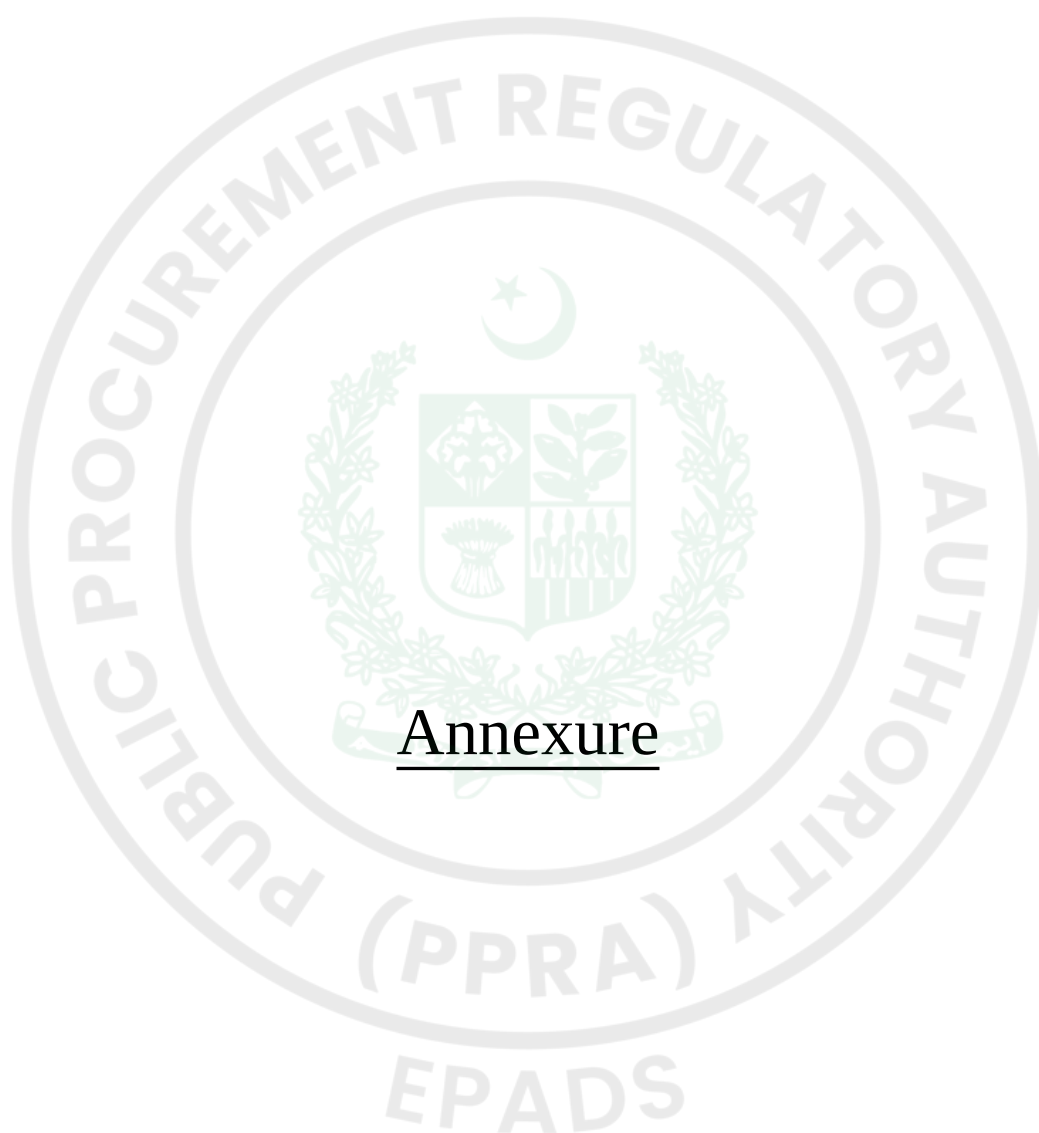

- 3.2 The contractor shall also furnish to the NTC a performance security equivalent to 5% of each work order valid for a period of 18 x months in the shape of Pay order or CDR or bank guarantee as per prescribed proforma.
- 3.3 The contractor shall also furnish to the NTC a performance security equivalent to 5% of Annual Recurring cost (Media Connectivity/Bandwidth Charges, SLA Cost and HR Cost) valid for a period of 62 x months in the shape of Pay order or CDR or bank guarantee as per prescribed proforma. This performance security shall be extended for another terms upon extension of contract agreement.
- 3.4 All the correspondence regarding release of performance securities against SLA shall be made with Director (Procurement) NTC HQ.

4 CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 The Contractor shall be responsible for Provision of Media connectivity through Satellite, Microwave and Optical Fiber for Wi-Fi Connectivity with Civil and Power Infrastructure at Punjab Cattle Market Sites on Turnkey DDP Basis.

- 4.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for establishment of a robust platform equipped with Network connectivity services through VSAT, Optical Fiber Cable and Microwave links for provision of Wi-Fi connectivity services.
- 4.3 The Contractor shall be responsible for provision of ancillary Civil works and Power Infrastructure at sites.
- 4.4 The Contractor shall be responsible for execution of the project on Turnkey Basis as per Bill of Quantity.
- 4.5 The contractor shall supply, install, test and commission the equipment in accordance with the contract.
- 4.6 All types of transportation for delivery of equipment at sites shall be the responsibility of the contractor.
- 4.7 The contractor shall not subcontract the whole of the work. The contractor shall not subcontract any part of the works without the consent of the NTC.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall execute the basic and detailed design and the implementation activities necessary for successful installation & commissioning of the solution in compliance with the provisions of the Contract or, where not so specified, in accordance with good industry practice. The Contractor shall prepare and furnish the documents for the Project Director's approval or review. Any part of the System covered by or related to the documents to be approved by the Ultimate Consignee/Project Director shall be executed only after the approval of these documents.
- 4.9 The Contractor shall conduct an engineering survey of sites and shall submit the Project implementation schedule to Project Director NTC within 01 x week after signing the contract.
- 4.10 The contractor shall provide the detailed literature for the installed equipment / solution in the form of hard copies and soft copies as mentioned in the BOQ, covering all the details of the solution and their operations, maintenance procedures.
- 4.11 The contractor shall carryout installation and commissioning according to the implementation schedule, including all action/ activities and inform/ update Project Director of NTC.
- 4.12 The contractor shall provide warranty and SLA support services of the solution.
- 4.13 The contractor shall complete the project in completion Time.
- 4.14 The contractor shall provide Minimum wages, EOBI, Social Security or Insurance and Life Insurance of the Human Resources.
- 4.15 The contractor shall disburse salary of the employees before 30th day of each month.

5 NTC's RESPONSIBILITIES

NTC shall be responsible for the following:

- 5.1 Project Director NTC shall be responsible for issuance of work order to the contractor as per NTC's requirement.
- 5.2 Project Director NTC shall arrange to provide the requisite data and site access for implementation of the project.
- 5.3 Project Director shall assist in timely and satisfactory completion of the project in their areas of jurisdiction as per SOW.
- 5.4 Project Director shall be responsible to verify the delivery BOQ against contract and issue **Acceptance Certificate**.
- 5.5 Project Director shall be responsible to coordinate with any third party (if required).

6 TRANSPORTATION / PACKING

All types of transportation for delivery of equipment / solution at sites shall be responsibility of the contractor. The contractor shall ensure proper/ international packing of equipment to avoid deterioration of equipment etc.

7 TIME FOR COMPLETION

The contractor shall complete supply, installation, testing, and commissioning of connectivity along with Civil and Power infrastructure within **20 x weeks** from each work order by NTC.

8 WARRANTY

- 8.1 The Contractor shall warrant that all equipment/goods supplied under the contract are brand new, un-used, and incorporate all the latest improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. (The contractor shall also furnish undertaking that the equipment/goods supplied is not stolen/smuggled).
- 8.2 This warranty shall remain valid for 01 (One) Year after Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC) by Project Director NTC, certifying receipt of equipment/goods in good order and condition.
- 8.3 Upon receipt of defect notice, the Contractor shall, with all reasonable speed, repair or replace, at the NTC's Consignee's store or as the case may be at that time, the defective equipment/goods or part thereof, without costs to NTC.
- 8.4 If the Contractor, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within a reasonable period, NTC may proceed to take such remedial actions as may be necessary, at the Contractor's risk and cost and without prejudice to any other rights which NTC may have against the Contractor under the contract.
- 8.5 Without prejudice to any other clauses of this contract, the Contractor shall promptly correct at no cost to NTC, any defect in any work of correction executed previously, upon receipt of written notice of defect within original twelve months' warranty period.

9 PROVISIONAL ACCEPTANCE CERTIFICATE

- 9.1 The contractor shall provide PAT /UAT documents to the Project Director for review and approval of GM(Central) NTC within 15 days of signing of contract agreement.
- 9.2 Upon completing the installation, pre-testing, and commissioning of the equipment the contractor shall notify the Project Director in writing to initiate the Provisional Acceptance Test (PAT). The Project Director shall nominate a committee of NTC and PCMMC members to conduct the PAT, verifying the installed equipment against the contractual BOQ and specifications and performing all tests in accordance with the approved PAT documents.
- 9.3 The contractor shall arrange for the tests to be conducted in accordance with the approved PAT documents. Upon successful completion of the PAT, the nominated team will sign the PAT report, confirming compliance.
- 9.4 After the successful conduct of the PAT, the Project Director shall issue the Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC) based on the PAT results. If the PAC is not issued within one (1) week of the PAT, the Project Director shall provide

reasons of the delay within one week after receiving a formal request from the contractor.

- 9.5 Any discrepancies or deficiencies identified during the PAT will be communicated to the contractor, who shall address them promptly, but no later than fourteen (14) working days from the date of notification. In such cases, the PAC will only be issued upon successful rectification of the discrepancies and completion of the required tests to the satisfaction of the PAT team.
- 9.6 Delays in issuing the Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC) will be attributed to the contractor only if discrepancies identified during the PAT remain unresolved by the contractor.
- 9.7 The Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC) will be valid for warranty period of 12 months.
- 9.8 The PAC shall be issued on site wise basis.
- 9.9 If minor /non-service affecting discrepancies remain unresolved in PAT, then the same shall be appended with PAC.
- 9.10 Issuance of the PAC shall not absolve the contractor of their obligations during the warranty period.

10 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- 10.1 Unless the failure to complete the work is caused by force majeure or delay is not on part of NTC, the contractor shall pay to NTC as liquidated damages of the delayed part of the contract, at rate of 0.5% of the delayed part, up to a maximum of 10% of the work order value and the same will be recovered from the Contractor at the time of payment.
- 10.2 In case of force majeure the LD charges may be waived off by NTC on receipt of request from contractor with documentary evidences. If the delay is on the part of NTC, and agreed by NTC, then for that time no liquidated damages will be paid to NTC. NTC shall have discretion to impose/waive off LD Charges based on the performance of contractor.

11 NIL DISCREPANCY CERTIFICATE

- 11.1 Upon successful issuance of the Acceptance Certificate (PAC), and subsequent resolution of Any Minor / Non-service affecting discrepancies the Project Director shall issue a Nil Discrepancy Certificate (NDC) in favor of the contractor for that specific site, after being fully satisfied with the completeness of the work executed thereon.
- 11.2 Issuance of the NDC shall not absolve the contractor of their obligations during the warranty period.

12 SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

- 12.1 The contractor shall be bound to provide Service Level agreement (SLA) Support services as per **SLA Agreement** during the contract period.

- 12.2 Project Director shall monitor the performance of the contractor as per the terms and conditions of this Service Level Agreement and issue SLA Acceptance Certificate in each quarter subject to satisfactory performance.
- 12.3 Project Director shall impose penalties and deduct the same from the quarterly payments against the SLA.
- 12.4 The SLA support including all components shall commence from the date of issuance of the Final Acceptance Certificate (FAC) by the Project Director, certifying successful completion of the warranty period.
- 12.5 Total duration of SLA /O&M support shall be five (05) years from commencement.
- 12.6 **Scope of SLA Support**
- 24x7 Support:** Comprehensive technical support available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, ensuring prompt issue resolution.
 - Next Business Day (NBD) Parts Replacement:** The contractor shall replace any defective hardware components by the next business day to minimize downtime.
 - Warranty Services:** Coverage of all equipment under warranty including labor and parts, for the entire duration of the SLA Support.
 - Software/Firmware Updates:** Provision of free future software and firmware releases, including updates and upgrades recommended by the OEM during the SLA support period.
- 12.7 **Quarterly Acceptance Certificate:** The Project Director/Ultimate Consignee NTC shall issue a Quarterly Acceptance Certificate upon satisfactory performance of the SLA support services during the preceding quarter. The certificate will verify compliance with all SLA support terms and conditions.
- 12.8 **SLA Support Performance Metrics**
- Response Time:** The contractor shall respond to all support requests within four (4) hours.
 - Resolution Time:** All critical issues shall be resolved within eight (8) hours or as agreed upon.
 - Uptime Guarantee:** The contractor shall ensure a system uptime of 99.9% on a monthly basis.
- 12.9 **Penalties for SLA Support Non-Compliance:** Failure to meet SLA Support obligations, including response times, resolution times, or uptime guarantees, will result in penalties, a report for each month will be submitted with invoice of the SLA support, Penalties will be calculated as below:
- In the event that a ticket is not resolved within the agreed timelines, a penalty shall be applied to the Monthly SLA support cost as follows:
 - Minor Issues:** 2% of the Monthly SLA support cost per breach.
 - Major Issues:** 4% of the Monthly SLA support cost per breach.
 - Critical Issues:** 6% of the Monthly SLA support cost per breach.
 - The severity of the issue (Minor, Major, Critical) shall be determined by Project Director/Ultimate Consignee NTC. Penalties will be applied on a per-ticket basis and will be subject to a cumulative cap of [10] % of the Monthly SLA cost. Any disputes regarding the classification of issues shall be resolved in accordance with the dispute resolution mechanism defined in this agreement.

13 TRAININGS

- 13.1 The contractor shall arrange free of cost local training of the installed equipment to NTC /Punjab Govt officials at site for a period of 5 x working days. The training must be comprehensive and must be on equipment which shall be of such level that the NTC personal trained should be able to install, configure, commission manage, maintain and operate all the components of the system/network ordered.
- 13.2 Onsite job training shall also be arranged by bidder on equipment during commissioning of equipment at NTC sites.
- 13.3 The objective of the training program is to enable the personnel require the expertise concerning system installation, operation maintenance, troubleshooting, repair and detail concept of all equipment.
- 13.4 Complete proposal of the training courses and their duration covering Operation, Maintenance, and Diagnostic Testing, Measurements, Repairs and Management Information Reporting procedures shall be submitted.
- 13.5 All the instructors shall possess high technical ability to impart training. They shall have as high command on English language.
- 13.6 The efficiency of the training program conducted by the contractor/OEM will be under close scrutiny and it will have to be repeated by contractor without extra cost to NTC if the training given is found to be ineffective, deficient and un-satisfactory. However, NTC has to communicate its dissatisfaction (if any) during the training period for improvement and not afterwards.
- 13.7 The training material (Hard & Soft Copies), technically skilled tutor, training venue, refreshment, luncheon etc. will be the responsibility of the contractor at its own expenses.

14 TERMS OF PAYMENT

- 14.1 **CAPEX**
 - a. **60% of equipment value payment** shall be made by Project Director NTC upon successful delivery of equipment at destination which shall be proved by duly verified delivery challans by NTC's Project Director.
 - b. **35% payment** shall be made by Project Director NTC upon issuance of Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC) by Project Director.
 - c. **05% payment** shall be made by Project Director NTC be made upon issuance of Nil Discrepancy Certificate (NDC) by Project Director.
- 14.2 **Media connectivity /Bandwidth charges**
 - a. **Quarterly payment** will be made by shall be made by Project Director NTC after successful provision of SLA Support services for respective period which shall be proved by acceptance certificate issued by Project Director NTC.
- 14.3 **SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT/SLA**
 - b. **Quarterly payment** shall be made by Project Director NTC after successful provision of SLA Support services for respective period which shall be proved by acceptance certificate issued by Project Director NTC.

14.4 **Human Resource**

- c. **Monthly payment** shall be made by Project Director NTC after successful provision of HR services for respective month which shall be proved by Service acceptance certificate issued by Project Director NTC.
- 14.5 All payments shall be made by Project Director NTC.
- 14.6 The Contractor shall submit the commercial invoice & sales tax invoice in triplicate to Project Director NTC.
- 14.7 The Contractor will clearly mention NTN & GST number of both supplier & purchaser on the invoice (NTC NTN # 1218153-6, NTC GST # 07-01-9802-013-64).
- 14.8 All the payments shall be made through cross cheque in the Pak Rupees.
- 14.9 Taxes shall be deducted as per government rules at the time of payment.

15 **CONTRACTOR'S NEGLIGENCE**

- 15.1 The contractor will indemnify NTC against actual losses, subject to limitation of liability not exceeding 10% of the contract value as detailed hereinafter for loss and / or damage to property and / or persons of NTC arising from negligence errors or omissions or default and / or infidelity during period of this contract and arising out of and in the course of the performance by the contractor of its obligations under this contract. However, the said clause will be governed by prevailing laws of Islamic Republic of Pakistan.
- 15.2 The laws of Islamic Republic of Pakistan shall prevail in case of any inconsistency / anomaly.

16 **FINAL ACCEPTANCE CERTIFICATE**

- 16.1 The contractor must notify the NTC concerned officer at-least 15 days before the expiry of warranty period for the issuance of final acceptance certificate. Upon such notification from contractor, the Project Director will issue Final Acceptance Certificate, in favor of contractor subject to satisfactory completion of warranty period as per requirement of contract and submission of performance security against the first year of SLA. Alternatively, the NTC concerned officer will notify the contractor for the discrepancies that still remain un-resolved and contractor will rectify the discrepancies.
- 16.2 The FAC shall not absolve the contractor of its obligations under Service Level Agreement.

17 **DEFAULT BY CONTRACTOR**

- 17.1 If the contractor fails to provide the services, refuses or fails to comply with a valid instruction of the NTC, the NTC may give notice and stating the default.
- 17.2 If the contractor has not taken all practicable steps to remedy the default within 14 days after receipt of NTC notice, the NTC may by a second notice cancel the contract and confiscate the performance security.

18 **ARBITRATION AND APPLICABLE LAW**

- 18.1 This Agreement shall be governed under Pakistani law and the Courts at Islamabad shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any matter that may be referred to a Court under this Agreement.
- 18.2 In the event that any dispute arises between the Parties under this Agreement, one Party shall issue notice to the other Party to mutually negotiate a resolution to the

dispute. If the negotiations fail to resolve the dispute within seven (7) days of receipt of the notice, the dispute shall be referred to the Managing Director, National Telecommunication Corporation ("MD") or his nominee who shall provide a personal hearing to Contractor and render a decision thereon within a period of thirty (30) days. In the personal hearing conducted pursuant to this clause, the Contractor shall not be represented by a legal practitioner within the meaning of the Legal Practitioners and Bar Councils Act, 1973.

- 18.3 If the Contractor is aggrieved of the decision of the MD or his nominee rendered under clause (18.2) hereof, the Contractor may refer the dispute to arbitration within thirty (30) days of the date of the decision of the MD or his nominee under the Arbitration Act, 1940 or any law that the Arbitration Act, 1940 is repealed, amended, or modified by at the time of referral of the dispute to arbitration. The arbitration shall be conducted before a Sole Arbitrator to be appointed by the consent of the Parties. The seat and venue of arbitration shall be at the National Telecommunication Corporation Headquarters, Sector G-5/2, Islamabad. The arbitration and the award thereof shall be conducted in the English language.
- 18.4 The costs and fees of the Sole Arbitrator shall be shared by the Parties equally. A Party shall bear the costs and fees of its legal practitioners and other personnel that a Party engages for the arbitration unless otherwise awarded by the Sole Arbitrator.

19 FORCE MAJEURE

- 19.1 The Contractor shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, liquidated damages or termination for default, if and to the extent that, its delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.
- 19.2 If either party is temporarily rendered unable, wholly or in part by Force Majeure to perform its duties or accept performance by the other party under the Contract it is agreed that on such party, giving notice with full particulars in writing of such Force majeure to the other party within 14 (fourteen) days after the occurrence of the cause relied on, then the duties, of such party as far as they are affected by such Force Majeure shall be suspended during the continuance of any inability so caused but for no longer period and such cause shall as far as possible be removed with all reasonable speed. Neither party shall be responsible for delay caused by Force Majeure.
- 19.3 The terms "Force Majeure" as used herein shall mean Acts of God, strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbance, act of public enemy, war, blockages, insurrections, riots, epidemics, landslides, earthquakes, fires, storms, lightning, flood, washouts, civil disturbances, explosion, Governmental Export/Import Restrictions (to be supported by a letter from the relevant Authority and verified by the Diplomatic Mission in Pakistan), Government actions/restrictions due to economic and financial hardships, change of priorities and any other cause similar to the kind herein enumerated or of equivalent effect, not within the control of either party and which by the exercise of due care and diligence either party is unable to overcome.
- 19.4 The term of this Contract shall be extended for such period of time as may be necessary to complete the work which might have been accomplished but for such suspension. If either party is permanently prevented wholly or in part by Force Majeure for period exceeding 12 (twelve) months from performing or accepting performance, the party concerned shall have the right to terminate this contract

immediately giving notice with full particulars for such Force Majeure in writing to the other party, and in such event, the other party shall be entitled to compensation for an amount to be fixed by negotiations and mutual agreement

- 19.5 If a Force Majeure situation arises, the Contractor shall promptly notify NTC in writing of such conditions and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by NTC in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practicable, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.

20 TERMINATION FOR INSOLVENCY

The NTC may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the contractor, without any compensation to contractor. If the contractor becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to action to the NTC.

21 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

The NTC may send a written notice to the contractor and terminate the contract in whole or in part any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that the termination is for the NTC's convenience, the extent to which performance or work under the contract is terminated and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

22 PROJECT DIRECTOR / ENGINEER IN CHARGE

Project Director: GM (Central) NTC Lahore
Project Managers: i) Director NTC Lahore
ii) Director NTC Multan
iii) Director NTC Rawalpindi
iv) Director (Data Networks) NTC HQs

23 ROLE OF PROJECT DIRECTOR AND PROJECT MANAGERS

Project Director (PD) would execute the work(s) as per contract. Director NTC Lahore, Director NTC Multan and Director NTC Rawalpindi being Project Managers (PMs) would execute the work(s) as per contract. The duties of PMs are to watch and supervise the works and to test and examine any material to be used or workmanship employed in connection with the works. He shall have no authority to relieve the Contractor of any of his duties or obligations under the contract except as expressly provided hereunder or elsewhere in the contract or order any work involving delay or any extra payment by the NTC and not to make any variation in the works.

The PD may from time to time delegate to his Representative in writing any of the powers and authorities vested in him and shall furnish to the Contractor a copy of all such written delegation of powers and authorities. Any written instructions or approval given by his Representative to the Contractor within the terms of such delegation (but not otherwise) shall bind the Contractor and the NTC as though it had been given by the PD, provided always as follows: -

- (a) Failure of the Representative of the Director NTC to disapprove any work or materials shall not prejudice the power of the Director NTC thereafter to

disapprove such work or material and to order the pulling down, removal or breaking up thereof.

(b) If the contractor shall be dissatisfied by reason of any decision of the Representative, he shall be entitled to refer the matter to the Director NTC in writing who shall thereupon confirm, reverse or vary such decision.

23.1 Approval, reviews and inspection of the Director NTC/his Representative /NTC of any part of the work does not relieve the contractor from his sole responsibility of execution of the remaining works or testing and commissioning of the works as per contract. However, the contractor shall be compensated if any loss/damage occurred due to the decision of Director NTC Lahore.

23.2 The Contractor shall execute, complete and maintain the works strictly in accordance with the Contract to the satisfaction of the (PMs) and shall comply with and adhere strictly to the instructions and directions of the PD /or, on any matter (whether mentioned in the Contract or not) touching or concerning the works. The Contractor shall take instructions and directions only from the (PMs) NTC.

24 DEBARMENT / BLACKLISTING OF FIRM

24.1 As per clause-19 of the PPRA rules 2004, NTC reserves the right of debarment 'or' blacklisting of a firm, association, corporation, joint venture, company, partnership or any other legal entity subject to any of the following acts: -

- a. Consistent failure to provide satisfactory performance.
- b. Contractor becomes insolvent.
- c. Existence of judicial decision against a contractor in respect of a corrupt or collusive practice.
- d. Submission of false and spurious documents, making false statements and allegations to gain undue advantage.
- e. Commission of fraud.
- f. Contractor abandons the contract and allied Service Level Agreement.
- g. Contractor without reasonable excuse fails to commence the work 'or' suspends the progress of work for 14 days.
- h. Contractor is not executing the work in accordance with the contract or is persistently or flagrantly neglecting to carry out their obligations under the contract.
- i. Commission of embezzlement, criminal breach of trust, theft, cheating, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, receiving stolen property, false use of trademark, securing fraudulent registration with sales tax authorities, Pakistan Engineering council etc, giving false evidence, furnishing of false information of serious nature.

24.2 Managing Director NTC will constitute a committee comprising of three NTC officers and they will investigate the matter in connection with allegation of corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practices or illegally harassment or threat. Moreover, the committee shall also accord adequate opportunity of being heard to the contractor who is to be debarred / blacklisted. The said committee will forward its clear recommendations for the approval of Managing Director NTC.

24.3 The debarment shall be for a reasonable specified period of time, commensurate with the seriousness of the cause. However, the debarment period shall not exceed from three years. Moreover, NTC also reserves the right of permanent blacklisting of a contractor subject to severity of the corrupt or fraudulent practices.

25 REPEAT ORDER

NTC may place Repeat Order on the contractor as per PPRA Rules 2004.

26 INTEGRITY

- 26.1 The Contractor hereby declares that it has not obtained or induced the procurement of this Contract or a right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit under this Contract from Government of Pakistan or any administrative subdivision or agency thereof or any other owned or controlled by it (GoP) through any corrupt business practice.
- 26.2 Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Contractor represents and warrants that it has fully declared the brokerage, commission, fees etc, paid or payable to anyone and not given or agreed to give and shall not give or agree to give to anyone within or outside Pakistan either directly or indirectly through any natural or juridical person, any commission, gratification, bribe, finder's fee or kickback, whether described as consultation fee or otherwise, with the object of obtaining or including the procurement of this Contract or a right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit under this Contract in whatsoever form from GoP, except that which has been expressly declared pursuant hereto.
- 26.3 The Contractor accepts full responsibility and strict liability for making any false declaration, not making full disclosure, misrepresenting facts or taking any action likely to defeat the purpose of this Clause.

27 PROJECT MANAGEMENT TEAM

- a. **Dedicated POC:** The contractor shall assign dedicated personnel who will serve as the primary Point of Contact (POC) with NTC. The POC will be responsible for coordinating all project activities to ensure smooth execution and successful completion of the Project.
- b. **Project Management Methodology and Reporting:** The contractor's POC shall employ standard and recognized project management methodologies, practices, and tools to plan, monitor, and control all project phases. Regular progress reporting shall be provided to NTC to ensure timely, transparent, and effective communication throughout the Project lifecycle.
- c. **Project Documentation and Handover:** The contractor shall prepare comprehensive documentation covering all project components, including inventories of hardware and software with complete product details, part numbers, and serial numbers. All documentation will be formally handed over to NTC upon Project completion and issuance of the Provisional Acceptance Certificate (PAC)

28 DECLARATION OF BENEFICIAL OWNERS' INFORMATION

The "Declaration of Beneficial Owners' Information of Public Procurement Contract Awarded Regulations, 2022" require that the contractor shall be bound to provide beneficial ownership information as per prescribed proforma.

ANNEXURE-C: SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

This Annexure sets out the service levels against which the performance of contractor shall be measured, the manner of measurement, the remedies available to NTC, and the circumstances in which service levels do not apply.

1. Service Tiers and Committed Availability

The Committed Availability applicable to a Site is determined by its Service Tier. The commitments below have been set by reference to the transmission bearer, the presence or absence of media diversity, the power arrangement and the accessibility of the Sites within each Tier.

2. Measurement of Availability

2.1 Availability shall be computed for each Site for each calendar month as follows:

$$\text{Availability (\%)} = [(\text{TMP} - \text{CUD}) \div \text{TMP}] \times 100$$

where TMP is the Total Measurement Period and CUD is the aggregate Chargeable Unavailable Duration in that Site's Measurement Period.

2.2 The Measurement Period is: (a) for Tier-I, Tier-II, Tier-III and Core, every minute in the calendar month; and (b) for Tier-IV, the aggregate of the Scheduled Service Hours rostered for that Site in the calendar month under Annexure-C.

2.3 A Site is Unavailable when it is incapable of passing traffic to the NTC core network, or when the Services at that Site are so degraded as to be unusable for their intended purpose. A Tier-I Site is Unavailable only where both bearers are simultaneously incapable of passing traffic; failure of a single bearer at a Tier-I Site with the service maintained on the surviving bearer is a Severity-2 Fault and does not count as Unavailability.

2.4 Unavailability commences at the earlier of (a) detection by the NMS and (b) the time at which the Fault is logged by NTC with the Contractor's helpdesk (NOC), and ends

when service is restored and such restoration is confirmed by the NMS or accepted by the reporting person.

2.5 Any single interruption of less than five (05) consecutive minutes shall be disregarded. Availability shall be expressed to two decimal places, with no rounding in favor of either Party beyond the second decimal place.

2.6 The NMS records shall be the primary evidence of Availability. the Contractor shall retain the underlying records for the Contract period and for two (02) years thereafter, and shall make them available to NTC on request.

3. Critical Service Window

3.1 The Critical Service Window in respect of a Site is the notified market day or days and trading hours of that Site as notified by NTC to the Contractor, being the period during which financial transactions are conducted.

3.2 The Contractor shall not undertake Scheduled Maintenance at a Site during a Critical Service Window.

3.3 Where more than fifty per cent (50%) of the Chargeable Unavailable Duration at a Site in a calendar month occurred within a Critical Service Window, the Service Credit otherwise payable in respect of that Site for that month shall be increased by fifty per cent (50%), subject always to the Per-Site cap in Clause 6.3.

5. Response and Restoration Targets

Time runs from the logging of the Fault or its detection by the NMS, whichever is earlier, and runs continuously including outside Business Days and Business Hours.

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5.1 Where a Mobile Unit fails, breaks down or is otherwise unable to provide the Services at a rostered Site, the Contractor shall deploy a reserve Mobile Unit from its own reserve fleet, or shall otherwise restore the Services, within six (06) hours of the failure. Where service is not restored before the close of the Scheduled Service Hours for that Site on that day, the whole of those Scheduled Service Hours shall be treated as Chargeable Unavailable Duration under Clause 2, the day shall be recorded as a Missed Deployment in the Monthly Service Level Report to be submitted by the Contractor to NTC, and the Service Credit at Clause 6.1 of this Annexure shall apply accordingly.

5.2 Where restoration requires the replacement of a failed component, the Contractor shall effect replacement from the critical spares pool. Faulty equipment shall be replaced rather than repaired in situ wherever replacement is the faster route to restoration.

5.3 Where a Fault is caused by a cut to hired transmission media or to third-party optical fibre, the Contractor shall pursue restoration with the media provider and shall, where technically feasible, divert the affected traffic to an alternative bearer pending permanent restoration.

6. Service Credits

6.1 Where the Availability achieved at a Site in a calendar month is less than the Committed Availability for that Site, NTC shall be entitled to a Service Credit calculated as a percentage of the Monthly Recurring Charge for that Site for that month, as follows ("CA" denotes Committed Availability and "pp" denotes percentage points):

6.2 Core failure. Where the Core fails to achieve 99.90% Availability in a calendar month, NTC shall be entitled to a Service Credit equal to five per cent (5%) of the aggregate Monthly Recurring Charges for all Sites for that month for each full 0.10 percentage point of shortfall, subject to a maximum of twenty per cent (20%) of such aggregate Charges.

6.3 Caps. The Service Credit in respect of any single Site in any month shall not exceed one hundred per cent (100%) of that Site's Monthly Recurring Charge. The aggregate of all Service Credits in any month shall not exceed twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total invoice value for that month. The aggregate of all Service Credits in any contract year shall not exceed ten per cent (10%) of the total Charges payable for that contract year.

6.4 Service Credits shall be computed by the Contractor and shown as a deduction on its monthly invoice for the following month, and shall be verifiable against the Site-wise Availability statement furnished by the Contractor with that invoice. Where the Contractor fails to apply a Service Credit that is properly due, NTC may deduct it from the next invoice, or from any other payment due to the Contractor, upon written notice.

6.5 Service Credits are the sole financial remedy for failure to achieve a service level, save where such failure constitutes a material breach entitling NTC to terminate under Clause 16 (Default by Contractor) of the Contract Conditions.

7. Chronic Failure

7.1 Where a Site fails to achieve its Committed Availability in three (03) consecutive calendar months, the Contractor shall within fifteen (15) days furnish a written root-cause analysis and a remedial action plan, and shall implement the same at its own cost.

7.2 Where such failure continues for six (06) consecutive calendar months, NTC may, without prejudice to accrued Service Credits, either (a) terminate the Contract in respect of that Site alone by written notice, without any liability to the Contractor, or (b) require the Contractor to upgrade the bearer at that Site to a higher Service Tier at the Contractor's cost, with no increase in the Monthly Recurring Charge.

7.3 Where more than twenty-five per cent (25%) of the Sites fail to achieve their Committed Availability in three (03) consecutive calendar months, the same shall constitute a default by the Contractor and the provisions of Clause 16 (Default by Contractor) of the Contract Conditions shall apply.

8. Exclusions

8.1 The following periods shall be excluded from the Total Measurement Period, and shall not give rise to any Service Credit:

- (a) Any period of Force Majeure under Clause 18 (Force Majeure) of the Contract Conditions, including a notified outbreak of animal disease resulting in closure of the Site;
- (b) Scheduled Maintenance carried out in accordance with Clause 8.2 of this Annexure;
- (c) Any period during which access to a Site is denied, restricted or rendered unsafe, for reasons not attributable to the Contractor;

- (d) any outage caused by the act, omission, negligence or default of NTC or of its officers, employees, contractors (other than the Contractor and its sub-contractors), licensees or invitees, including damage to Project Infrastructure or cabling caused by their works;
- (e) any outage arising from failure of a grid electricity supply which NTC has undertaken to arrange under the Contract, save to the extent the designed power backup autonomy specified in this RFT ought to have carried the load;
- (f) Any fault in end-user equipment, point-of-sale terminals, applications, servers, cabling or software not supplied or maintained by the Contractor, or in any network element managed by NTC;
- (g) Theft of, or malicious damage to, Project Infrastructure, save where attributable to a failure by the Contractor to deploy the security measures specified in this RFT;
- (h) Any suspension of the Services directed in writing by NTC, otherwise than by reason of the default of the Contractor;
- (i) Any period during which the Contractor is unable to monitor a Site because NTC has disabled, blocked or interfered with the management path;
- (j) Any interruption of less than five (05) consecutive minutes; and
- (k) in the case of a submarine cable cut affecting international transit capacity, the period reasonably required for restoration by the relevant cable consortium, provided that the Contractor has diverted the affected capacity to an alternative cable system so far as technically and commercially practicable;
- (l) any period during which the restoration of the Services is delayed pending the approval, or the release of funds, by NTC in respect of a Replacement Notice served by the Contractor
under the Contract, or pending the funding by NTC of a repair to, or of fuel for, a Mobile Unit where such funding is NTC's responsibility under the Contract;
- (m) any period during which a post in the establishment specified in this RFT is vacant, or during which any of the Deployed Personnel is absent, withdrawn, on strike or unpaid, otherwise than by reason of the default of the Contractor;
- (n) any period of delay in restoration attributable to the absence of insurance cover in consequence of an election made by NTC under the Contract; and
- (o) any period during which an item of Project Infrastructure declared end-of-support by its manufacturer has not been refreshed by reason of NTC not having funded the refresh recommended in writing by the Contractor.

8.2 Scheduled Maintenance. The Contractor may carry out Scheduled Maintenance provided that: (a) not less than seventy-two (72) hours' prior written notice is given to NTC; (b) the works are carried out outside any Critical Service Window and, so

far as practicable, between 00:00 and 05:00 hours; (c) the aggregate duration does not exceed eight (08) hours per Site per calendar month; and (d) emergency maintenance necessary to preserve the integrity or security of the network may be carried out on shorter notice, with notice given as soon as practicable, and shall be treated as Scheduled Maintenance provided it does not exceed four (04) hours per Site per calendar month.

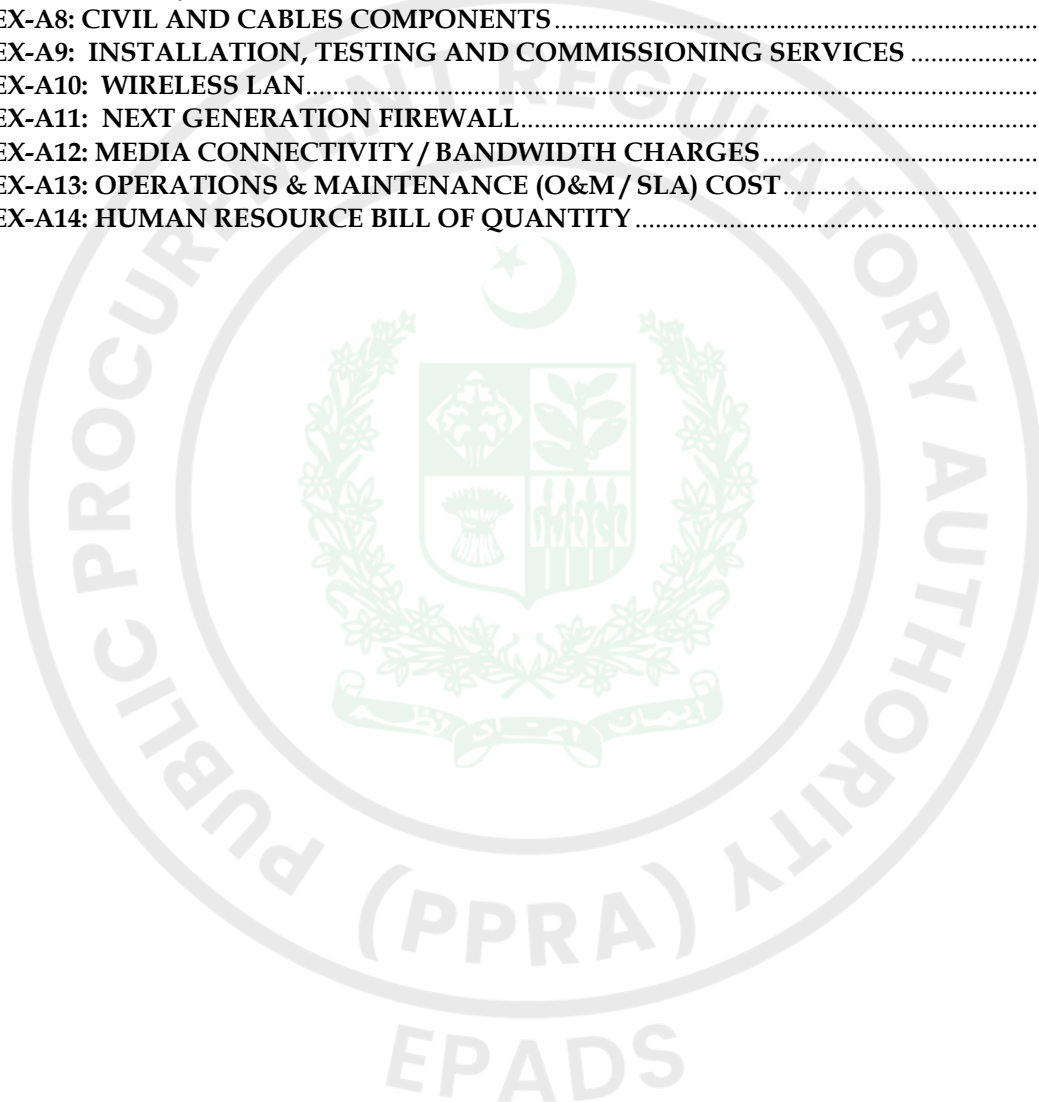

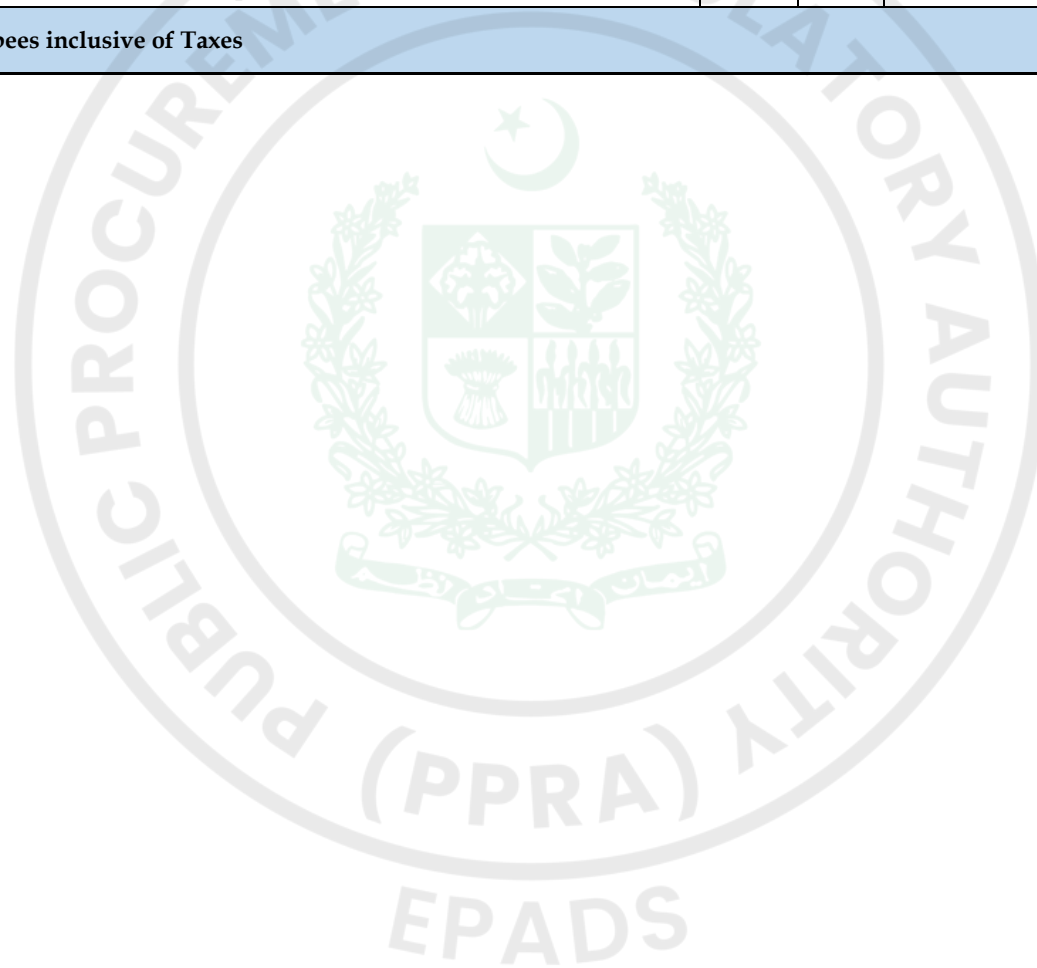
